

2026-018

IT IS ORDERED that a meeting of the Arkansas State Highway Commission be opened at 10:00 a.m., April 1, 2026.

2026-019

WHEREAS, the Purchasing Committee has awarded purchases on February 9, February 23, and March 2, 2026, in the amounts of \$2,522,740.00, \$2,209,466.24, and \$1,056,658.53, respectively, totaling \$5,788,864.77, and supply and service contracts, in accordance with authority previously conveyed, all of which have been documented by official minutes which are of record in the files of the Commission and Equipment and Procurement Division.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the action of the Purchasing Committee be ratified and confirmed in all particulars.

2026-020

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Department to provide timely studies and develop projects to address safety needs; and

WHEREAS, the Department's on-call safety studies services contracts have been an effective method of providing additional expertise and supplementing in-house capabilities; and

WHEREAS, the current on-call safety studies contracts expire in 2026.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to request proposals, select consultant engineering firms qualified to perform safety studies and engineering services and enter into any necessary contracts as needs are identified for a term of three years with the option to extend.

2026-021

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Department to provide prompt architecture services necessary for upgrading or replacing some building facilities as they reach or exceed their expected life span; and

WHEREAS, the Department's on-call architecture services contracts have been an effective method of providing added expertise and supplementing in-house capabilities; and

WHEREAS, the current on-call architecture contracts expire in 2026.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to request proposals, select consultant firms and adhere to any necessary contracts as needs are identified for a term of three years with the option to extend.

2026-022

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Department to provide timely review and approval of each architectural and engineering consultant's Certified Public Accountant (CPA) audited overhead cost rate to ensure compliance with the Federal Acquisition Regulation; and

WHEREAS, the Department's on-call CPA services contracts have been an effective method of providing additional expertise and supplementing in-house capabilities; and

WHEREAS, the current on-call CPA contracts expire in 2026.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to request proposals, select Certified Public Accounting firms to perform reviews of overhead cost rates and enter into any necessary contracts as needs are identified for a term of three years with the option to extend.

2026-023

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Department to provide timely project management services for alternative delivery projects in order to proceed with construction; and

WHEREAS, the Department's on-call contracts have been an effective method of providing timely and efficient project management services and supplementing in-house capabilities; and

WHEREAS, the current on-call alternative delivery contracts expire in 2026.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to request and evaluate proposals and enter into necessary contracts and agreements with firms for on-call alternative delivery services as needs are identified for a term of three years with the option to extend.

2026-024

WHEREAS, the 95th General Assembly of the State of Arkansas enacted Act 256 during the 2025 Regular Session, which amended Arkansas Code Annotated § 27-35-301 concerning the definition of a manufactured home unit; and

WHEREAS, the 95th General Assembly of the State of Arkansas enacted Act 700 during the 2025 Regular Session, which amended Arkansas Code Annotated § 27-35-210 concerning the issuance of a permit for special cargo transported by a farm machinery equipment hauler; and

WHEREAS, as authorized by Arkansas Code Annotated § 27-65-107, the attached rules for issuing permits for oversize and overweight vehicles shall be promulgated.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to issue the attached rules for public comment and to promulgate the attached rules in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act including submission to the Arkansas Legislative Council.

2026-025

WHEREAS, the 95th General Assembly of the State of Arkansas enacted Act 668 during the 2025 Regular Session, which amended Arkansas Code

Annotated § 12-12-1802 through 1805, concerning the use of license plate readers in Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, Act 668 of 2025 requires the attached rules for the use of license plate readers to be promulgated.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to issue the attached rules for public comment and to promulgate the attached rules in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act including submission to the Arkansas Legislative Council.

2026-026

WHEREAS, the 95th General Assembly of the State of Arkansas enacted Act 699 during the 2025 Regular Session, which created Arkansas Code Annotated 27-67-325 and 326 regarding the Rules for Utility Accommodation; and

WHEREAS, Act 699 of 2025 requires the attached rules for utility accommodation to be promulgated.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to issue the attached rules for public comment and to promulgate the attached rules in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act including submission to the Arkansas Legislative Council.

2026-027

WHEREAS, Arkansas Code §27-51-1302 prohibits the stopping of motor vehicles on the shoulder, median, ramps, and all other highway right of way along Interstates or fully controlled access highways, except in designated parking areas or for a brief duration due to an emergency, vehicle disablement, or to correct or avert an unsafe condition; and

WHEREAS, this prohibition was enacted by the Arkansas State Legislature with Act 997 of 2007 in response to concerns about roadway safety; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Transportation has identified a nationwide shortage of truck parking and that truck parking shortages are a national safety concern; and

WHEREAS, the Department has identified additional truck parking needs along Interstate 30 between Texarkana and Malvern through overnight truck parking surveys.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to identify an appropriate location, acquire the necessary property, and construct a public truck parking facility along Interstate 30 as funds become available.

2026-028

WHEREAS, the Arkansas State Highway Commission (Commission) owns property in Ashley County, Arkansas, acquired in 1960 from Mrs. W. J. Austin, widow, and Maysel A. Tucker, Mary A. Tumblison and Geraldine A. Parkerson, constituting the sole and only heirs at law of W. J. Austin, now deceased, by fee; and

WHEREAS, this property is currently classified as capital asset, contiguous to U.S. Highway 82 in Ashley County and is now necessary for Job No. 020770, Hamburg – East (Widening) (S), as right of way; and

WHEREAS, the legal description for the property to be transferred is attached in Exhibit A.

NOW THEREFORE, the character of the above described property is hereby changed from capital asset to that of right of way, hereafter designated as Tract No. 60X, Job No 020770; a copy of this Minute Order shall, if required, be recorded in the Circuit Clerk and Recorder's office of Ashley County, Arkansas, and the right of way shall, if necessary be remonumented.

2026-029

WHEREAS, IN IZARD COUNTY, local officials have requested to partner with the Department to make improvements to LaCrosse Road; and

WHEREAS, the County has offered to accept ownership and maintenance responsibility for Highway 289 and Highway 69 Business, as shown on the attached sketch; and

WHEREAS, in turn, the Department will add LaCrosse Road to the State Highway System from Highway 69 to Highway 56, as shown on the attached sketch, and perform any necessary improvements.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to enter into any necessary agreements with IZARD County and to proceed with the proposed improvements.

FURTHERMORE, upon official notification by the Chief Engineer – Preconstruction, the following changes will be made to the State Highway System as shown on the attached sketch.

- Highway 289, Section 1 from Highway 69, Section 1B to the end of State Maintenance in Zion is to be removed from the State Highway System.
- Highway 69, Section 1B is to be removed from the State Highway System.
- LaCrosse Road from Highway 69, Section 1 to Highway 56, Section 2 will be added to the State Highway System.

2026-030

WHEREAS, IN WHITE COUNTY, IN THE CITY OF BEEBE, local officials have requested to partner with the Department to make improvements to the intersection of Highway 367 (Dewitt Henry Drive) and Highway 67 Business (Center Street)/Highway 31 (Main Street); and

WHEREAS, the City has offered to accept ownership and maintenance responsibility for Highway 67 Business (Center Street) from Highway 367 (Dewitt Henry Drive) to Highway 31 (Main Street) and Highway 367 Spur (Pecan Street) from Highway 367 (Dewitt Henry Drive) to the Interstate 57 interchange ramps, as shown on the attached sketch; and

WHEREAS, the City has requested that the Department handle all phases and costs associated with the intersection improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Department will perform pavement preservation on Highway 67 Business (Center Street) before transferring ownership to the City.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to enter into any necessary agreements with the City of Beebe and to proceed with the proposed improvements.

FURTHERMORE, upon official notification by the Chief Engineer – Preconstruction, the following changes will be made to the State Highway System as shown on the attached sketch.

- The portion of Highway 67, Section 12B (Center Street) from Highway 367 (Dewitt Henry Drive) to Highway 31 (Main Street) is to be removed from the State Highway System.
- The portion of Highway 367, Section 15S (Pecan Street) from Highway 367 (Dewitt Henry Drive) to the Interstate 57 interchange ramps is to be removed from the State Highway System.

2026-031

WHEREAS IN PULASKI COUNTY, IN THE CITY OF LITTLE ROCK, opportunities have been identified for the redevelopment of green spaces on Arkansas State Highway Commission owned property created by the Department's completion of safety, reconstruction, mobility, and modernization improvements to Interstate 30, known as 30 Crossing; and

WHEREAS, since the inception of 30 Crossing, the Department has agreed to allow the use of portions of the lands shown in Exhibit "A" as the area of the proposed green space redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the proposed green space redevelopment will not interfere with the public use of the property for highway uses; and

WHEREAS, the development partners will be responsible for all phases of the proposed green space redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the Department will transfer maintenance of the proposed green space redevelopment once construction commences; and

WHEREAS, all costs associated with the proposed green space redevelopment will be the responsibility of the development partners; and

WHEREAS, the Department will allow the use of the Department's on-call consultant services to assist with the proposed green space redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the Department is agreeable to act as a pass-through entity for Federal or State grants that could be used for the proposed green space redevelopment.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to enter into any necessary agreements for the implementation of the proposed green space redevelopment.

2026-032

WHEREAS, the City Council of Texarkana, by Resolution No. 2026-13, has requested that a section of Highway 67 beginning at Locust Street and extending east on Highway 82 to the city limits of Texarkana to be designated as the “Staff Sergeant Denver “Bull” Randleman Memorial Highway”; and

WHEREAS, the Arkansas Highway Commission has adopted guidelines for the installation of commemorative signs by Minute Order 2014-023, and this request meets these guidelines.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to permit the installation of signs at each end of this section of Highway 82, as requested by the City, in accordance with Commission Policy.

2026-033

WHEREAS, the City Council of Prescott, by Resolution No. 1 of 2026, has requested that a section of Highway 67 from West Main Street south to the city limits of Prescott to be named as the “Cody Kisselburg Memorial Highway”; and

WHEREAS, the Arkansas Highway Commission has adopted guidelines for the installation of commemorative signs by Minute Order 2014-023, and this request meets these guidelines.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to permit the installation of signs at each end of this section of Highway 67, as requested by the City, in accordance with Commission Policy.

2026-034

WHEREAS, through Minute Order 2022-025, the Arkansas Highway Commission reserved the naming rights for the Interstate 49 Corridor from the U.S. Highway 71 Interchange to the Missouri state line, commonly known as the Bella Vista Bypass; and

WHEREAS, William “Asa” Hutchinson II has had a long and distinguished career of public service having served as a United States Attorney for the Western District of Arkansas, Representative for Arkansas’ Third Congressional District, Administrator of the Drug Enforcement Administration, and as the 46th Governor of the State of Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, Governor Hutchinson’s leadership was a catalyst for increased funding for much-needed highway improvements statewide through his establishment of a working group for highway funding that led to the passage of Act 416 of 2019 and Amendment 101 in 2020; and

WHEREAS, during Governor Hutchinson’s tenure, the completion of the Interstate 49 Corridor in Northwest Arkansas created a continuous connection between Kansas City, Missouri and Alma, Arkansas.

NOW THEREFORE, considering the distinguished service of Governor Hutchinson and support to the Arkansas Highway Commission as well as the importance of the continuation of Interstate 49 in Northwest Arkansas for the State Highway System, the Highway Commission hereby honors former Governor Hutchinson by officially naming the Bella Vista Bypass as the “Governor Asa Hutchinson Freeway”.

Chairman Taldo opened the meeting with the reciting of the Pledge of Allegiance, followed by a welcome to those in attendance in-person and to those watching online.

MOTIONS

MOTION Vice Chairman Keith Gibson moved, Commissioner Marie Holder seconded, and the motion passed to approve the Minutes from the Commission Meeting February 11, 2026.

MOTION The Commission approved Minute Order 2025-033 on June 18, 2025, authorizing the Department to request letters of interest, select consulting firms, and enter into any necessary contracts with firms to perform bridge inspection services in accordance with state and federal laws. Commissioner Jerry Halsey moved, Vice Chairman Keith Gibson seconded, and the motion passed to approve the staff’s recommendation to enter into negotiations with the following firms to provide on-call bridge inspection services:

- Bureau Veritas North America, Inc. – Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania
- Burgess & Niple, Inc. – Columbus, Ohio
- Engineering Operations, LLC – Littleton, Colorado

- Garver, LLC – North Little Rock, Arkansas
- Michael Baker International, Inc. – Little Rock, Arkansas
- Modjeski and Masters, Inc. – New Orleans, Louisiana
- Volkert, Inc. – Little Rock, Arkansas

MOTION

Vice Chairman Keith Gibson moved, Commissioner Jerry Halsey seconded, and the motion passed to authorize the Director to submit grant applications for the following four grant programs and projects:

- Multimodal Project Discretionary Grant (MPDG) Program
 - Interstate 49 extension project from Highway 22-I-40
- Infrastructure for Rebuilding America (INFRA) Grant Program
 - Interstate 49 rest area truck parking facility
- Promoting Resilience Operations for Transformative, Efficient, and Cost-saving Transportation (PROTECT) Grant Program
 - Interstate 55 Kings’ Crossing Bridge
- Railroad Crossing Elimination Grant Program
 - Highway 82 east of Buckner (Columbia County) UPRR grade separation

OTHER DISCUSSION ITEMS

Patrick Patton, Chief Fiscal Officer, provided the February 2026 State Highway Revenue update. For State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2026 Budgeted vs. Actual Operating Expenses for ARDOT, overall expenses (maintenance, operations, administrative, and construction) were below budget by -16.5% (-\$22.9 million). Mr. Patton noted that State Highway Revenues to the Department from traditional sources for the year are higher than budgeted, a total of 1.4% (\$6.5 million) in SFY 2026 compared to the same period for SFY 2025. Revenue from the Natural Gas Severance Tax was higher this year compared to last year, resulting in total revenues available being 2.2% (\$10.2 million) above last year. Actual revenue received in SFY 2026 is -1.1% (\$-5.5 million) below projected (budgeted) revenue for this year. February revenue from the Amendment 101 of 2021 Sales Tax was 2.8% (\$5.2 million) above this year compared to last year.

Kevin Thornton, Chief of Administration, provided an update on State and Federal legislative activities.

Crystal Woods, Assistant Chief of Administration, provided an update on the Arkansas Legislative Council Efficiency Study Recommendations Rules for Implementation. Woods noted that all 90 individual rules have been addressed and the rules implementation was considered complete.

Steve Frisbee, Assistant Chief Engineer – Maintenance provided a demonstration of the newly implemented Maintenance Dashboard on the ARDOT website.

Jessie Jones, Chief Engineer – Preconstruction provided the bid letting update from the March 4, 2026 bid letting.

Rex Vines, Chief Engineer – Operations provided construction and maintenance activity updates.

Director Wiley updated the Commission on recent Department activities.

Paul Tinsley, Division Head of the Materials Division, presented on the Division's roles and responsibilities.

Director Wiley provided a list of upcoming events.

Director Wiley announced the launch of the Adopt-a-Highway interactive map which allows the public a streamlined process for identifying opportunities and requesting to adopt a portion of Arkansas Highways for litter pickup.

Director Wiley also notified the Commission of four awards the Department recently received at the American Council of Engineering Companies (ACEC) of Arkansas Gala on March 4:

- Engineering Excellence Award Category A – Studies
 - Presented to ARDOT for Garver's work on the Construction Project Dashboard on the ARDOT website
- Engineering Excellence Award
 - Presented to ARDOT for Garver and Kiewit Infrastructure South Company's work on the scour repair of the Fourche Creek Bridge
- Grand Conceptor Award and Engineering Excellence Award Category H – Transportation
 - Presented to ARDOT for Burns & McDonnell and Kiewit-Massman Construction's design-build work on the 30 Crossing Project



In closing, Director Wiley recognized Chairman Philip Taldo, who was recently honored by the Northwest Arkansas Airport (XNA) Commission's passing of a resolution to name the XNA Connector after Chairman Taldo.
