


# HOW TO VIEW FLOODPLAIN MAPS AND MAKE A FIRMETTE USING THE FEMA NFHL VIEWER

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) no longer makes paper flood maps available. Floodplain maps may be viewed and downloaded from National Flood Hazard Layer (NFHL) viewer:



Here are the steps to find your flood map, view, save and print them. If you need personal assistance, call the Arkansas Natural Resources Commission at 501-682-1611, and ask for the Floodplain Section.


1. Go to <https://msc.fema.gov/nfhl> and click OK
2. Type in an address, town, or other location.




3. Adjust the map as needed to find the location of interest. Use the + and - to change the zoom and left click and hold to move around the map.




4. Click the Toolbox to open the print dialog.



- Place the pin at the place of interest and click **Execute** to make a FIRMette. FEMA's Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) are approximately two feet by three feet in size when printed to full-scale. A FIRMette is a full-scale section of a FIRM that you create yourself and is formatted to print on most home/office printers.
