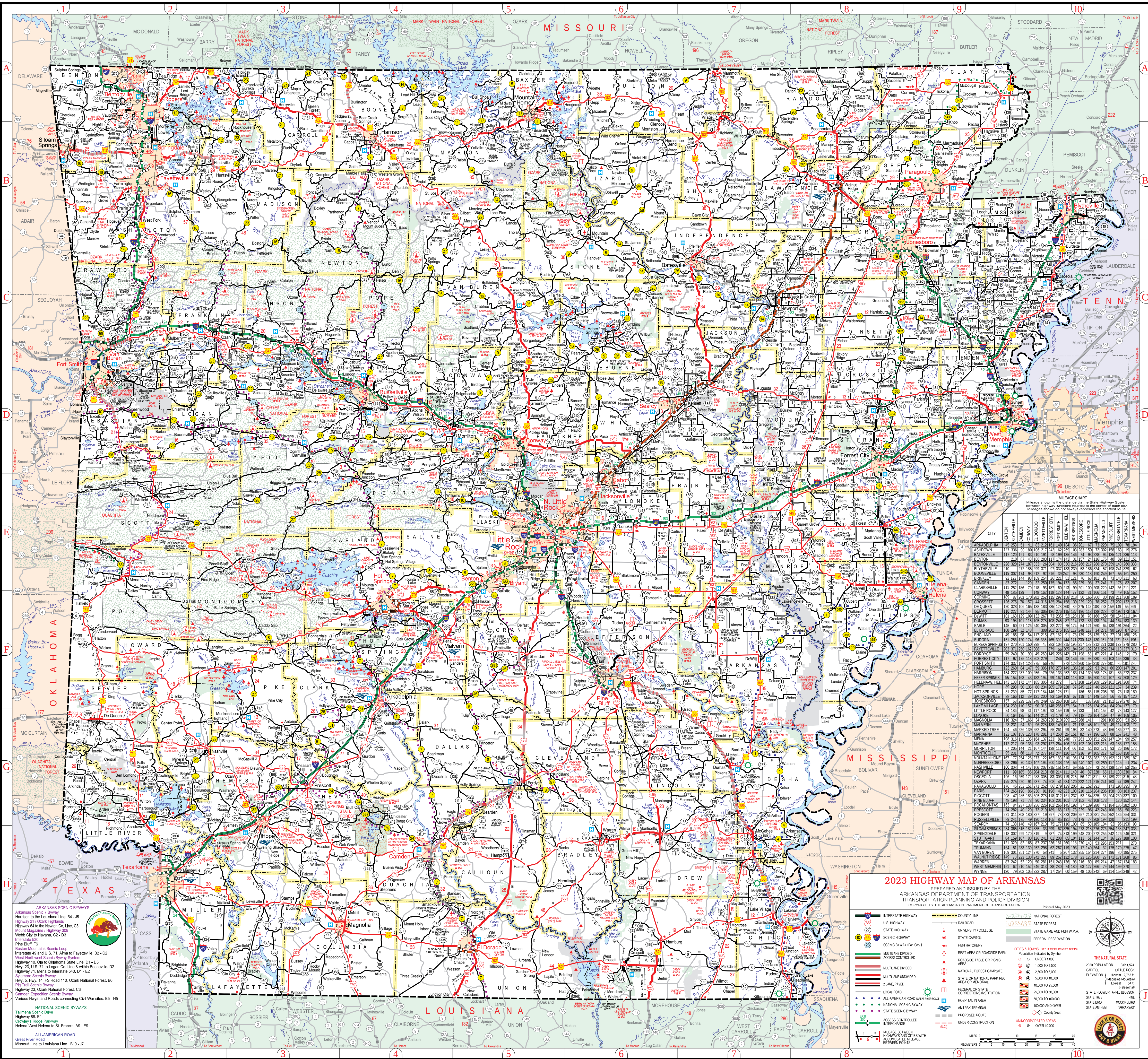

It was 100 years ago, in 1913, that the Harrison Road Law created the State Highway System featuring 6,782 miles of roads. Our system now has over 10,000 miles of roads.

As you view the Natural State, visit one of the Arkansas Welcome Centers in Bella Vista, Blytheville, Comstock, El Dorado, Harrison, Helena-West Helena, Lake Village, Mammoth Springs, Sileam Springs, Texarkana, Van Buren, West Memphis and at the Red River north of Texarkana to find out more information about historic landmarks, museums, local festivals, and more!

On the road again? The best source of travel information is DriveArkansas.com. Interactive layers, live traffic cameras and real-time traffic data will help you plan around traffic conditions, construction zones, and rest area locations.

You can also find out how to get around Arkansas – always be attentive while driving in construction zones and stay at least 400 feet behind a vehicle in the Slow Down, Phone Down safety campaign to remind everyone that travelers and construction workers alike deserve to make it home to their families each day.

We are home to 52 State Parks, all of which are highlighted on this map, and I hope you will take the opportunity to visit each one. Crater of Diamonds is the only public park in the world where you can search for diamonds in their original volcanic source. Mount Magazine State Park sits atop Arkansas' highest point at 2,753 feet. Ozark Folk Center State Park is dedicated to preserving the music, crafts, and culture of the Ozark Mountains. Devil's Den State Park stands as one of the most intact Indian Civilization Conservation Corps sites in the U.S. and offers trails, caverns, and rock formations for exploring.

Hot Springs National Park is a top destination with the grand architecture of its historic bathhouses, its ancient thermal springs, and thoroughbred racing. For art lovers, enjoy a trip to Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art with a permanent collection spanning five centuries.

This Arkansas highway map also includes a list of the Natural State's Scenic Byways, National Scenic Byways, and the Great River Road. You'll discover all of Arkansas' National Forest Recreation areas are listed too.
