

2026-001

IT IS ORDERED that a meeting of the Arkansas State Highway Commission be opened at 10:00 a.m., February 11, 2026.

2026-002

WHEREAS, the Purchasing Committee has awarded purchases on December 2, December 19, and December 23, 2025, January 14, January 21, and January 26, 2026, in the amounts of \$885,369.00, \$809,049.11, \$2,272,010.84, \$2,665,080.00, \$772,068.00, and \$2,121,025.00, respectively, totaling \$9,524,601.95, and supply and service contracts, in accordance with authority previously conveyed, all of which have been documented by official minutes which are of record in the files of the Commission and Equipment and Procurement Division.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the action of the Purchasing Committee be ratified and confirmed in all particulars.

2026-003

WHEREAS, the Keep Arkansas Beautiful Commission aspires to inspire individuals to improve their communities by educating, preventing litter,

promoting recycling and keeping Arkansas beautiful, which in turn improves the scenic beauty of the State's highways; and

WHEREAS, the Arkansas Department of Transportation spends approximately \$8 million annually to remove litter from the State Highway System; and

WHEREAS, the Department's previous contributions to the Keep Arkansas Beautiful Commission have been helpful in continuing efforts to combat litter in Arkansas.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to make a contribution of \$100,000 this year to the Keep Arkansas Beautiful Commission for use further strengthening it's anti-letter campaign.

2026-004

WHEREAS, the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) has billed the Arkansas Department of Transportation for membership dues for the year 2026; and

WHEREAS, this membership is regarded as being highly beneficial to the Department.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Director is authorized to process payment for AASHTO membership dues for the year 2026 in the amount of \$42,365.76.

2026-005

WHEREAS, the Highway System in Arkansas facilitates safe mobility, economic development, and tourism enhancement throughout the State; and

WHEREAS, public information and education activities play an important role in providing the citizens of our State with pertinent information relative to the issues facing the Commission and Department; and

WHEREAS, the Arkansas Good Roads Foundation serves as an effective group to provide this information and education to transportation stakeholders, elected officials, and the public.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to make a contribution of \$40,000 to the Arkansas Good Roads Foundation for its public information and education activities for the time period January 1, 2026, through December 31, 2026.

2026-006

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Department to provide timely engineering surveys for the design and construction of highways and land surveys necessary for the purchase of highway right of way; and

WHEREAS, the Department's on-call surveying services contracts have been an effective method of providing additional expertise and supplementing in-house capabilities; and

WHEREAS, the current on-call surveying contracts expire in 2026.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to request proposals, select consultant engineering and land surveying firms to perform surveying services and enter into any necessary contracts as needs are identified for a term of three years with the option to extend.

2026-007

WHEREAS, the Arkansas Strategic Highway Safety Plan (SHSP) identifies emergency services and incident management as a focus area for improving highway safety; and

WHEREAS, educating the public about the "Move Over" law as defined in Arkansas Code § 27 51-310 is a top strategy for improving the safety of first responders, towing operators, and work zone personnel; and

WHEREAS, to support this strategy, the SHSP recommends publicizing the "Move Over" law through media campaigns; and

WHEREAS, safety education and outreach are eligible for Federal-aid Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) funds.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to enter into agreements with Arkansas State Police and other safety partners to proceed with the development,

publication, and distribution of a comprehensive media campaign for the “Move Over” law as funds become available.

WHEREAS, the Arkansas State Highway Commission (Commission) acquired property known as Tract 34, Job 006668, from Louise Bell, by Warranty Deed dated March 9, 1961, and filed of record on March 14, 1961, in Book Vol. 133 at Page 571, in the Office of the Circuit Clerk and Ex-Officio Recorder of Lonoke County, Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, Tract 34 was acquired as right of way by the Commission for THREE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$3,900.00) and under Ark. Code Ann. § 27-67-322 (C) the previous owner, heirs, and assigns were notified by publication with no response; and

WHEREAS, the District Engineer for District Six has determined Tract 34 is not now, nor in the foreseeable future will be, needed for highway purposes; and

WHEREAS, the market value was determined under Ark. Code Ann. § 27-67-322 (d) (2) (A) and (B) to be FOUR THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED FIFTEEN DOLLARS (\$4,815.00) as of June 5, 2025, by an appraiser licensed or certified under Arkansas Appraiser Licensing and Certification Act; and

WHEREAS, Kevin and Sandra Lloyd offered to purchase the tract for FOUR THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED FIFTEEN DOLLARS (\$4,815.00); and

WHEREAS, the legal description for the property to be released is attached in Exhibit A.

NOW THEREFORE, the above-described property is declared surplus and upon receipt and consideration of the sum of FOUR THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED FIFTEEN DOLLARS (\$4,815.00) from Kevin and Sandra Lloyd, the Chairman of the Commission is authorized and directed to execute a Quitclaim Deed conveying the right, title, interest or equity of the above-described properties to Kevin and Sandra Lloyd; and hereby releasing the same from the State Highway System, that the Right of Way Division is directed and authorized to record a copy of this Minute Order and the Quitclaim Deed in the records of Lonoke County, Arkansas; and, if necessary, the right of way shall be remonumented to reflect the boundaries designated herein. Any Federal-Aid

funds from this disposal shall be credited to Federal-Aid funds or otherwise credited as permitted by Federal Law.

2026-009

WHEREAS, the Arkansas State Highway Commission (Commission) acquired property known as Tract 91, Job 090513, from Osage Meadows, LLC, by a Declaration of Taking filed of record on July 28, 2025, in the Office of the Circuit Clerk and Ex-Officio Recorder of Benton County, Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, Tract 91 was acquired as right of way by the Commission and under Ark. Code Ann. § 27-67-322 (C) (2) the previous owner may reacquire a portion of the property at its market value at the time it is declared surplus; and

WHEREAS, the District Engineer for District Nine has determined a portion of Tract 91 is not now, nor in the foreseeable future will be, needed for highway purposes; and

WHEREAS, the market value was determined under Ark. Code Ann. § 27-67-322 (d) (2) (A) and (B) to be TWO HUNDRED FOURTEEN THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY ONE DOLLARS AND TWENTY CENTS (\$214,171.20) by two appraisers licensed or certified under Arkansas Appraiser Licensing and Certification Act; and

WHEREAS, Osage Meadows, LLC has offered to purchase the tract for TWO HUNDRED FOURTEEN THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY ONE DOLLARS AND TWENTY CENTS (\$214,171.20); and

WHEREAS, the legal description for the property to be released is attached in Exhibit A.

NOW THEREFORE, the above-described property is declared surplus and upon receipt and consideration of the sum of TWO HUNDRED FOURTEEN THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY ONE DOLLARS AND TWENTY CENTS (\$214,171.20) from Osage Meadows, LLC, the Chairman of the Commission is authorized and directed to execute a Quitclaim Deed conveying the right, title, interest or equity of the above-described properties to Osage Meadows, LLC; and hereby releasing the same from the State Highway System, that the Right of Way Division is directed and authorized to record a copy of this Minute Order and the Quitclaim Deed in the records of Benton County, Arkansas; and, if necessary, the right of way shall be remonumented to reflect

the boundaries designated herein. Any Federal-Aid funds from this disposal shall be credited to Federal-Aid funds or otherwise credited as permitted by Federal Law.

2026-010

WHEREAS, IN JACKSON COUNTY, IN THE CITY OF SWIFTON, local officials have agreed to partner with the Department to make improvements to the segment of roadway that parallels the western side of Highway 367 from south of Main Street to north of Walnut Street, also known locally as the “Swifton Bypass”; and

WHEREAS, the City has offered to accept ownership and maintenance responsibility for the Swifton Bypass, as shown on the attached sketch; and

WHEREAS, the Department will perform pavement preservation before transferring ownership to the City.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to enter into any necessary agreements with the City of Swifton and to proceed with the proposed improvements.

FURTHERMORE, upon official notification by the Chief Engineer – Preconstruction, the segment of roadway that parallels the western side of Highway 367 from south of Main Street to north of Walnut Street also locally known as the “Swifton Bypass” is to be removed from the State Highway System as shown in the attached sketch.

2026-011

WHEREAS, IN WASHINGTON AND BENTON COUNTIES, IN THE CITY OF SPRINGDALE, local officials have offered to partner with the Department for various intersection improvements in the City, as shown on the attached sketch; and

WHEREAS, the City has expressed interest in assuming ownership and maintenance responsibilities for a portion of Highway 71B and a portion of Pine Woods Road to offset the costs associated with the proposed intersection improvements, as shown on the attached sketch; and

WHEREAS, the City has offered to handle preliminary engineering, environmental documentation, right of way acquisition, and utility relocation for the proposed intersection improvements; and

WHEREAS, the City has offered to contribute \$2,000,000 toward the construction of the proposed intersection improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Department will provide up to \$25,000,000 toward the construction of the proposed intersection improvements; and

WHEREAS, if construction costs for the proposed intersection improvements exceed \$27,000,000, the additional costs will be split equally between the City and the Department; and

WHEREAS, the Department will handle all other phases of the proposed improvements.

2026-012

WHEREAS, Metroplan, the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization for Central Arkansas, has proposed a partnership with the Department to conduct a study of the Highway 100/ Highway 365 corridor from the Morgan/Maumelle interchange to the Crystal Hill Road interchange on Interstate 40; and

WHEREAS, the Highway 100/Highway 365 corridor serves as a primary access route for residents and businesses in the Cities of Maumelle and North Little Rock and has congestion and safety concerns identified in Metroplan's Regional Safety Action plan; and

WHEREAS, the proposed corridor study is intended to support transportation planning and coordination efforts along Highway 100 and Highway 365 within Pulaski County; and

WHEREAS, Metroplan will provide up to \$250,000 in federal funds, assist with project oversight and public outreach, and coordinate with Pulaski County and the Cities of Maumelle and North Little Rock; and

WHEREAS, Metroplan has requested the Department to provide non-federal matching funds.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to enter into any necessary agreements with Metroplan and utilize consultant services to conduct the proposed Highway 100/Highway 365 Corridor Study.

2026-013

WHEREAS, Interstate 57 serves as a vital north-south transportation corridor, enhancing connectivity between the Midwest and the South, stretching from Chicago, Illinois into Missouri, and ending in central Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, both the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) and the Arkansas Department of Transportation (ARDOT) are developing new location projects to complete the Interstate 57 corridor in each state; and

WHEREAS, the next segment being developed by ARDOT is from Corning, Arkansas to the Missouri-Arkansas state line; and

WHEREAS, the next segment being developed by MoDOT is from Neelyville, Missouri to the Missouri-Arkansas state line, which includes the construction of the Interstate 57 interchange at State Line Road; and

WHEREAS, MoDOT has requested to partner with ARDOT to share in the costs of the interchange; and

WHEREAS, MoDOT will be the lead state for the administration and construction of the project and will be responsible for all costs associated with the interchange work in Missouri; and

WHEREAS, ARDOT will be responsible for all costs associated with the interchange work in Arkansas.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to enter into any agreements with MoDOT necessary for the design and construction of the Interstate 57 interchange at the Missouri Arkansas state line.

2026-014

WHEREAS, IN BENTON AND WASHINGTON COUNTIES, local officials have expressed concerns about traffic volumes and recurring congestion along Interstate 49 (formerly known as Interstate 540) and the need to plan for continued growth of the region; and

WHEREAS, Minute Order 2006-062 adopted the Interstate 540 Improvement Study as a planning guide for future freeway and interchange improvements; and

WHEREAS, many of the improvements recommended by that study have been implemented; and

WHEREAS, parts of the region are growing faster than was anticipated 20 years ago and future traffic demand is expected to increase greatly as population increases.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to update the Interstate 540 Improvement Study to determine the need for and feasibility of improvements to the Interstate 49 corridor from Fayetteville to the Missouri State Line, including the evaluation of a variety of congestion management strategies.

2026-015

WHEREAS, Minute Order 2023-103 authorized a study to address the flow of truck traffic within the City of Magnolia including the feasibility of constructing a bypass; and

WHEREAS, the Western Magnolia Corridor Study has been prepared and has identified improvement alternatives within the study area.

NOW THEREFORE, this study is adopted for use as a planning guide for future improvements within the study area.

2026-016

WHEREAS, the City Council of Murfreesboro, by Resolution No. 2025-9, has requested that portions of Highway 26 and 301 within the city limits of Murfreesboro to be designated as the “Glen Campbell Memorial Highway”; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of Delight, by Resolution No. 2025-02, has requested that portions of Highways 19, 26 and 301 within the city limits of Delight to be designated as the “Glen Campbell Memorial Highway”; and

WHEREAS, the Quorum Court of Pike County, by Resolution No. 2025-4, has requested that portions of Highways 19, 26, and 301 be designated as the “Glen Campbell Memorial Highway”; and



## OTHER DISCUSSION ITEMS

McKenzie McMath Coronel, Executive Director of the Keep Arkansas (KAB) Commission presented on the Commission’s litter control and education activities and the “2026 Greatest American Cleanup”.

Patrick Patton, Chief Fiscal Officer, provided the December 2025 State Highway Revenue update. For State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2026 Budgeted vs. Actual Operating Expenses for ARDOT, overall expenses (maintenance, operations, administrative, and construction) were below budget by -14.2% (-\$14.8 million). Mr. Patton noted that State Highway Revenues to the Department from traditional sources for the year are higher than budgeted, a total of 1.8% (\$6.4 million) in SFY 2026 compared to the same period for SFY 2025. Revenue from the Natural Gas Severance Tax was higher this year compared to last year, resulting in total revenues available being 2.4% (\$8.6 million) above last year. Actual revenue received in SFY 2026 is -1.1% (\$-3.9 million) below projected (budgeted) revenue for this year. December revenue from the Amendment 101 of 2021 Sales Tax was 3.6% (\$5.0 million) above this year compared to last year.

Kevin Thornton, Chief of Administration, provided an update on State and Federal legislative activities.

Crystal Woods, Assistant Chief of Administration, provided an update on the Arkansas Legislative Council Efficiency Study Recommendations Rules for Implementation. To date, the Department has completed 88 of the 90 individual rules, bringing the Department to a 98% completion rate. Eleven of the thirteen recommendations have been fully implemented.

Jessie Jones, Chief Engineer – Preconstruction provided the bid letting update from the January 21, 2026 bid letting.

Rex Vines, Chief Engineer – Operations provided construction and maintenance activity updates. Vines also updated the Commission on the Department’s response to Winter Storm Fern.

Director Wiley updated the Commission on recent Department activities.

Josh Seagraves, Environmental Division Head, presented on the Division’s roles and responsibilities.

Director Wiley presented the Department’s goals for 2026.


Director Wiley provided a list of upcoming events.
