September 23, 2025

9:30 a.m.

Chairman Reynold Meyer called the quarterly board meeting to order.

Corey Seats, Director, Plant Industries Division, and other Arkansas Department of Agriculture (Department) staff were in attendance.

1. **Opening comments and introductions**

Chairman Meyer welcomed all who were in attendance and asked each member to introduce themselves and state who they represent.

2. **Consider the minutes of the June 5, 2025 meeting**

Moved by Throne, seconded by Alford to approve the minutes as presented.

Motion carried.

3. **Pest Control Section**

Committee Chair Dr. Korth informed the members that a recent amendment to the pest control law, effective August 5, 2025, eliminates the requirement for the board to approve pest control examination results following this meeting.

Committee Chair Dr. Korth presented the pest control examination results from May through August 5, 2025, for approval. **Attachment 1**

Moved by Korth, seconded by Alford to approve the pest control exam results as presented.

Motion carried.

4. Pesticide Section

Dr. Jason Norsworthy, Distinguished Professor and Elms Farming Chair of Weed Science, University of Arkansas, Division of Agriculture, presented an overview of Keenali in Arkansas rice and an update on Section 18 requests. **Attachment 2**

Susie Nichols, Agri Section Manager, Pesticide Section, reported that several enforcement actions were presented to the board at the previous meeting with recommendations to settle by issuing warnings. In response, the board directed staff to seek an opinion from the Attorney General regarding the possibility of settling these enforcement actions outside the standard procedures.

Corey Seats, Director of the Plant Industries Division, reported that, at the board's request, the Department contacted the Attorney General's office to review the proposed enforcement actions. Action on these matters had been tabled during the June 5, 2025 meeting pending receipt of the Attorney General's opinion. In response, the Attorney General's office conducted a review of the enforcement actions, applicable Arkansas statutes, and the board's governing rules. As part of this process, Department staff also participated in an in-person meeting with representatives from the Attorney General's office. Upon conclusion of the review, the Attorney General's office determined that the recommended enforcement actions do not violate Arkansas law or the rules of the Arkansas State Plant Board.

In response to an inquiry from Dunklin regarding whether the Attorney General's opinion was provided in writing, Seats explained that it was conveyed to him, formal written opinions from the Attorney General's office are typically issued prior to any action being taken. However, if the board chooses to proceed with the recommended enforcement actions, doing so would be considered acceptable.

Nichols presented proposed pesticide enforcement actions, shown as **Attachment 3**. Staff's proposal is to settle all enforcement actions listed for a warning.

Following discussion, moved by Alford, seconded by Thorne to vote on all enforcement actions, numbered 1 – 213, as a group.

Motion carried. Dunklin opposed and Senter recused.

Following discussion, moved by Reed, seconded by Stuckey to approve items 1 – 213 as warnings as recommended by staff.

Motion carried by a roll call vote with 7 yes votes and 4 no votes. Frost and Senter recused.

Nichols stated the Department is planning a satellite pesticide disposal event this fall in Hot Spring County.

5. Bureau of Standards

Committee Chair Ralston summarized the minutes of the August 21, 2025, Bureau of Standards Committee meeting. **Attachment 4**

Staff presented 144 civil penalties to the committee for review and recommendation to the State Plant Board.

Motion carried.

A request was received to waive the civil penalty of \$350 in Case BS 26-0049, and \$800 in Case BS 26-0087, from Atwoods in Lonoke, AR.

The committee's recommendation is to deny the requests.

Moved by Ralston, seconded by Dunklin to approve the committee's recommendation as presented.

Motion carried.

A request was received to waive the civil penalty of \$200 in Case BS 26-0016 and \$200 in Case BS 26-0019, from Watson Oil Co. in Corning, AR, and \$200 in Case BS 26-0100 from Fast Track in Stamps, AR.

The committee's recommendation is to deny the requests.

Moved by Ralston, seconded by Senter to approve the committee's recommendation as presented.

Motion carried. Baltz rescued.

Moved by Ralston, seconded by Stuckey to approve the minutes as presented.

Motion carried.

Moved by Ralston, seconded by Dunklin to approve the minutes of the August 21, 2025 meeting.

Motion carried.

6. **Boll Weevil Eradication Program**

Committee Chair Stuckey summarized the Boll Weevil Subcommittee meeting held July 10, 2025. **Attachment 5**

The Boll Weevil Subcommittee approved meeting minutes of February 26 and May 6, 2025. The subcommittee reviewed and approved the audit, as presented by Hogan Taylor LLP, the financial report, as presented by Landmark PLC, and the remote attendance policy set forth by the State Plant Board.

Regina Coleman, Executive Director of the Arkansas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation, presented updates on cash flow projections, a summary of the Technical Advisory Committee, and the cotton pest study. A summary of gins ginning without cotton certifications was presented. All gins have paid fees in full and are now in compliance.

Moved by Wallace, seconded by Senter to approve the minutes of the February 26 and May 6, 2025 meetings and the report as presented.

Motion carried.

7. Plant Industries Division update

Corey Seats, Director, Arkansas State Plant Board, gave an update on division activities. Currently, the division has 118 full-time employees, and 85 seasonal peanut program employees.

Seats reported that there are currently seven rules in various stages of the rule promulgation process. Of these, three proposed rules have been submitted to the Governor's office for review. The remaining four rules, covering catfish, feed, fertilizer, and seed, are undergoing in-house review and amendments.

8. Election of officers

Moved by Dunklin, seconded by Wallace to approve the same slate of officers for the upcoming year. Reynold Meyers as Chair, Bruce Alford as Vice Chair, and Kyle Baltz as Secretary.

Moved by Stuckey that nominations cease and elect by acclamation.



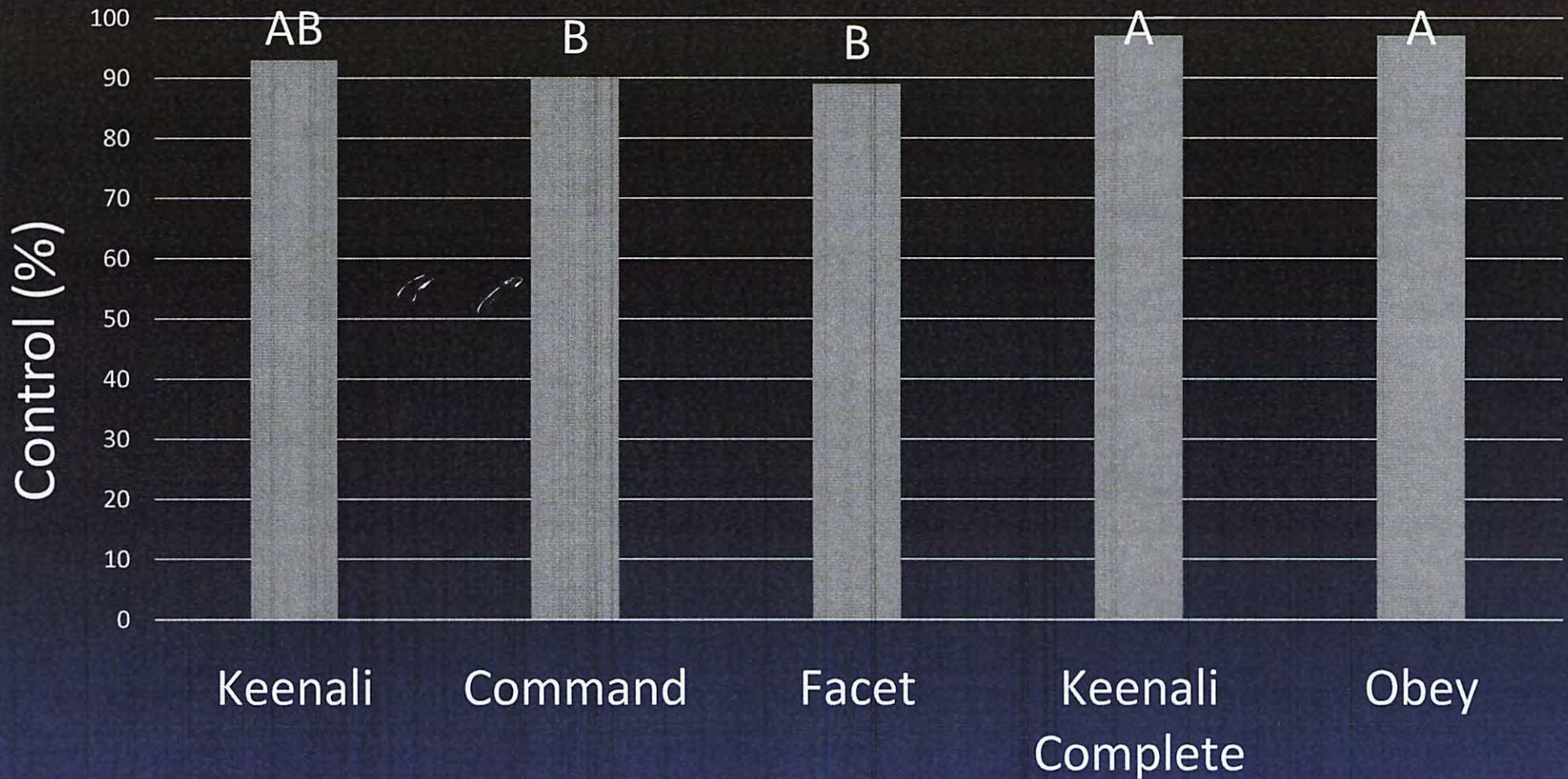

Keenali Overview

- New herbicide site of action
 - Dihydroorotate dehydrogenase inhibitor
- Keenali Complete only available as a co-pack
 - 1 gallon Keenali
 - 2.5 gallons Command 3ME
- Use rate
 - Silt loam soil
 - Keenali – 4.3 fl oz/A
 - Command 3ME – 10.75 fl oz/A (\$4.74/A at \$56.49/gal)
 - Clay soil
 - Keenali – 8.6 fl oz/A (**maximum annual rate**)
 - Command 3ME – 21.5 fl oz/A

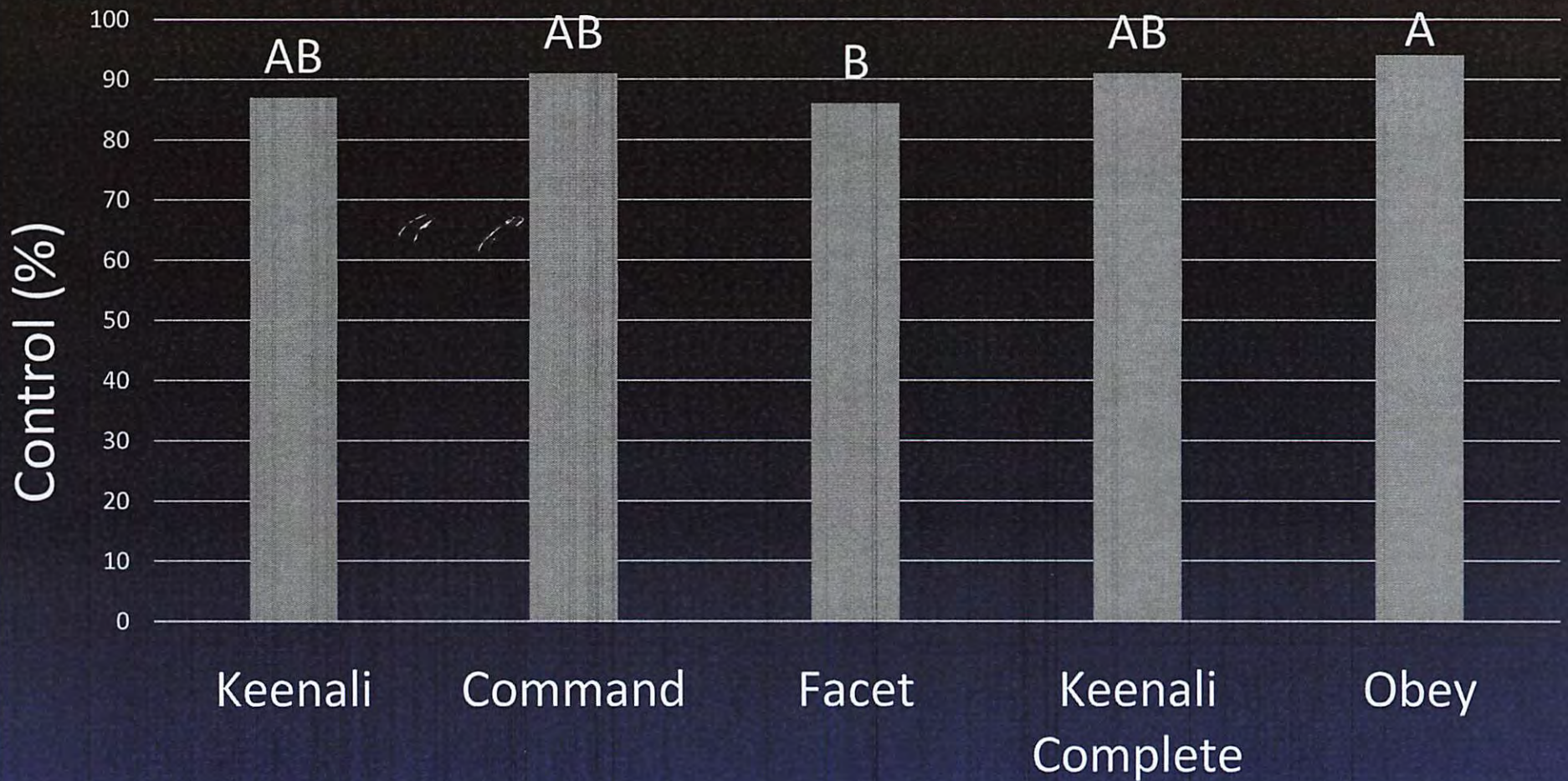
How effective is preemergence-applied Keenali on barnyardgrass?

Averaged over 3 to 7 WAT (3 years – clay loam)

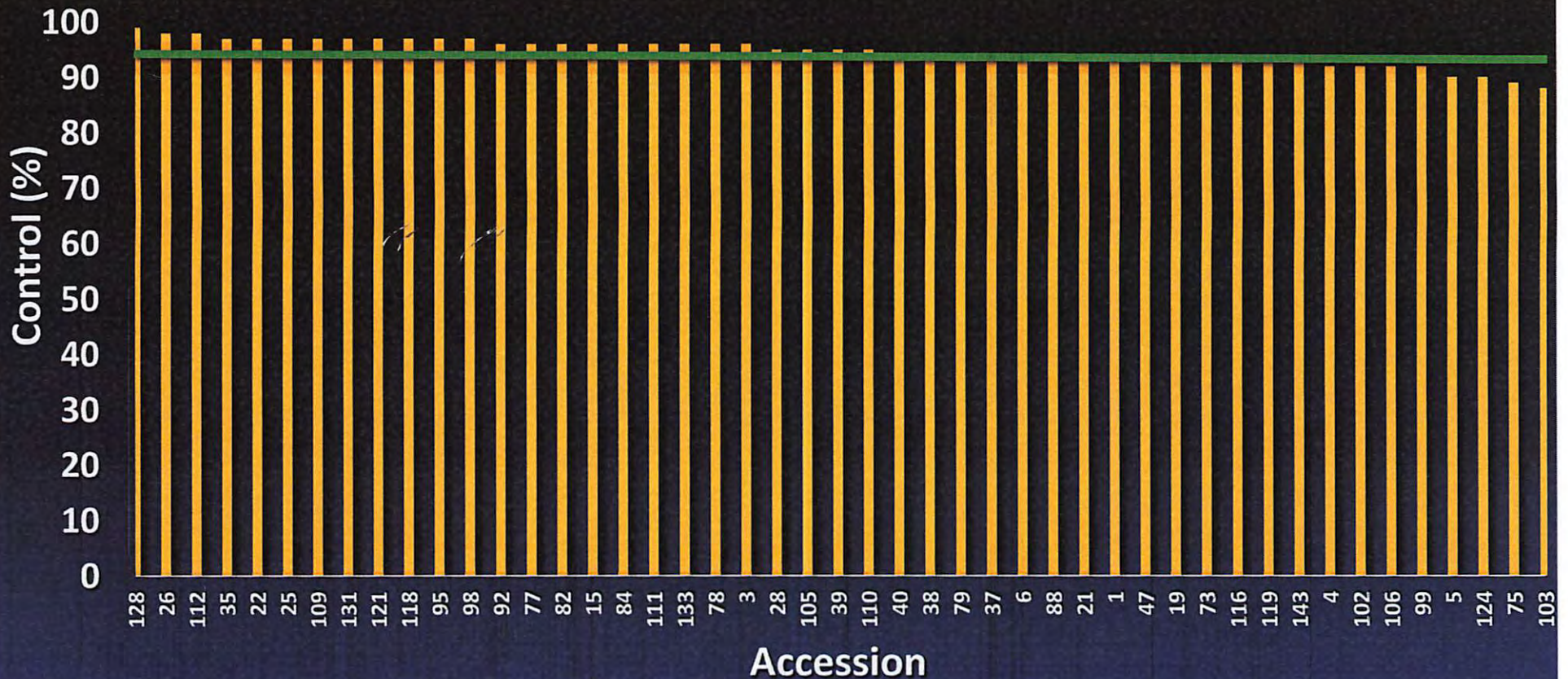


Do barnyardgrass populations differ in sensitivity to preemergence Keenali?



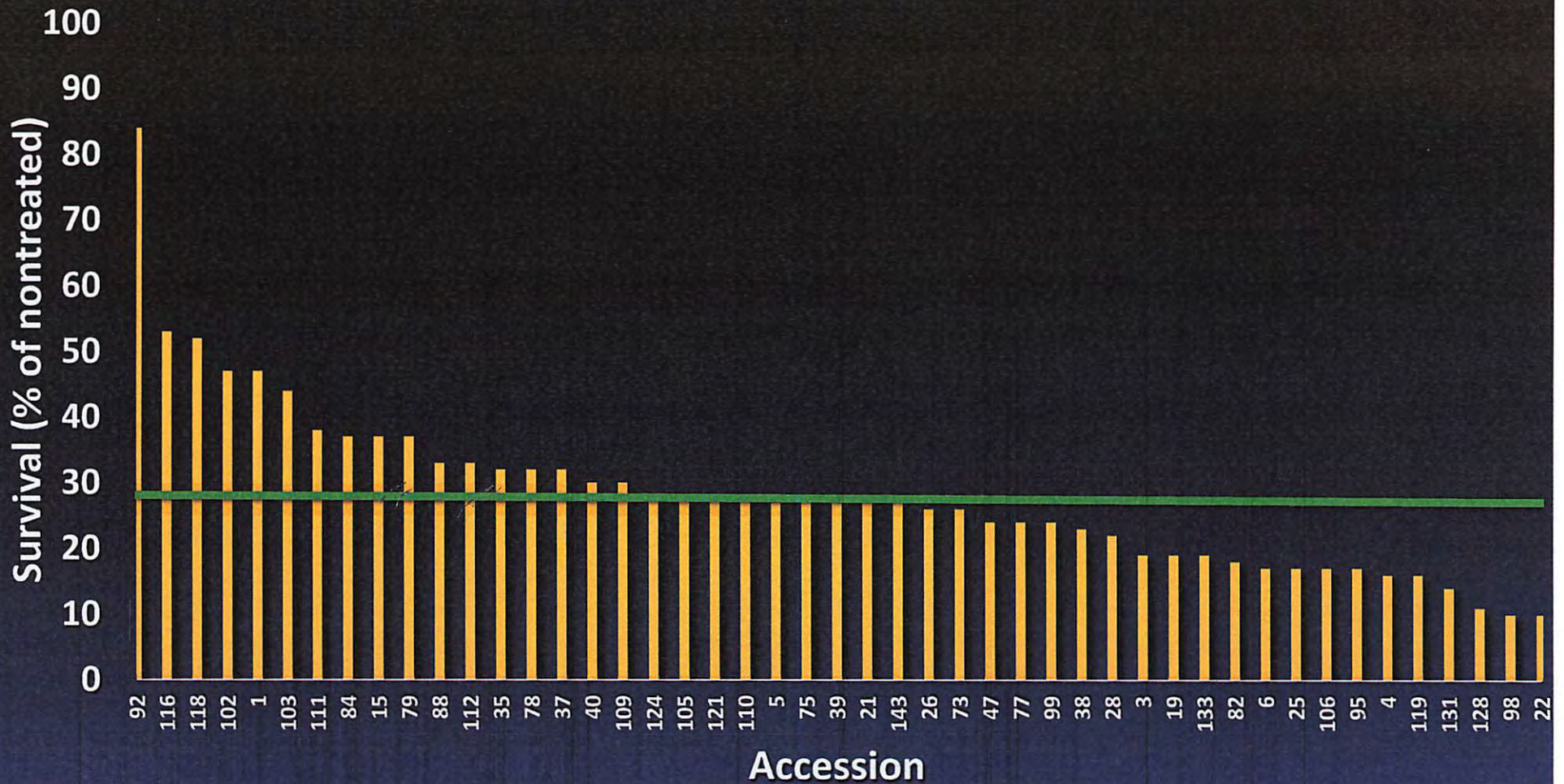
Control of barnyardgrass populations with preemergence Keenali

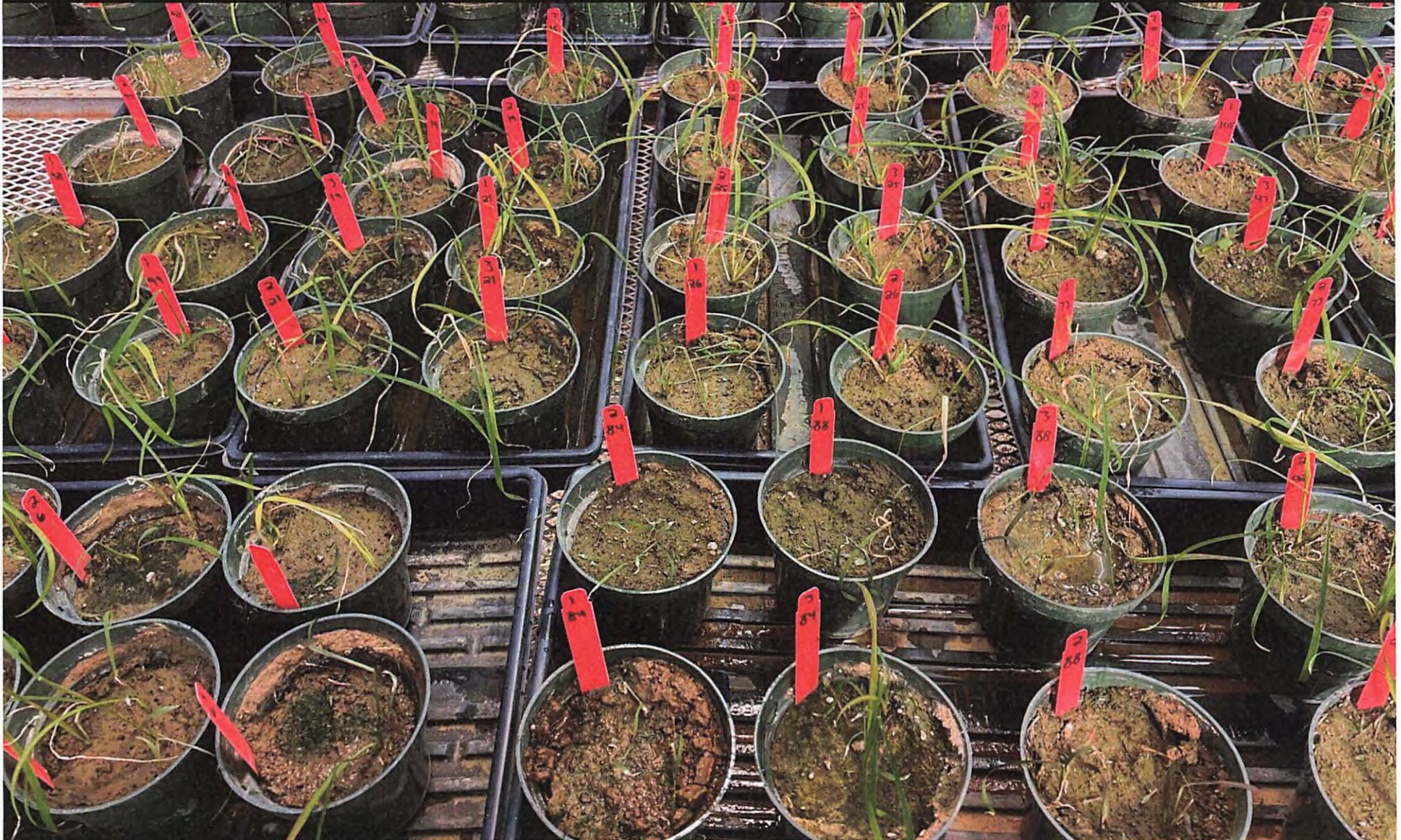

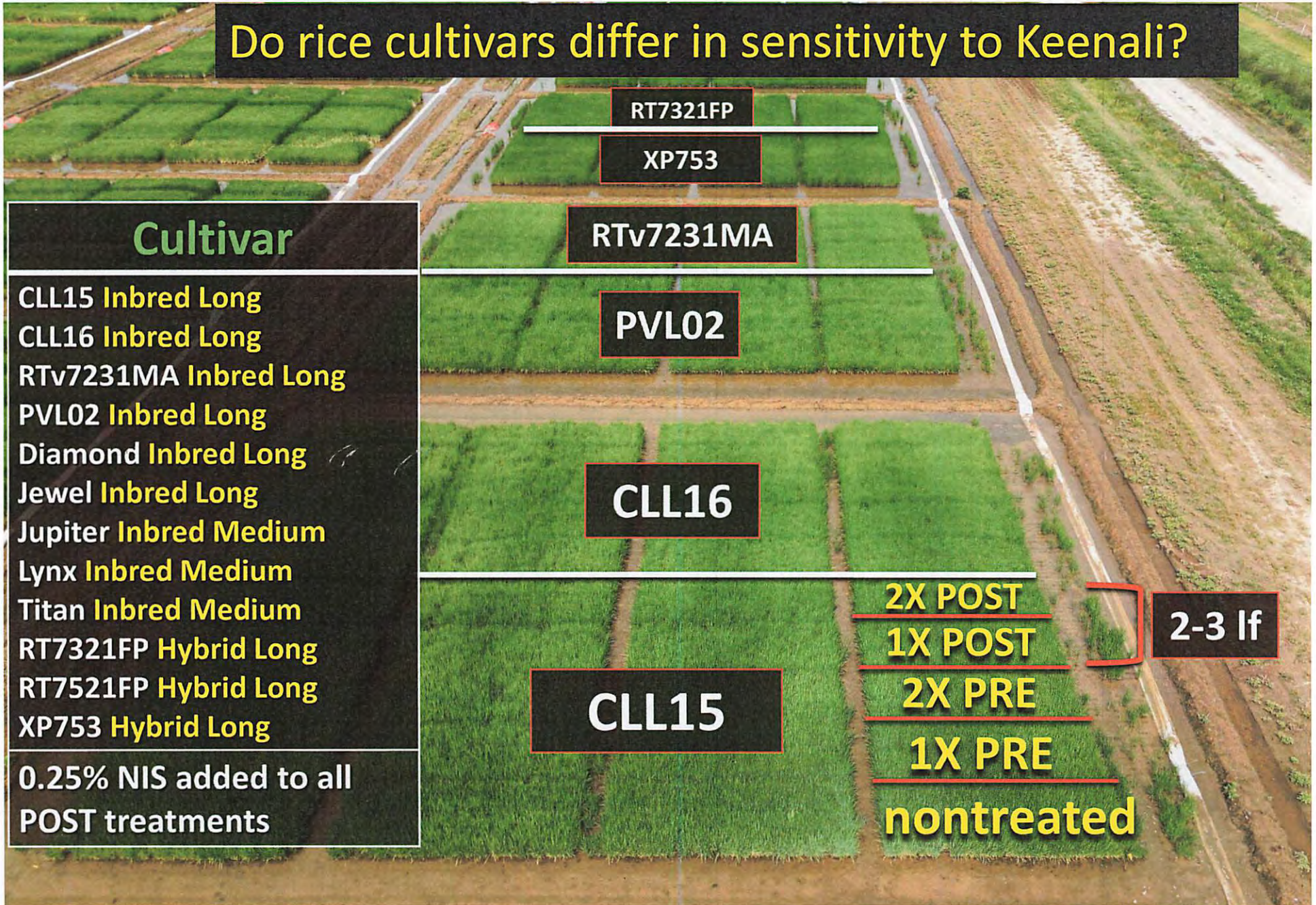

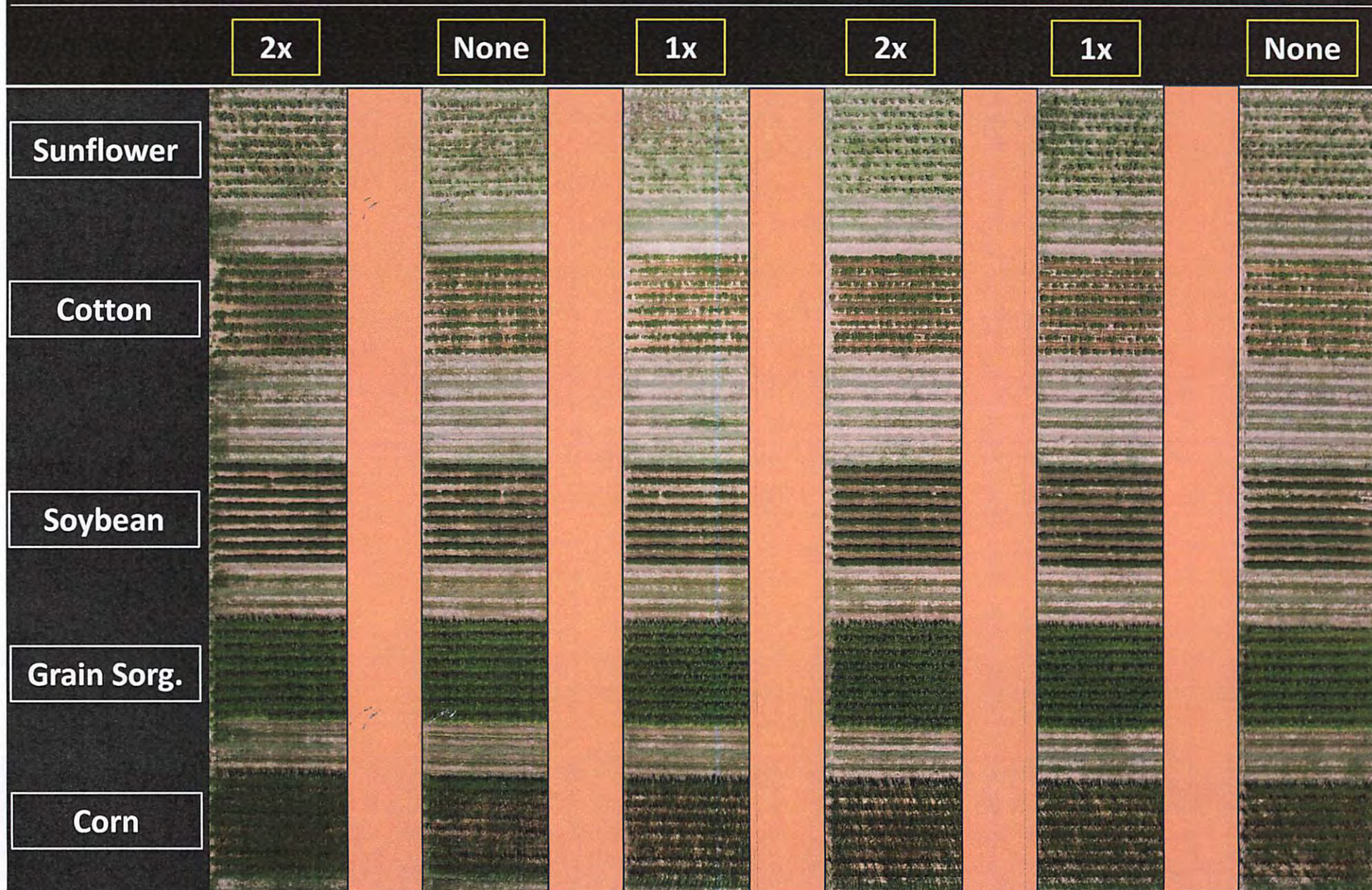

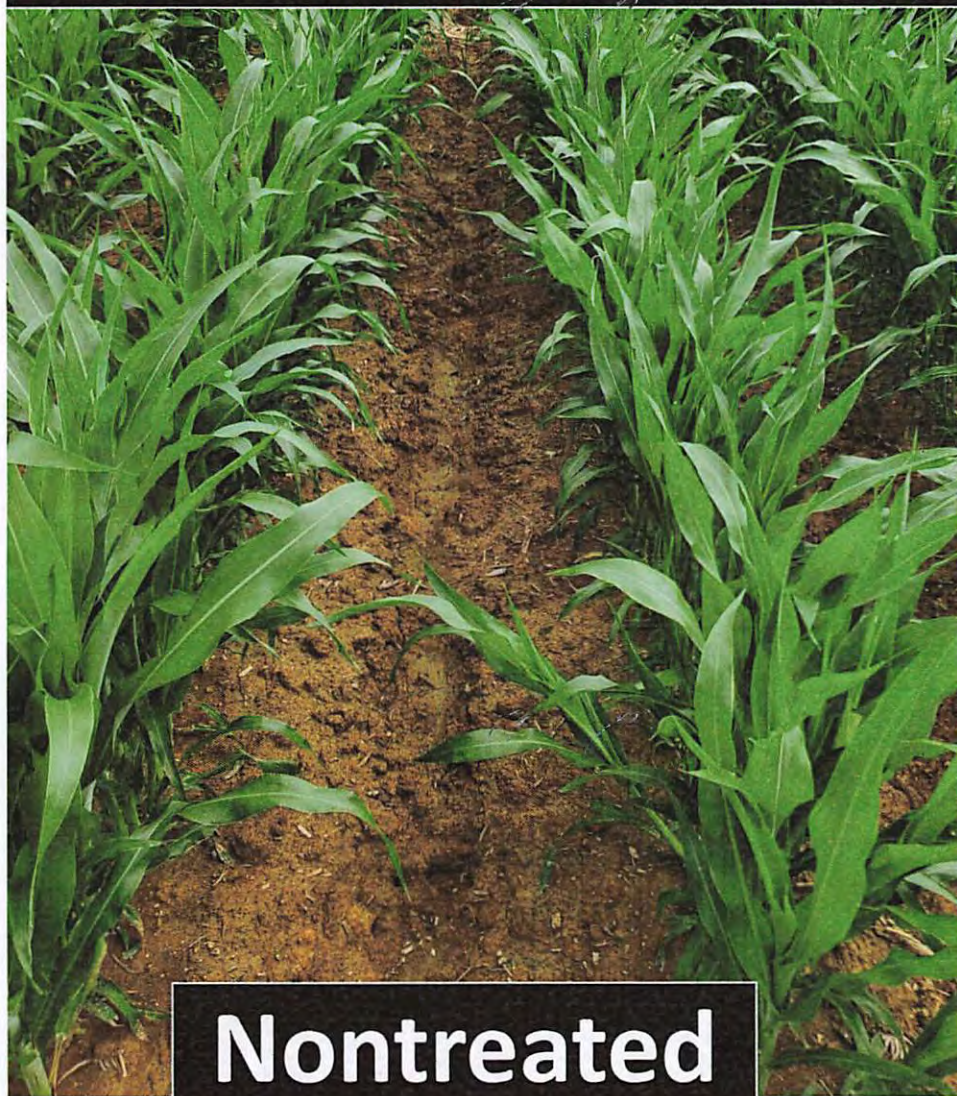

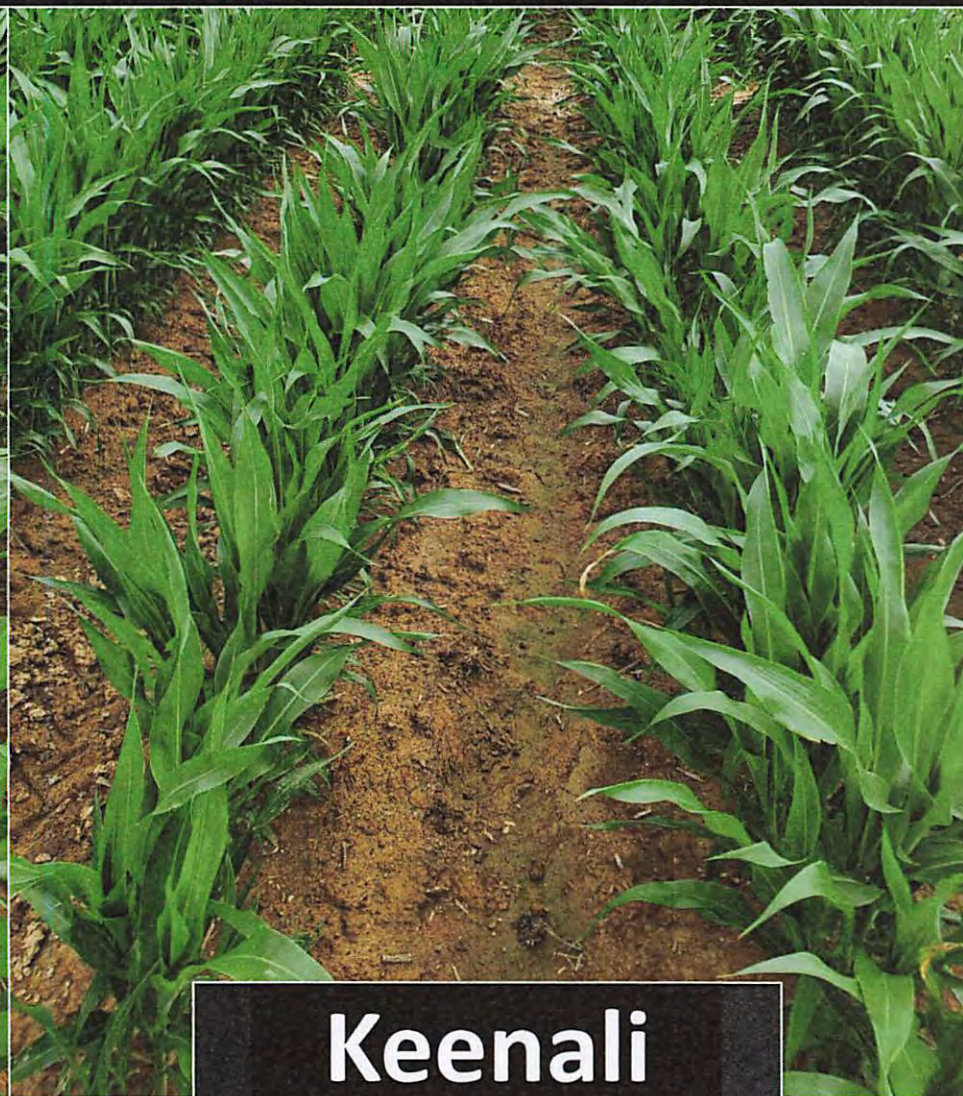


How sensitive are adjacent crops to Keenali drift?

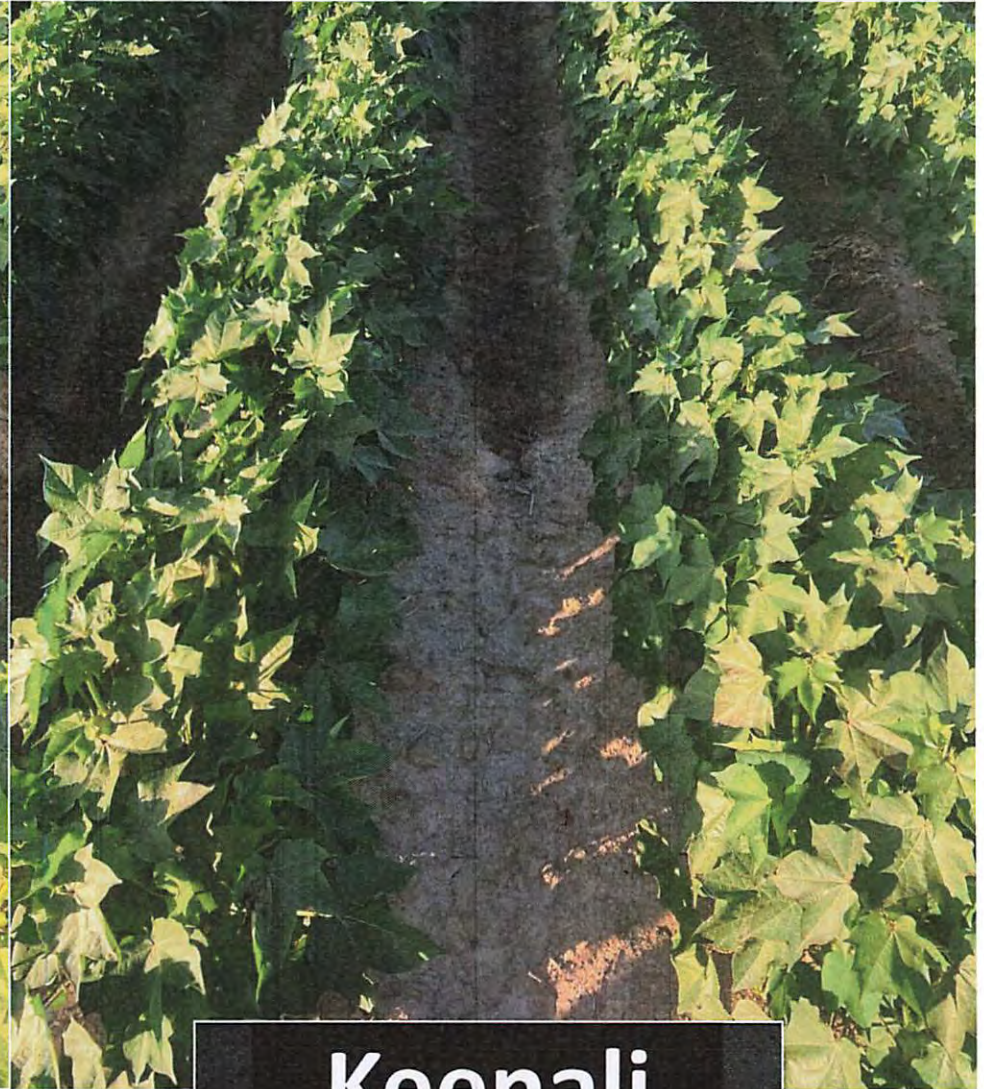

Keenali Conclusions or Takeaways

- Most active on barnyardgrass and sprangletops
 - Minimal differences in sensitivity among barnyardgrass populations, but some variability may exist
- Not a standalone herbicide
 - **PRE:** Less effective than clomazone on fall panicum, broadleaf signalgrass, & goosegrass. A partner like **clomazone** is needed for broad-spectrum control and resistance management
 - **POST:** Tank-mix with an effective POST grass herbicide
- No broadleaf activity: Propanil or others needed
- Needs to be part of a multiple-pass system

Keenali Conclusions or Takeaways

- Flexible plantback to subsequent crops
- Minimal risk to adjacent crops from drift
- All tested rice cultivars are highly tolerant
- Much better activity PRE than POST
- Moist soil conditions will improve performance, with increased activity **often** seen after flood establishment
- Symptomology on weeds looks like yellow herbicides (Prowl)

Keenali Section 18 Update

- Mar. 14th - Met with FMC regulatory
- Aug. 15th – Started preparing Section 18; contacted FMC again asking for support
- Aug. 25th – Completed Section 18 (my portion); sent to FMC for completion of their portion
- Sept. 4th – Met with Jennifer Gaines and Eric Bohnenblust of the EPA to discuss Section 18
 - Risk Assessment must be completed before submission
 - Notice of receipt will be filed, followed by a 15- to 30-day comment period
 - Numbers are important
 - Submission will trigger the ESA Assessment
 - Review will likely be longer than the typical 60 days

Keenali Section 18 Request

- All rice-producing counties in Arkansas
- 2023 & 2024 barnyardgrass samples
 - 75% resistant to Stam
 - 61% resistant to Newpath
 - 52% resistant to Facet
 - 37% resistant to Regiment
 - 27% resistant to Clincher/Ricestar
 - 3% resistant to Command
- Multiple resistance
 - 27% of samples (2006-2017)
 - 70% of samples (2023-2024)

Section 18 Requested Acres

- 2026 projected rice acres – 1.3 million
- Maxace or Provisia on 30% of acres (390,000)
 - Keenali not needed due to the effectiveness of Highcard and Provisia (only 1 resistant sample found in AR)
- Conventional, Clearfield, or Fullpage on 70% of acres (910,000)
 - Safe to assume that 60% of these acres have economically damaging, multi-resistant barnyardgrass
- 546,000 acres requested
 - Applied from March 15 – June 15

Needs from FMC before submission

- Requested August 25th
 - Establishment Number
 - Restrictions, User Precautions and Requirements
 - Progress Toward Registration
 - Residues, Risk Information
 - Letter of Support
- Sept. 17th: Notified that FMC plans to submit their antimicrobial resistance report mid- to late October
- Oct. 6th: Meeting with EPA and FMC regulatory to further discuss Section 18

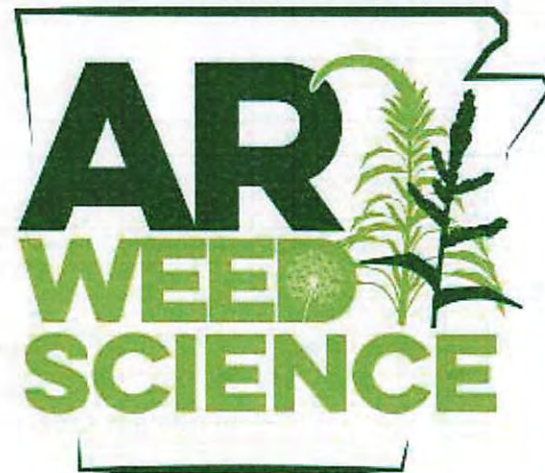

SIGNED SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

CF17-0110 James (Rusty) Cartillar, III (Drift)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. James (Rusty) Cartillar, III, Commercial Applicator, made an aerial application of Command and Sharpen to 80 acres of rice April 11, 2017. The evidence shows this application drifted off target onto Mr. Cecil Yarbros' property. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Rule's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level II Major violation. Mr. Cartillar agrees to a Level I Warning for settlement of the allegation.

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Jeffrey Dale Slack, Commercial Applicator, made a ground application of Glyphosate 41%, Panther SC, Clash, and Direct to 425 acres in the Etowah Farm field for burndown on April 05, 2021 for Bell Planting Company. The evidence shows this application drifted off target onto Ms. Spain's trees. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Rule's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level III Major violation. Mr. Slack agrees to a Level I Warning for settlement of the allegation.

CF21-0066 Bryan Stone Schmidt (Drift)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Bryan Stone Schmidt, Private Applicator, made a ground application of Roundup PowerMAX and Command 3ME to 64 acres in Field #4 for burndown on April 17, 2021. The evidence shows this application drifted off target onto Mr. Romine's trees. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Rule's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Minor violation. Mr. Schmidt agrees to a Level I Warning for settlement of the allegation.

CF21-0066 Bryan Stone Schmidt (Buffer Zone)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Bryan Stone Schmidt, Private Applicator, made ground applications of Roundup PowerMAX and Command 3ME to 76 acres in Field #2 and #3 for burndown on April 05, 2021 and to 64 acres in Field #4 for burndown on April 17, 2021. The evidence shows the applications were made within 1200 feet of the Hoxie city limit which would be inside the 1200 foot buffer zone requirement for Command 3ME; thus, this is considered two (2) buffer zone violations. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Rule's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Minor violation and Level II Major violations.

Mr. Schmidt agrees to a Level I Warning for settlement of the above listed allegations.

CF21-0127 Dustin D. McMahan (Record Keeping – Class H)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Dustin D. McMahan, Private Applicator, made an application of an unknown product containing dicamba to 35 acres of cotton in the McIntire's field on an unknown date. The evidence shows Mr. Dustin D. McMahan failed to keep the proper records for a Class H product by not recording the application. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Rule's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Minor violation. Mr. McMahan agrees to a Level I Warning for settlement of the allegation.

CF21-0127 Dustin D. McMahan (Buffer Zone – Class H)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Dustin D. McMahan, Private Applicator, made a ground application of Engenia, On-Target, and Sentrif to Bayou 80-Ditch for burndown on June 30, 2021 and an application of an unknown product containing dicamba to 35 acres of cotton in the McIntire's field on an unknown date. The evidence shows the applications were made within approximately .70 and .08 miles of University of Arkansas - Rohwer Research Station which would be inside the 1 mile buffer zone requirement for Class H Products; thus, this is considered two (2) buffer zone violations. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Rule's Penalty Matrix defines these violations as Level I Minor violation and Level II Major violations.

Mr. McMahan agrees to a Level I Warning for settlement of the above listed allegations.

CF21-0127 Shawn Keith Simpson (Record Keeping – Class H)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Shawn Keith Simpson, Private Applicator, made an application of an unknown product containing dicamba to soybeans in the McElroys field on an unknown date. The evidence shows Mr. Shawn Keith Simpson failed to keep the proper records for a Class H product by not recording the application. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Rule's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Minor violation. Mr. Simpson agrees to a Level I Warning for settlement of the allegation.

CF21-0127 Shawn Keith Simpson (Buffer Zone – Class H)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Shawn Keith Simpson, Private Applicator, made an application of an unknown product containing dicamba to soybeans in the McElroys field on an unknown date. The evidence shows the application was made within approximately .30 miles of University of Arkansas - Rohwer Research Station which would be inside the 1 mile buffer zone requirement for Class H Products; thus, this is considered a buffer zone violation. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Rule's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Minor violation. Mr. Simpson agrees to a Level I Warning for settlement of the allegation.

CF21-0471 Ray J. Holzhauer (Use During Prohibited Period – Class H)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Ray J. Holzhauer, Private Applicator for Shanco Co., made an application of an unknown product containing dicamba to the irrigation line in field BL8 on an unknown date. The evidence shows the application was made during the prohibited period of July 1st through October 31st. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Rule's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Egregious Eligible violation. Mr. Holzhauer agrees to a Level I Warning for settlement of the allegation.

CF21-0471 Ray J. Holzauer (Failure to Provide Records – Class H)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Ray J. Holzauer, Private Applicator for Shanco Co., made an application of an unknown product containing dicamba to the irrigation line in field BL8 on an unknown date. The evidence shows Mr. Ray J. Holzauer failed to provide records for the dicamba application as required when asked on August 17, 2021. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Rule's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Egregious Eligible violation. Mr. Holzauer agrees to a Level I Warning for settlement of the allegation.

CF21-0471 Michael A. Dodson (Buffer Zone – Class H)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Michael A. Dodson made a postemergence ground application of Engenia, Prefix, Volacept, and Traverse D to 37.46 acres of soybeans in the Haunted House field on June 15, 2021 and to 204.33 acres of soybeans in the Malcolm field on June 16, 2021. The evidence shows the application was made within ¼ mile of Mr. Morton's non dicamba-tolerant soybean field which would be inside the ¼ mile buffer zone requirement for Class H Products; thus, this is considered a buffer zone violation. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Rule's Penalty Matrix defines these violations as Level I Minor violation and Level II Major violations.

Mr. Dodson agrees to a Level I Warning for settlement of the above listed allegations.

CF21-0355 Lenny Joe Kyle (Use During Prohibited Period – Class H)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Lenny Joe Kyle, Private Applicator, made a postemergence ground application of Engenia (EPA Reg. #7969-345) and Compadre to 2/3 acres of soybeans in the Penrose field on July 17, 2021 using a backpack sprayer. The evidence shows the application was made during the prohibited period of July 1st through October 31st. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Rule's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Egregious Eligible violation. Mr. Kyle agrees to a Level I Warning for settlement of the allegation.

CF21-0355 Lenny Joe Kyle (Use of an Unregistered Product – Class H)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Lenny Joe Kyle, Private Applicator, made a postemergence ground application of Engenia (EPA Reg. #7969-345) and Compadre to 2/3 acres of soybeans in the Penrose field on July 17, 2021 using a backpack sprayer. The evidence shows the application was made after December 20, 2020 (date the registration for this product expired); thus, is considered use of an unregistered Class H product. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Rule's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Egregious Eligible violation. Mr. Kyle agrees to a Level I Warning for settlement of the allegation.

CF21-0355 Lenny Joe Kyle (Record Keeping – Class H)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Lenny Joe Kyle, Private Applicator, made a postemergence ground application of Engenia (EPA Reg. #7969-345) and Compadre to 2/3 acres of soybeans in the Penrose field on July 17, 2021 using a backpack sprayer. The evidence shows Mr. Kyle failed to keep the proper records by not recording the total amount applied, proof the applicator completed the required training, receipts for the purchase of this product, the sensitive crop registry consulted, the spray nozzle the applicator used to apply this product, and the nozzle pressure the applicator set the sprayer to. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Rule's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Egregious Eligible violation. Mr. Kyle agrees to a Level I Warning for settlement of the allegation.

CF21-0355 Lenny Joe Kyle (No Training Certificate – Class H)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Lenny Joe Kyle, Private Applicator, made a postemergence ground application of Engenia (EPA Reg. #7969-345) and Compadre to 2/3 acres of soybeans in the Penrose field on July 17, 2021 using a backpack sprayer. The evidence shows Mr. Lenny Joe Kyle could not provide an EPA approved training certificate required for the application. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Rule's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Egregious Eligible violation. Mr. Kyle agrees to a Level I Warning for settlement of the allegation.

CF21-0538 Justin Keith Haller (Drift)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Justin Keith Haller, Commercial Applicator for Scott Flying Service, made a postemergence application of Sodium Chlorate (Defol 5) to 35 acres of rice in the Corbet #5 field on September 07, 2021 for Mr. Jeff Worlow. The evidence shows this application drifted off target onto Mr. Phillips' soybeans. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Rule's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level II Major violation. Mr. Haller agrees to a Level I Warning for settlement of the allegation.

WORKER PROTECTION STANDARD – WARNING LETTER

CF24-0223 John Scroggin (Record Keeping – Worker Protection Standard)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. John Scroggin, Operator in Charge, Rice Flying Service, failed to meet the requirements for worker/handler training as prescribed by the Worker Protection Standard, 40 CFR Part 170. The evidence shows Mr. Scroggin failed to maintain records of training for handlers employed by their establishment for two years after the date of the training. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Rule's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Minor violation. The proposed enforcement action for this violation is a Warning Letter.

BOARD MEETING MINUTES

February 26, 2025

ARKANSAS DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

LITTLE ROCK, AR.

Members present were Chairman Joe Mencer, Vice Chairman Pace Hindsley, Secretary Gregg Garner, Benton Felts, Travis Senter and Ramey Stiles. Sam Stuckey was not present.

Also present were Regina Coleman, Executive Director for ABWEF; Katie Watts, Administrative Assistant for ABWEF; Melissa Cary, Landmark PLC; Zac Wellman, Arkansas Department of Agriculture; and Andrew Grobmyer, Ag Council.

Chairman Joe Mencer called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m.

Mr. Hindsley moved to approve the minutes of the November 12th, 2024, meeting. Mr. Senter seconded. Motion carried.

Ms. Cary gave the financial update. December 2024 financials showed Cash on hand was \$4,209,306. Grower Assessment Receivable was \$14,442. The Statement of Activities showed operating expenses were \$39,531 under budget at the year's end. Ms. Cary pointed out the Interest Income of \$155,038 for 2024 as compared to \$53,000 in 2023. Mr. Garner moved to approve the financial report. Mr. Hindsley seconded. Motion carried.

The Delta Invoice was presented by Ms. Cary. The Delta direct expenses were \$67,147.32 and overhead expenses are \$159,063.05. The total Delta expenses were \$226,210.37. Mr. Hindsley moved to approve the Delta Invoice. Mr. Garner seconded. Motion carried.

Mrs. Coleman gave the program update. She discussed the Projected Cash Flow for 2025 and expenses from 2024. Acres for this season are expected to be approximately 500,000 acres, down 15 – 20 percent. Additional information will be presented at the next meeting. Also discussed were the cost for grower rebates, National Boll Weevil Protection Fund voluntary assessment, and a new mapping program.

Mr. Garner moved to set the 2025 assessment at \$3 per acre. He also moved to do a grower rebate of \$1 per acre on the 2024 acres totaling \$613,400. Mr. Hindsley seconded. Motion carried. Mrs. Coleman stated that the rebate checks will be prepared by the end of April. Mr. Hindsley moved to approve the 2025 projected cash flow. Mr. Garner seconded. Motion carried.

Mrs. Coleman discussed a new mapping program and Boll Weevil program for 2025. Updates are being made to the Boll Weevil program to allow more options for the grower to report and verify acres online using their grower accounts on the website. Other plans include adding map images to the grower accounts for field identification.

Handbook changes were discussed concerning job duties during the off season for field staff. Mrs. Coleman stated that she will present a proposal to the Personnel committee for their review and to the board for their approval.

Entities that Owe Report for 2024 cotton was reviewed by Mrs. Coleman. Some of the cotton was ginned so an investigation into the matter will be conducted by inspectors for the Arkansas Department of Agriculture. A recommendation will be given to the Arkansas State Plant Board after the inspectors complete their investigations.

The next board meeting is scheduled for July 10th, 2025, beginning at 10:00. Prior to the board meeting the Personnel Committee meeting will meet at 9:00 and the Finance Committee will meet at 9:30 a.m.

With no further business, the meeting adjourned at 11:48.

Members present were Chairman Joe Mencer, Vice Chairman Pace Hindsley, Secretary Gregg Garner, Benton Felts, Ramey Stiles and Sam Stuckey. Travis Senter was not present.

Also present were Regina Coleman, Executive Director for ABWEF; Katie Watts, Administrative Assistant for ABWEF; Cal McCastlain, Legal Counsel for ABWEF; Melissa Cary, Landmark PLC; Zac Wellman, Arkansas Department of Agriculture; Scott Bray, Arkansas Department of Agriculture; Mark Stoll, Arkansas Department of Agriculture; Sherry Seiffert, Legal Counsel for Arkansas Department of Agriculture; Brandy Carroll, Farm Bureau; Bobby Davis, Arthur Gallagher Insurance Company; Jeremy Jones, Insurance Company; and Andrew Grobmyer, Ag Council.

Chairman Joe Mencer called the meeting to order at 10:02 a.m.

Mr. Mencer discussed the need for insurance coverage for the Foundation due to non-renewals from Imperium Insurance Company. Bobby Davis addressed the board and stated that he had been unaware that nonrenewal notices had been sent to Mrs. Coleman, but he was aware that Imperium Insurance Company would not renew the type of coverage the Foundation had with Imperium. He stated the market has changed in the insurance world and insurance policies were becoming increasingly difficult to write. Mr. Davis will continue to provide policies for Workers Compensation, Directors and Officers, and the Crime. All policies with Gallagher end on June 7th, except the Workers Compensation which renewed at

the first of the year. Mr. Davis suggested that the Foundation should get quotes from different insurance companies for the non-renewals.

Mrs. Coleman reported on different options for insurance coverage for the non-renewals. She had requested quotes from Reeves Gaddy with South Group, Adam Byrd with Delta Insurance, Jeremy Jones with Jonesboro Insurance, and Perry Dixon with Relation Insurance. Reeves Gaddy with South Group had presented a renewal option with Imperium Insurance Company but required an "agent of record change" letter to proceed.

Jeremy Jones discussed the options he had secured but stated that the fees would be higher because of the higher risks for covering the Foundation.

Mr. Garner made a motion to have Reeves Gaddy as the agent of record and for Mrs. Coleman to secure the best selection for insurance coverage for the Foundation. Mr. Stuckey seconded. Motion carried.

Mr. Wellman gave the report on three gins that ginned cotton in 2024 without the grower's gin certificates. The three case files are for Tripp Gin, Lee Wilson & Company LLC and RHM Gin.

Mr. Stuckey moved to send Tripp Gin a letter notifying them of probation for three years along with the option to pay the assessment fees of \$8837 within two weeks of notice or pay the enforcement penalty of up to \$50 per bale from the Arkansas State Plant Board. Mr. Garner seconded. Motion carried.


Mr. Garner moved to send a warning letter to Lee Wilson & Co., LLC. Mr. Felts seconded. Motion carried.

Mr. Garner moved to send RHM Gin a letter notifying them of probation for three years along with the option to pay assessments fees of \$1480.30 within two weeks of notice or pay enforcement penalty of up to \$50 per bale from the Arkansas State Plant Board. Mr. Felts seconded. The motion carried. Mr. Stuckey recused himself from the vote due to conflict of interest.

Mrs. Coleman gave update on the cotton pest study for 2025. The board approved the Foundation conducting the trapping survey for the Department of Agriculture and the United States Department of Agriculture.

The Technical Advisory Committee for Arkansas's Boll Weevil program will meet to discuss the minimum standards for Arkansas. Mrs. Coleman will give the report at the next meeting.

With no further business, the meeting adjourned at 11:48 a.m.
