Minutes

April 24, 2026

9:30 a.m.

Chair John McAlpine convened the meeting at 9:30 a.m. at the Arkansas Department of Agriculture, 1 Natural Resources Drive, Little Rock, AR.

Chair McAlpine called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

The Commission considered the Arkansas Forestry Commission meeting minutes of February 20, 2026.

1. Call to order

Chair McAlpine welcomed all in attendance and called roll.

2. Consider meeting minutes of February 20, 2026

Moved by Dunklin, seconded by Prutzman to approve the minutes as presented.

Motion carried.

3. Financial report

Kyle Cunningham, State Forester, presented the financial report, covering operating funds, cash funds, Baucum Nursery, timber severance tax, and fire protection/acreage tax fiscal year receipts. **Attachment 1.**

Cunningham introduced Kara Maack, the new Registered Forester Coordinator.

4. Registered Forester Committee (RFC) report

David Cawein, RFC Chairman reported on the meeting held April 20, 2026.

The committee recommends approval of five Registered Foresters for licensure. Brandon Bennett, Sammy Kirksey, Daniel Moore, Samantah Stephens, and Clayton Whitaker.

Moved by Cawein, seconded by Gammill to approve the licensures as presented.

Motion carried. George Dunklin abstained.

The committee recommends approving one hour of Continuing Forestry Education (CFE) for the March 17, 2026, training, title "2026 Northeast Forest Products Industry Outlook Webinar".

Moved by Cawein, seconded by Prutzman to approve the request for one CFE hour as presented.

Motion carried.

The committee recommends approval of the Arkansas Registered Forester Seal.

Moved by Cawein, seconded by Bragg to approve the Arkansas Registered Forester Seal as presented, and that the new seal be required to be used by Arkansas Registered Foresters by the end of 2027.

Motion carried.

Two applicants were approved to take the Registered Forester exam, Drew Parish and Andrew Wall. The next exam will be May 13, 2026, in Little Rock.

Discussion on Association of Southeastern Boards of Registration for Forester's Annual Meeting. Arkansas will host the meeting on September 29-30, 2026, at the Embassy Suites in Little Rock.

5. Law enforcement report

Billy Black, Chief of Law Enforcement, provided a timber theft update. Year to date, there have been 44 timber cases and 23 fire cases.

6. Quarterly reports

Emergency Services

Robert Murphy, Emergency Services Director

- Wildfire totals for spring fire season were provided. 725 wildfires for 22,088 acres. The total was 121 more fires that totaled 1,570 more acres compared to Spring 2025 fire season.
- Technology improvements implemented at Dispatch were presented.
- Forestry Division ordered four bulldozers, eight transport trucks, and thirteen pickup trucks.
- The Rural Fire Program financed four interest-free loans for volunteer fire departments through the revolving fund totaling \$46,299.82. Loans will be used for equipment and equipment repairs.

Forest Management

Jim Jolley and Chandler Barton, Division Foresters

- Spring genetic improvement operations take place at the Bluff City Orchard.
- Families selected for controlled pollination of flowers on loblolly pine
- Expansion work continues at Baucum Nursery.
- Abatement request for Oklahoma seedling invoice approved by Commission.
- Free Tree Friday events concluded. There will be one final event located at the Department of Agriculture. Thirty events were conducted in 2026. Over 3,000 attendees and over 11,000 seedlings were provided.
- Urban Foresters were recognized by Nashville, TN mayor and TN State Forester for storm damage assistance following ice storm occurrence in 2026.
- Best Management Practices (BMP) for Water Quality analysis complete. BMP operations fulfill the Departments forestry role in control of nonpoint source pollution from forestry activities. Surveys showed a 92 percent statewide implementation rate.

Districts and State Forests

Darren Spinks, Deputy State Forester

- New District 2 office construction project in Howard County is currently being reviewed at the Division of Building Authority.
- Poison Springs State Forest (PSSF) annual fixed plot inventory complete.
- Timber sales for State Forests all contracted. Total sales were 750 acres, 23,731 tons of pine sawtimber estimated. PSSF averaged \$30.00 per ton, Hot Springs State Forest sale brought \$24.00 per ton.

7. State Forester's report

Kyle Cunningham, State Forester/Director of Forestry Division

- Personnel – staffing for all seven districts is currently at 70 percent or higher. The Division is working on filling key positions in aviation, state forests, and Baucum Nursery.
- Marketing – social media has developed into a significant component of wildland fire mitigation. This spring the Department reached 660,000 viewers. The reach provides a tremendous pathway to share forestry and wildfire response information to the general public audience.
- Fiscal – The Forestry Division is operating within budget for FY26. The Division currently has a cash balance of \$4,450,303 as of March 31, 2026. Baucum Nursery is currently at a break-even standpoint and will be in the black once all receivables are collected for FY26.

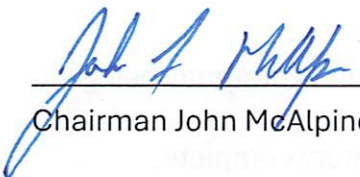

FIRE PROTECTION/ACREAGE TAX

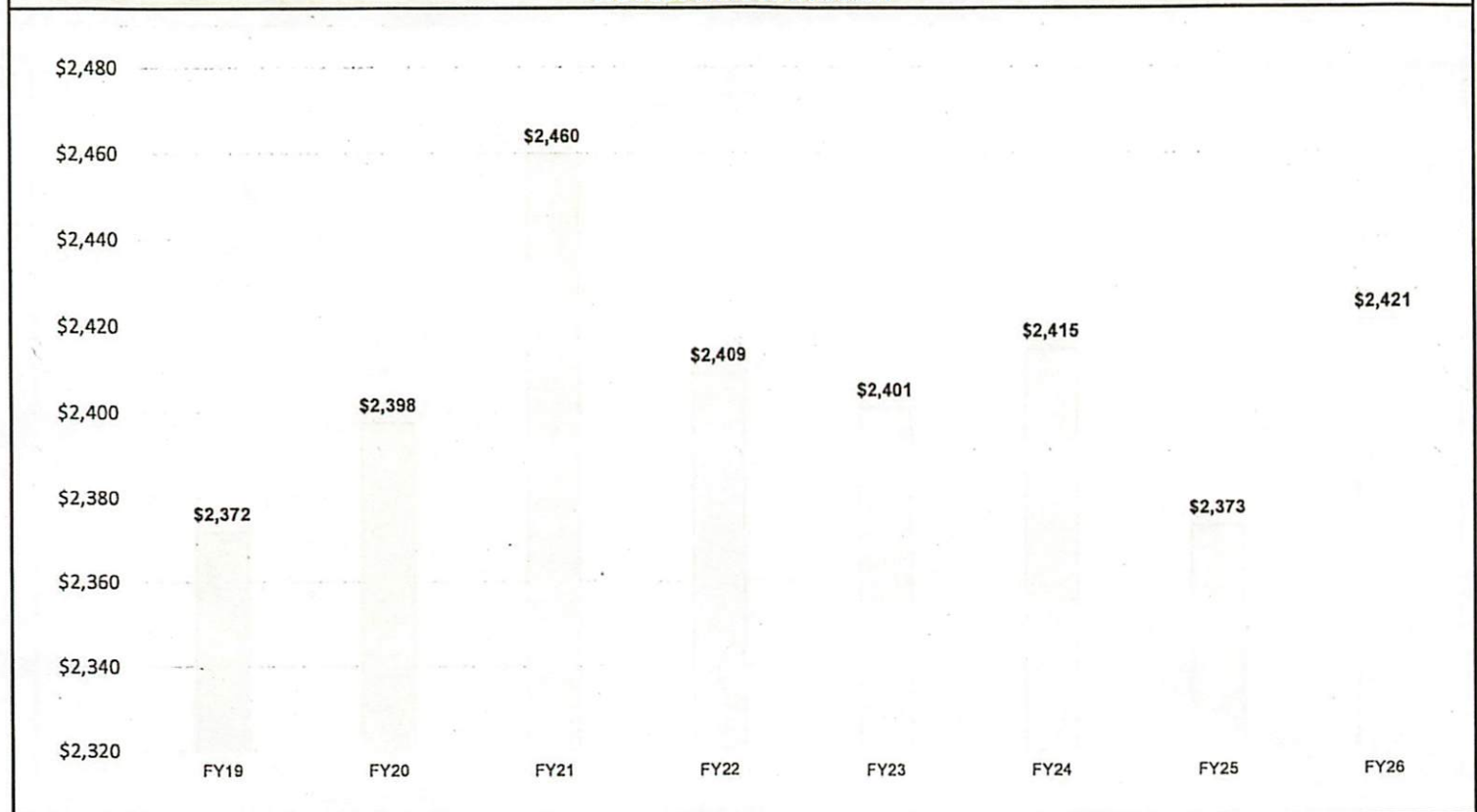

Arkansas Registered Forester Seal

Purpose

The purpose of this memorandum is to request approval to submit to the Arkansas Forestry Commission an updated Arkansas Registered Forester's seal.

Background

The registered forester's seal of the Arkansas Department of Agriculture represents the authority, professionalism, and public trust associated with the practice of forestry in the State of Arkansas. The seal is used by Registered Foresters to authenticate professional documents, such as forest management plans, reports, and maps, confirming that the work has been prepared or reviewed by an individual who is licensed under Arkansas law to practice forestry.

Under Arkansas Code § 17-31-306, the law provides that:

Each registered forester may obtain a professional seal of a design authorized by the Arkansas Forestry Commission.

The seal must contain:

1. The forester's name
2. Their serial (license) number
3. The legend "Registered Forester, Arkansas."

The statute further requires that:

All registered foresters engaged in the practice of forestry must sign and seal any plans, specifications, maps, reports, or documents they prepare or supervise.

The statute also establishes legal consequences for misuse of the seal. Using a seal after a forester's license has expired or been revoked constitutes a misdemeanor offense. This provision ensures that only currently licensed professionals can certify forestry work.

The Forestry Division respectfully requests authorization to seek final approval of the proposed updated registered forester's seal by the Arkansas Forestry Commission.
