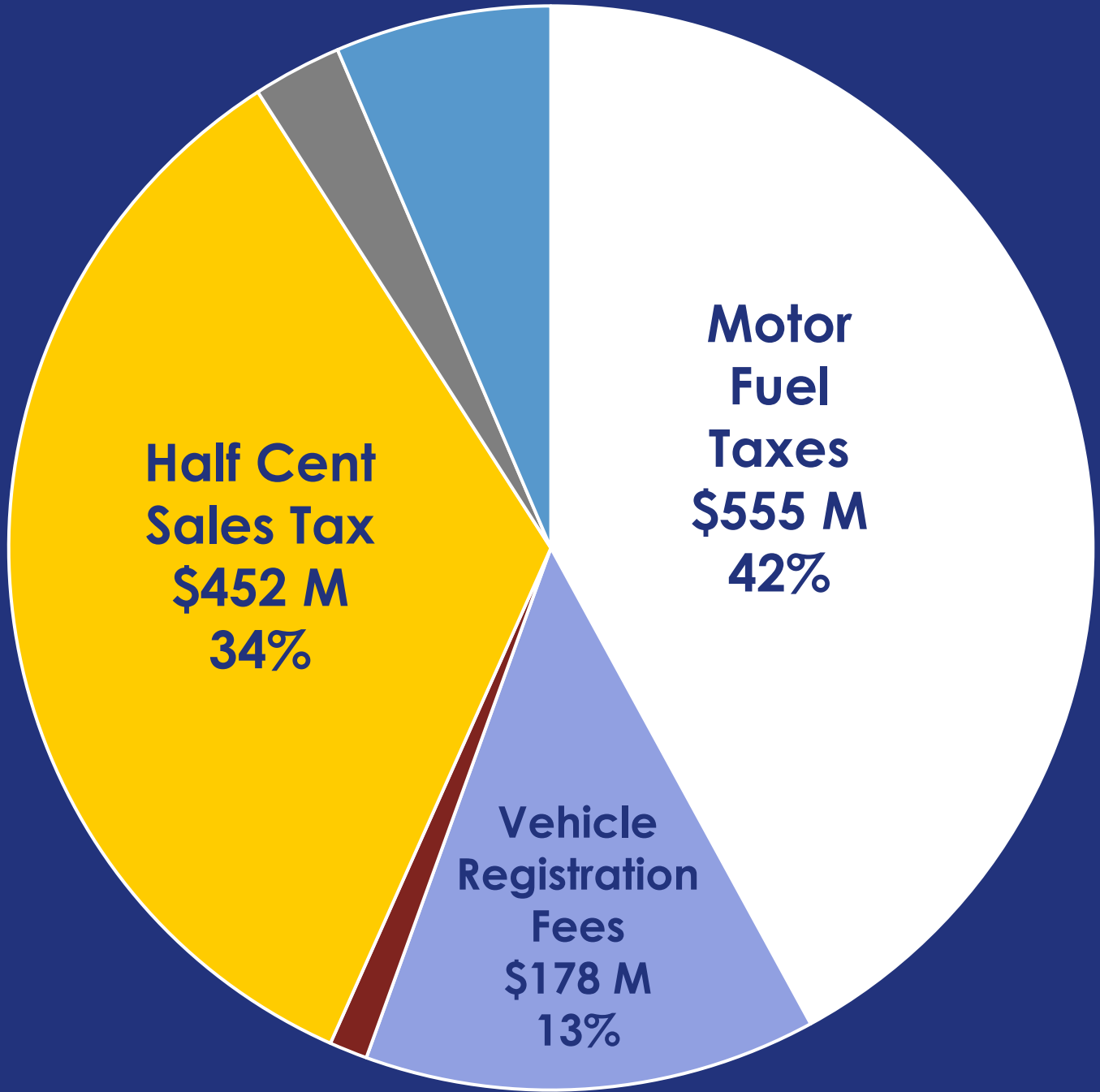

Average for State Fiscal Years 2027 - 2028**



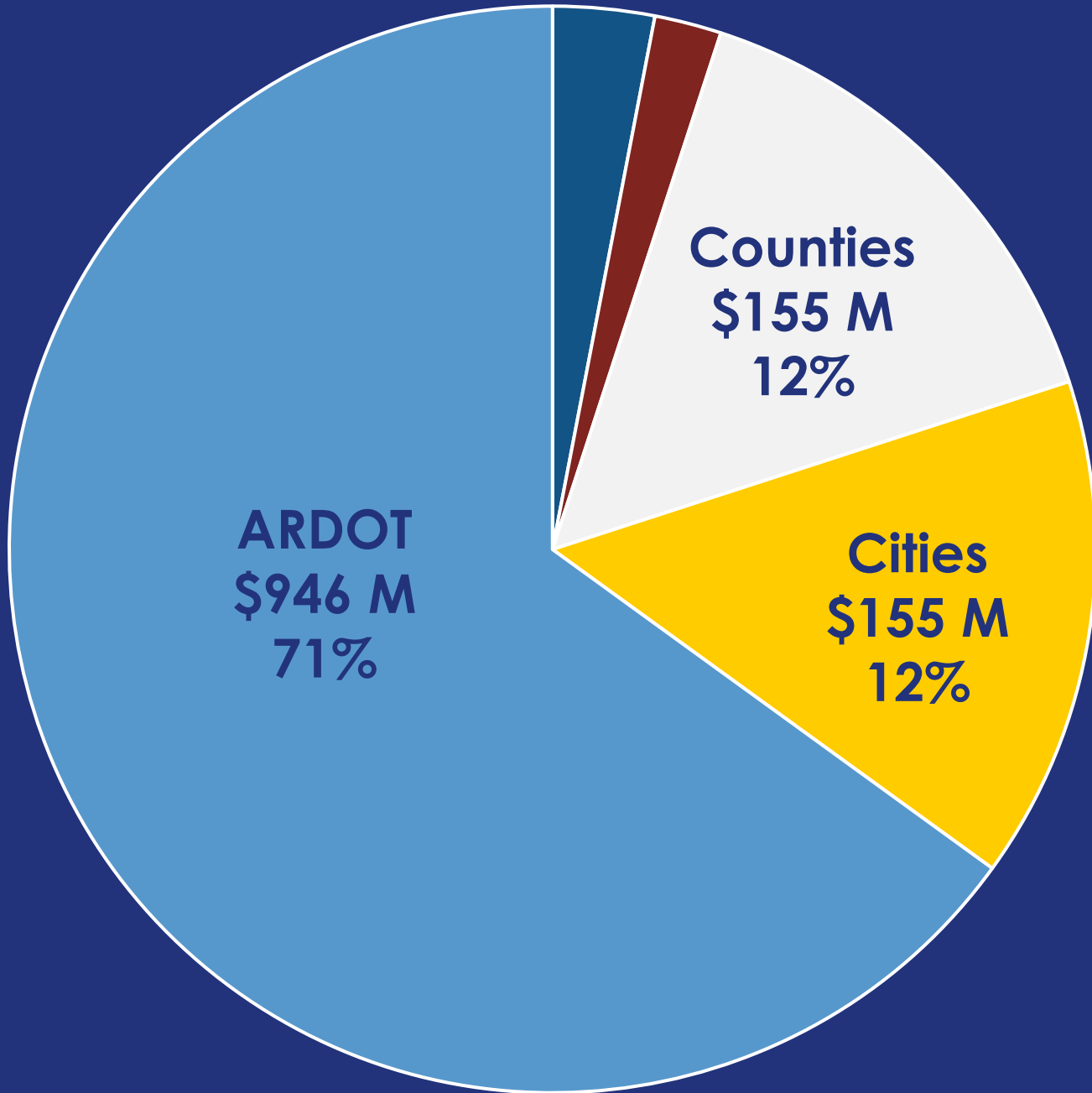

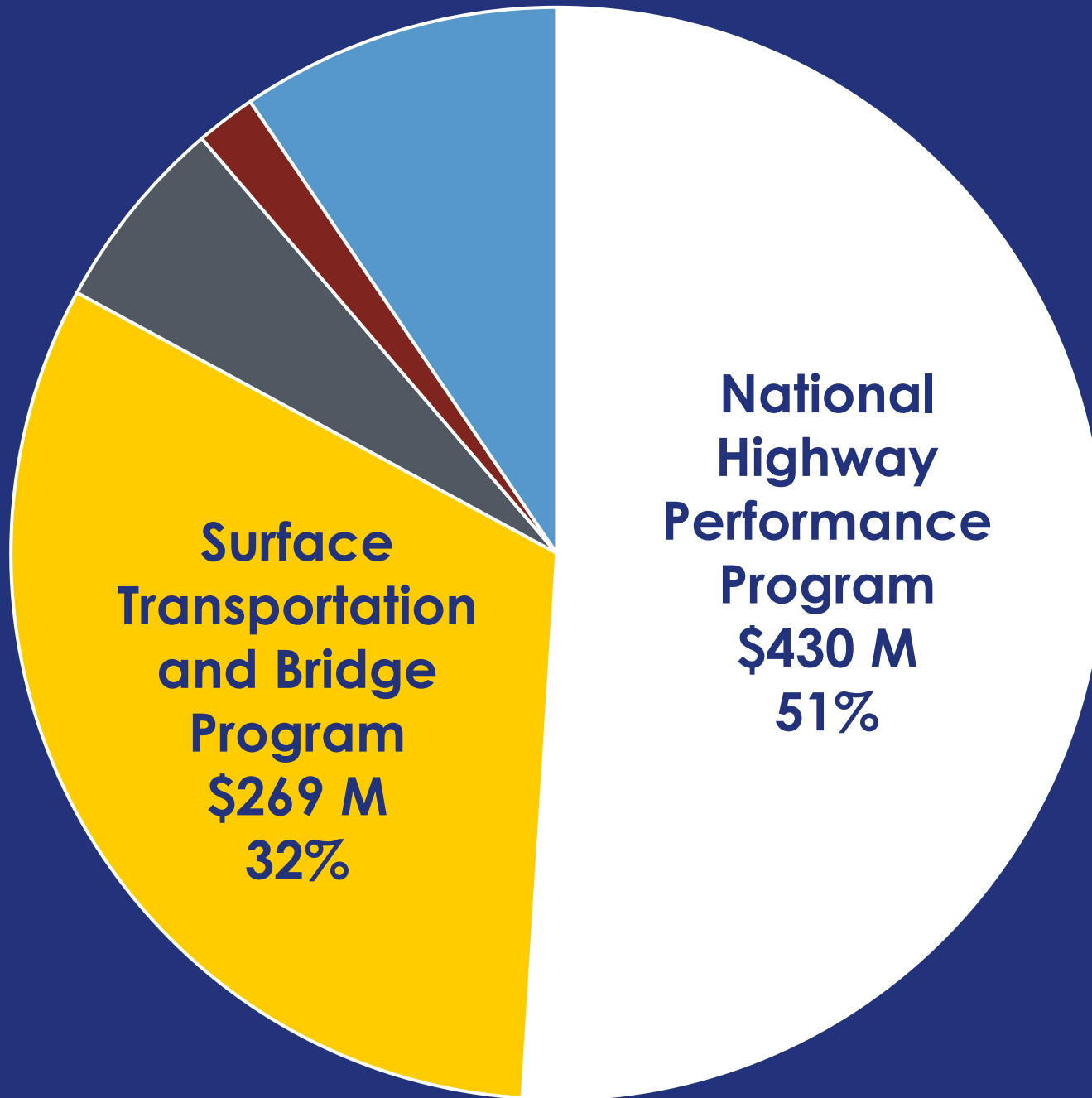

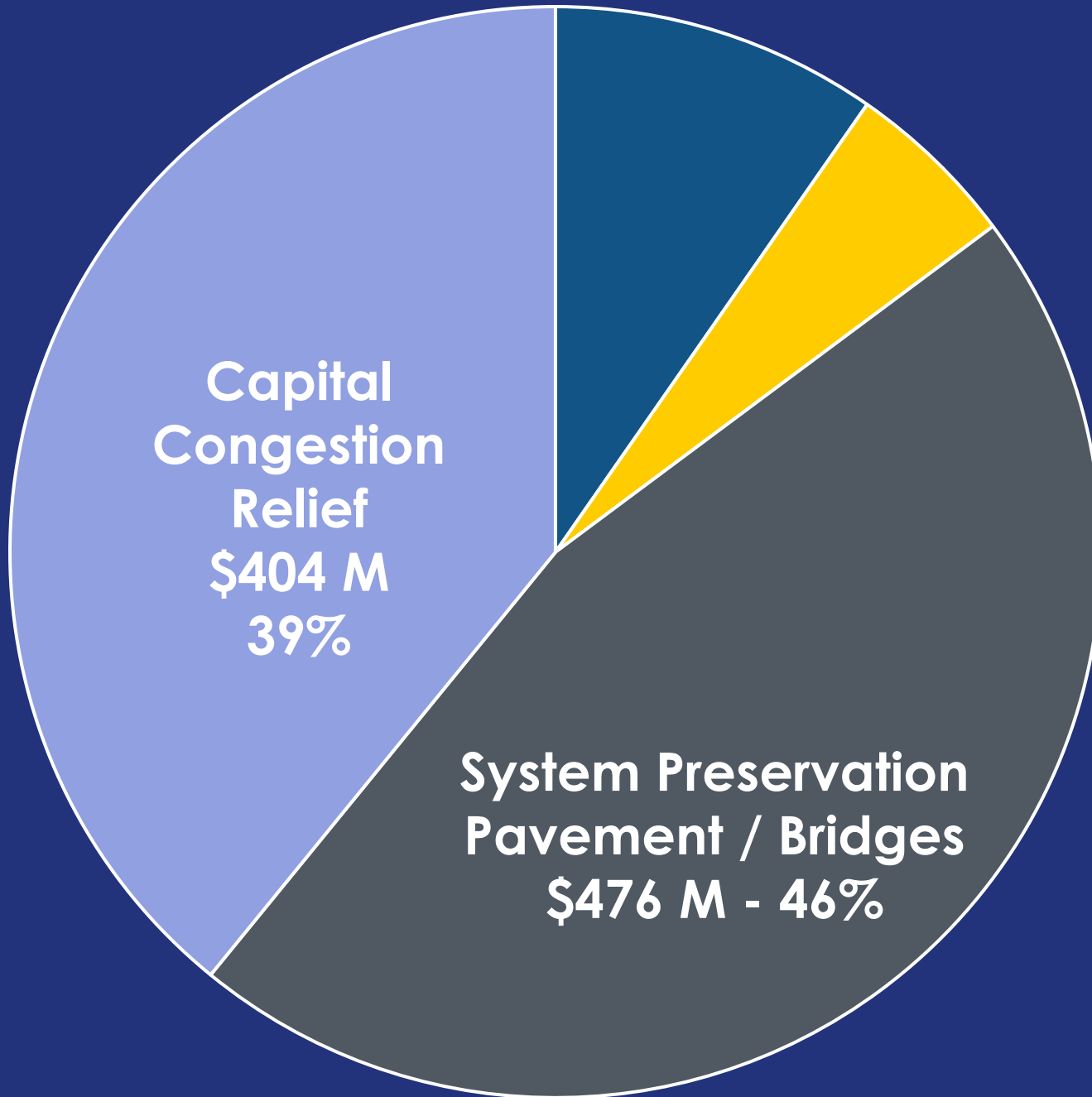

## SEBASTIAN COUNTY



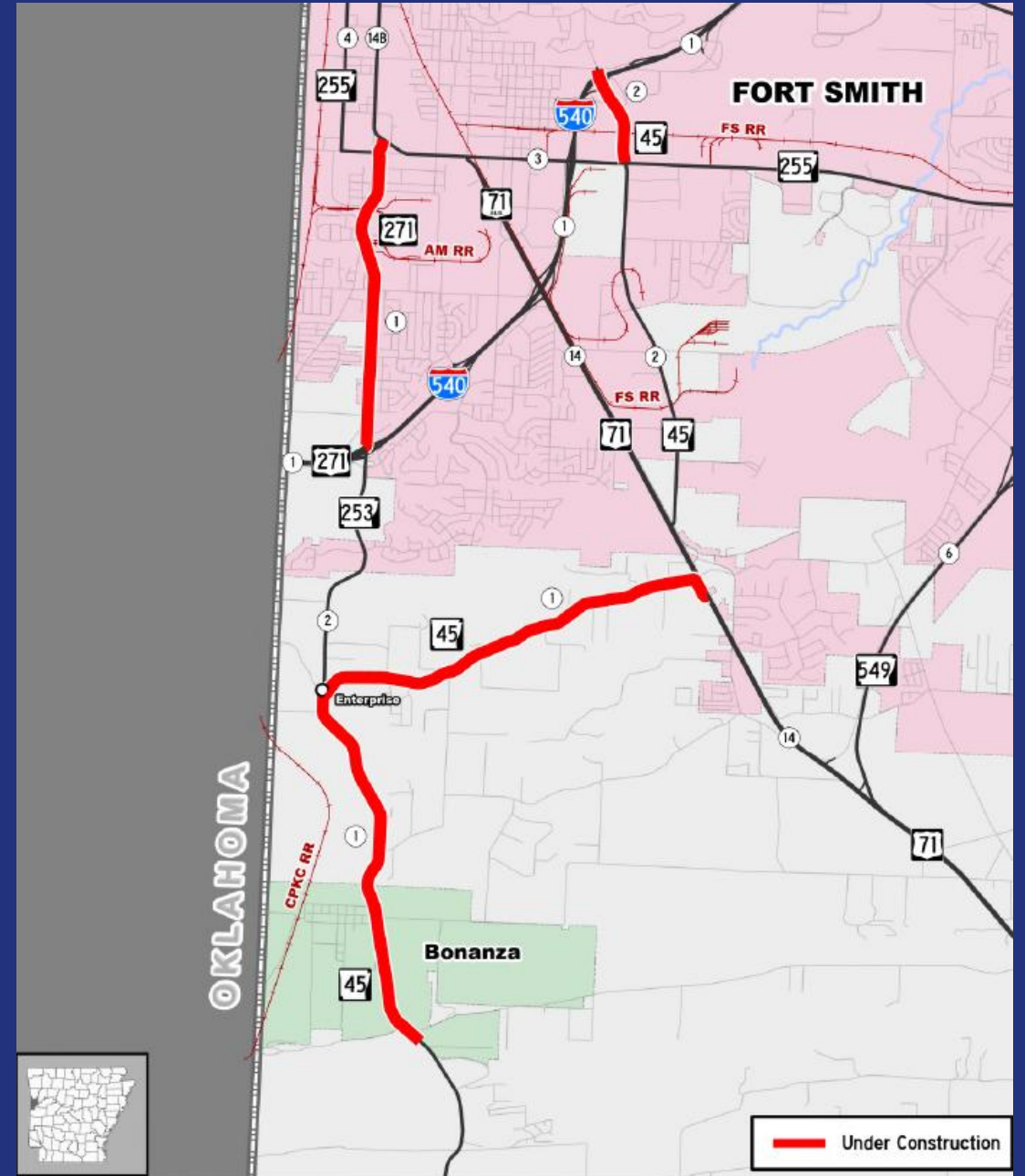
- **Objective:** Resurface 9 miles of Midland Blvd. and Garrison Ave./Rogers Ave.

- **Estimated Completion:** Late 2025

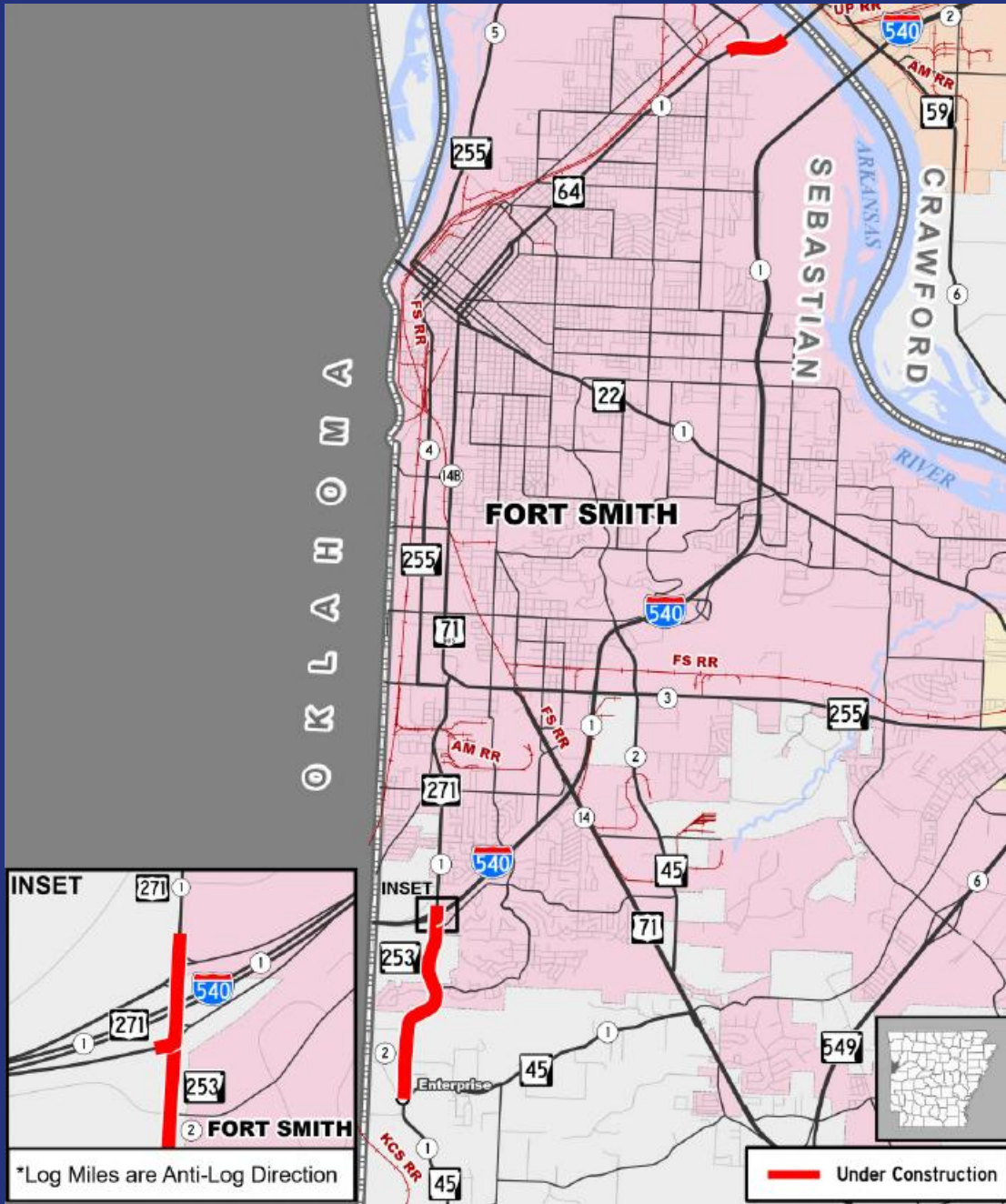


# HIGHWAYS 45 & 271

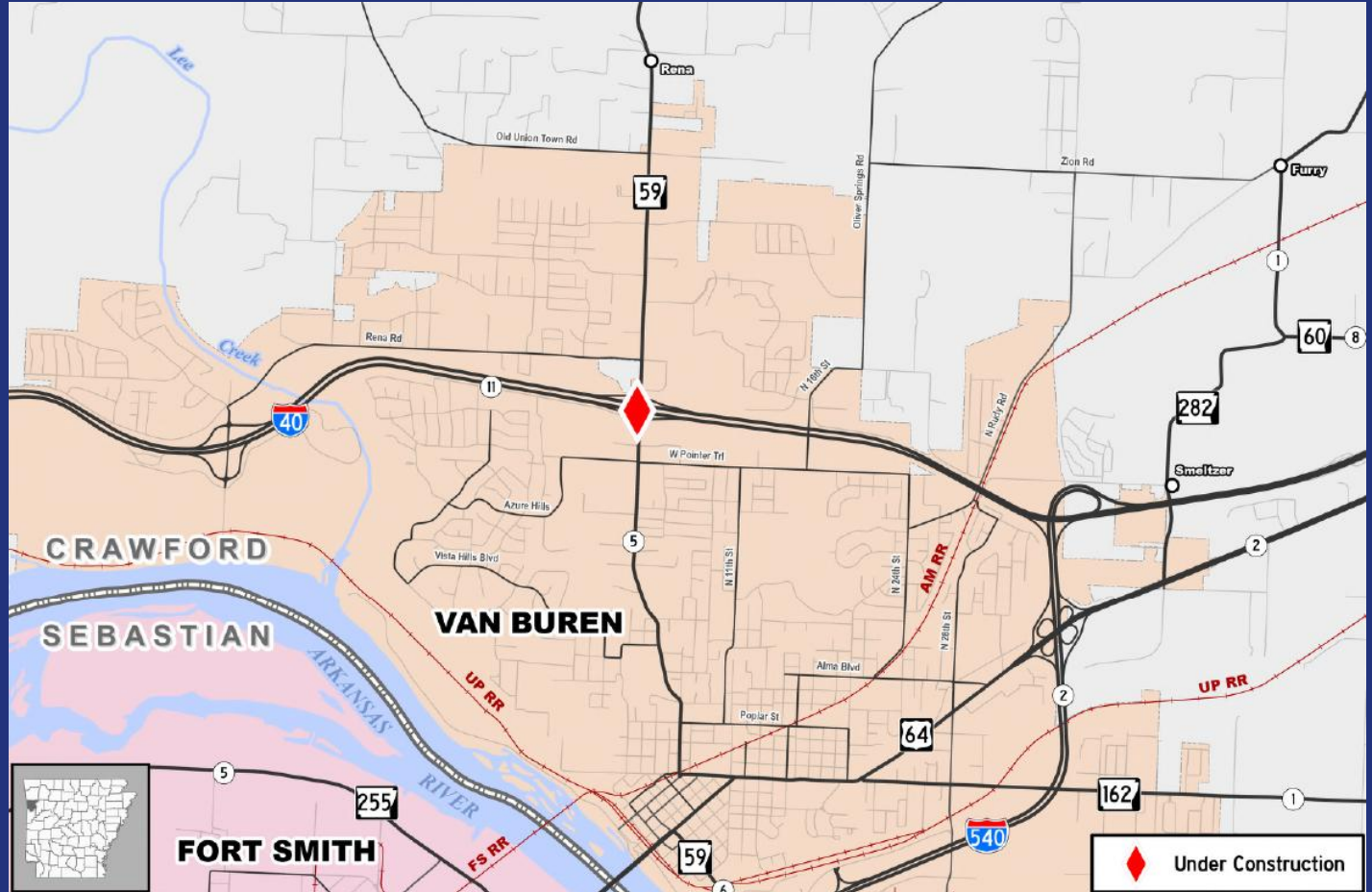
- **Objective:** Resurface 3 miles of Highways 64, 253 & 271

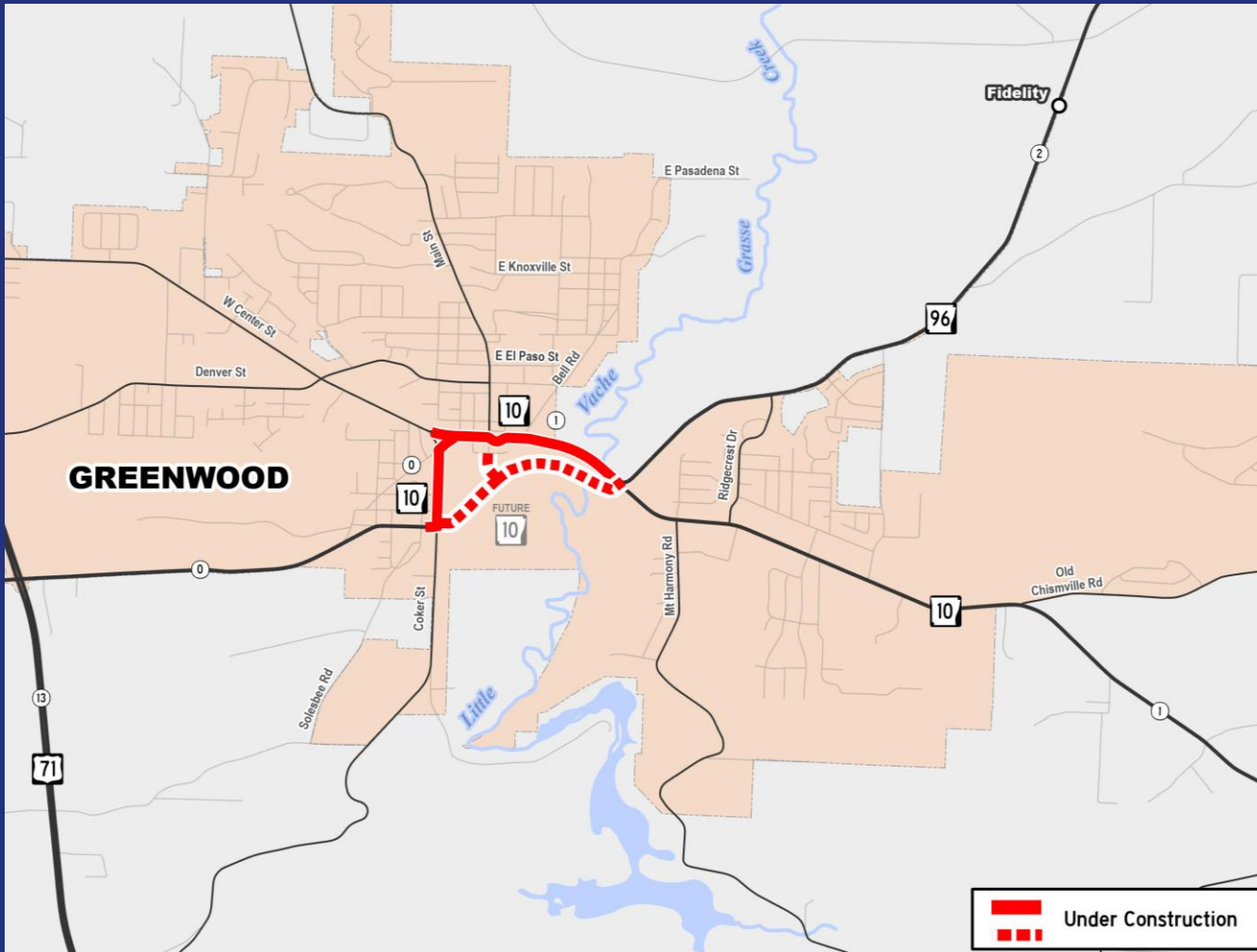

## PHASE 1 | SEBASTIAN COUNTY



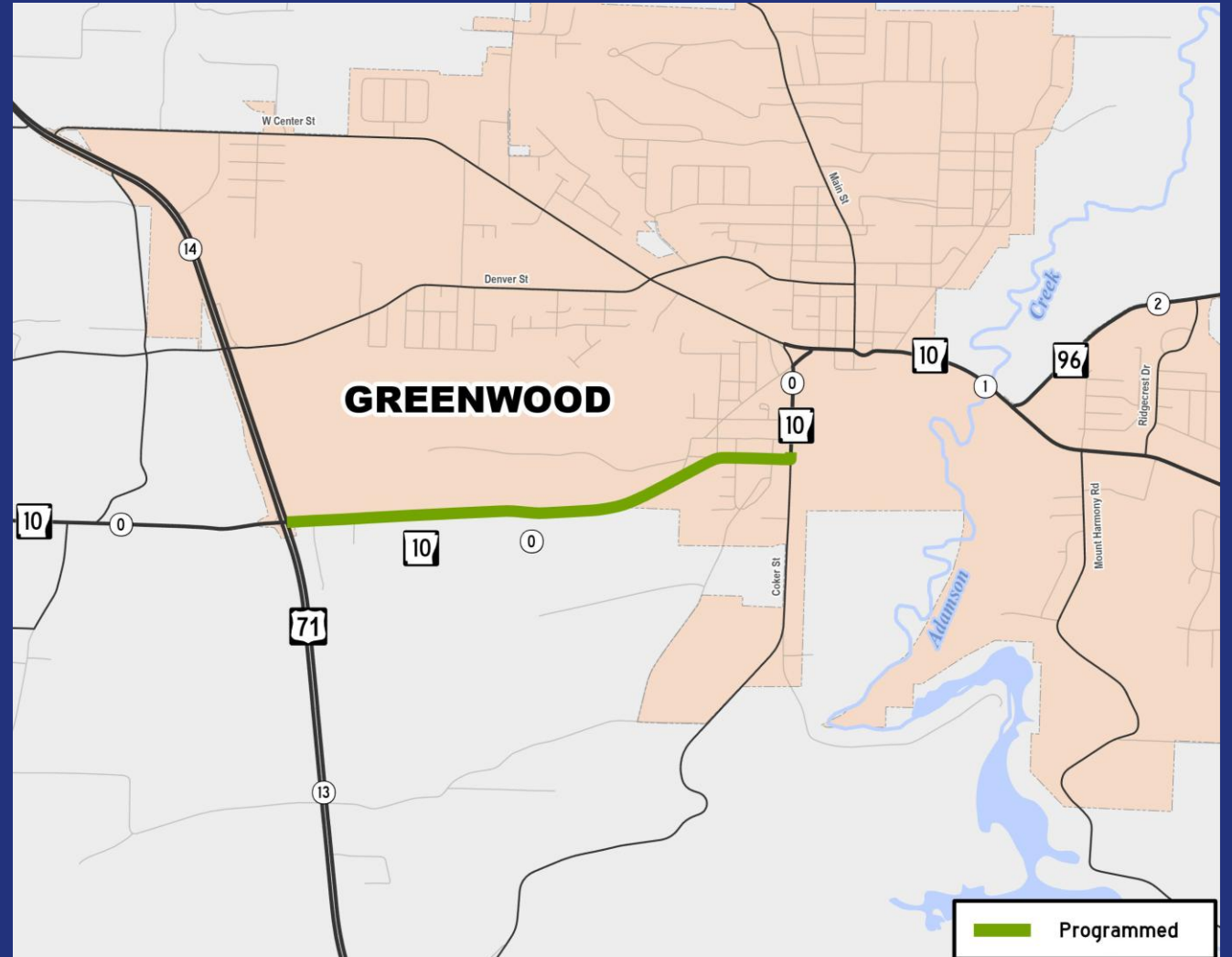
- **Objective:** Improve existing portions of Highway 10 and construct new road for the bypass
- **Awarded:** Forsgren, Mobley Construction, and Manhattan Road & Bridge, Joint Venture for \$58.0 million
- **Estimated Completion:** Late 2026
- **Partnering:** City of Greenwood

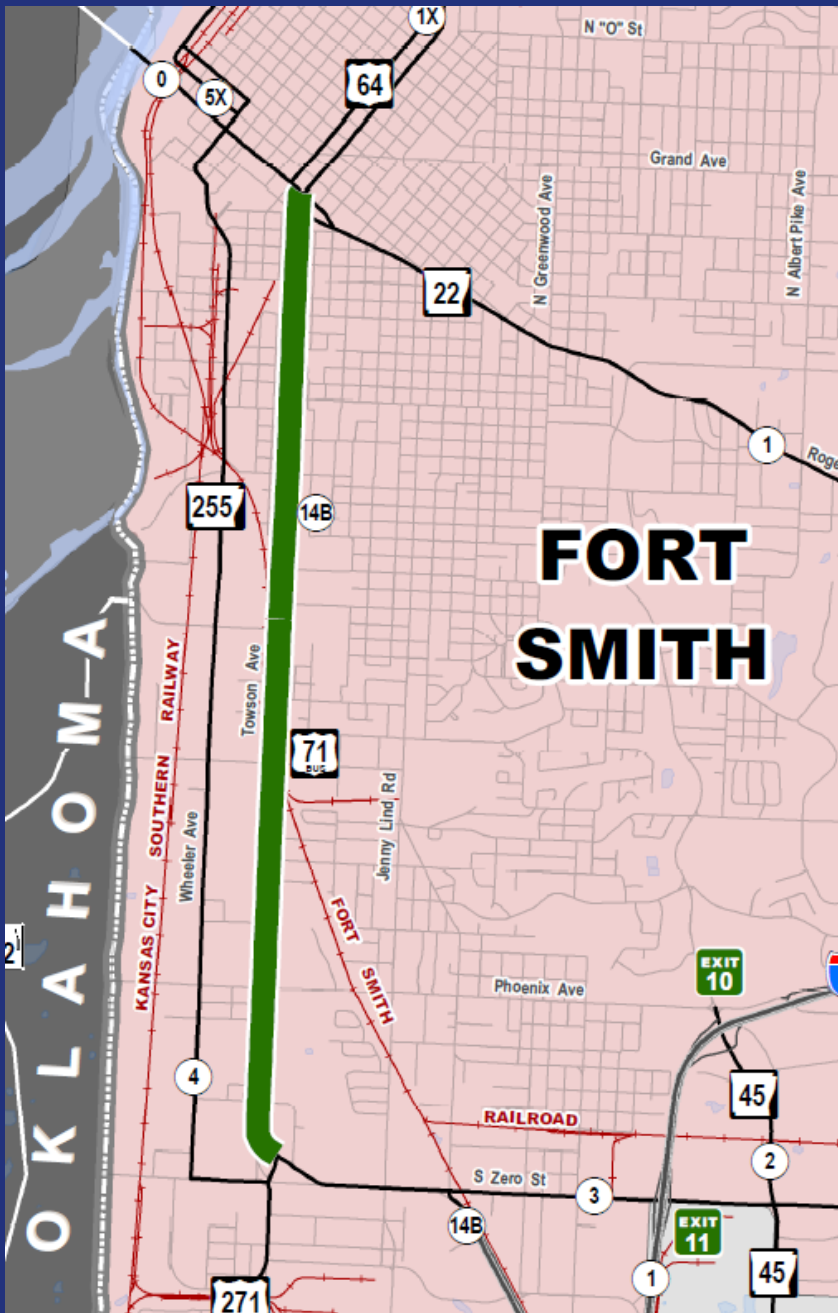


# HIGHWAY 10 | GREENWOOD BYPASS

- **Objective:** Widen 2 miles of Highway 10 from 2 to 5 lanes

### SEBASTIAN COUNTY

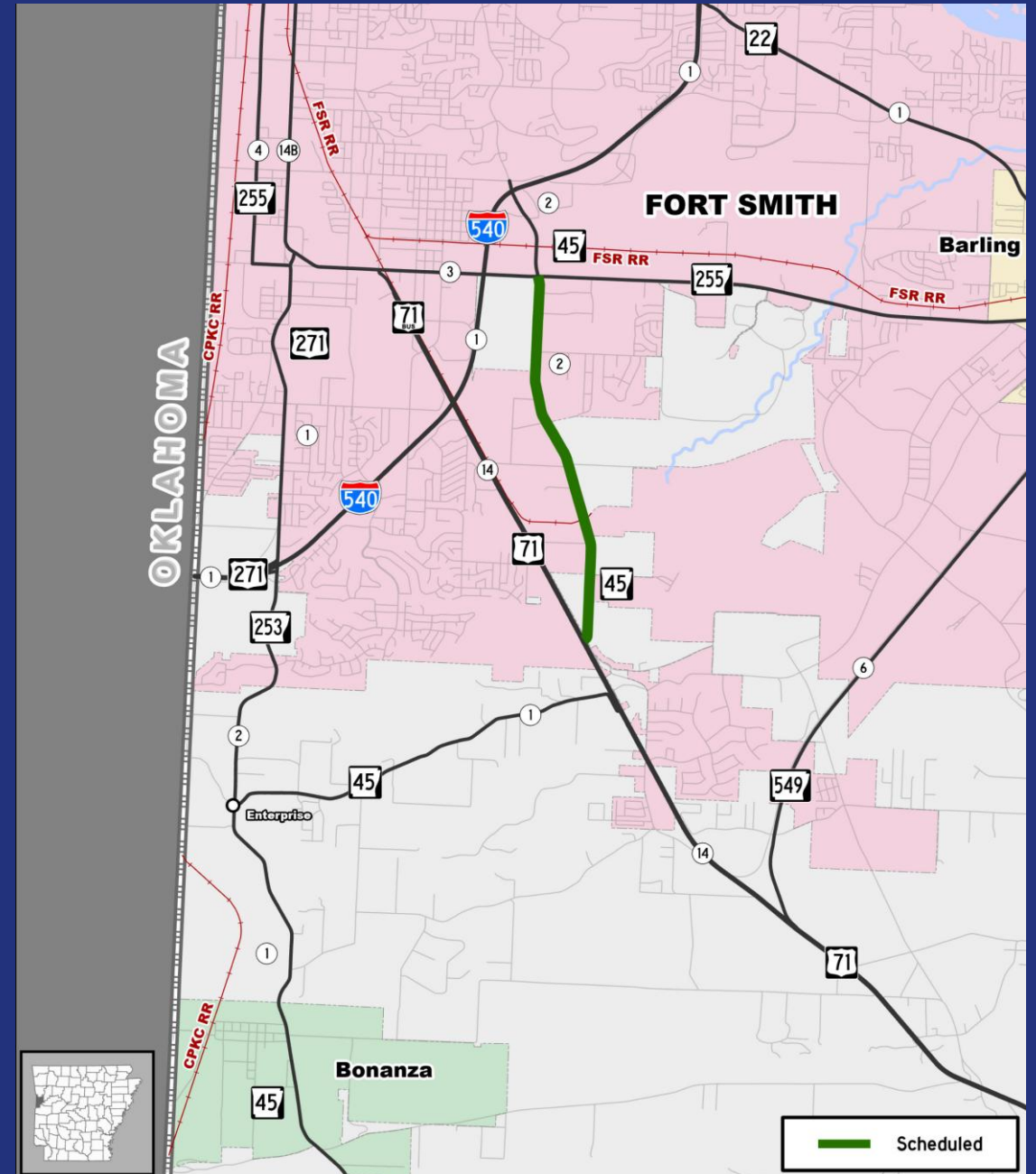
- **Objective:** Resurface 4 miles of Highway 71B and make drainage & sidewalk improvements

## SEBASTIAN COUNTY

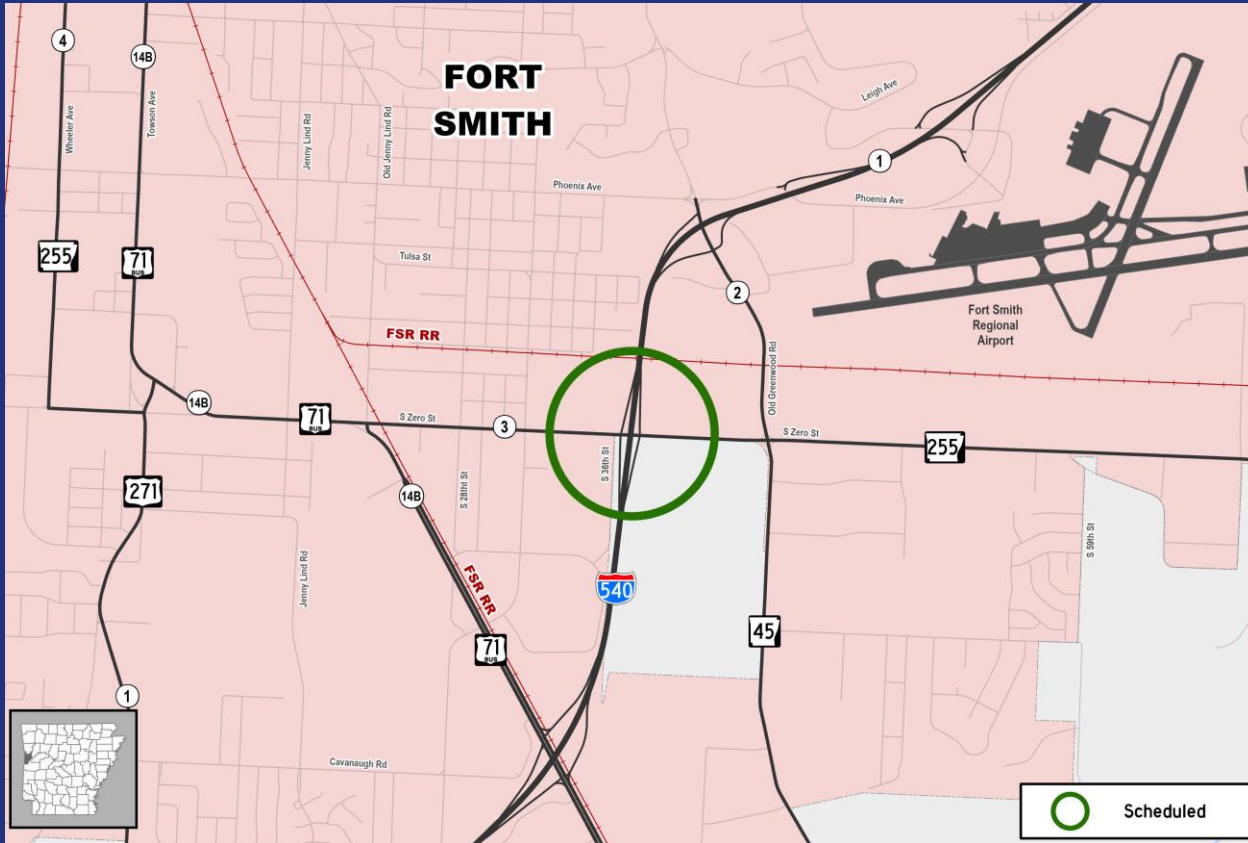
- **Objective:** Widen Highway 45 from 2 lanes to 5 lanes for 3 miles, realign an intersection & add a shared use path
- **Estimated Cost:** \$20-30 million

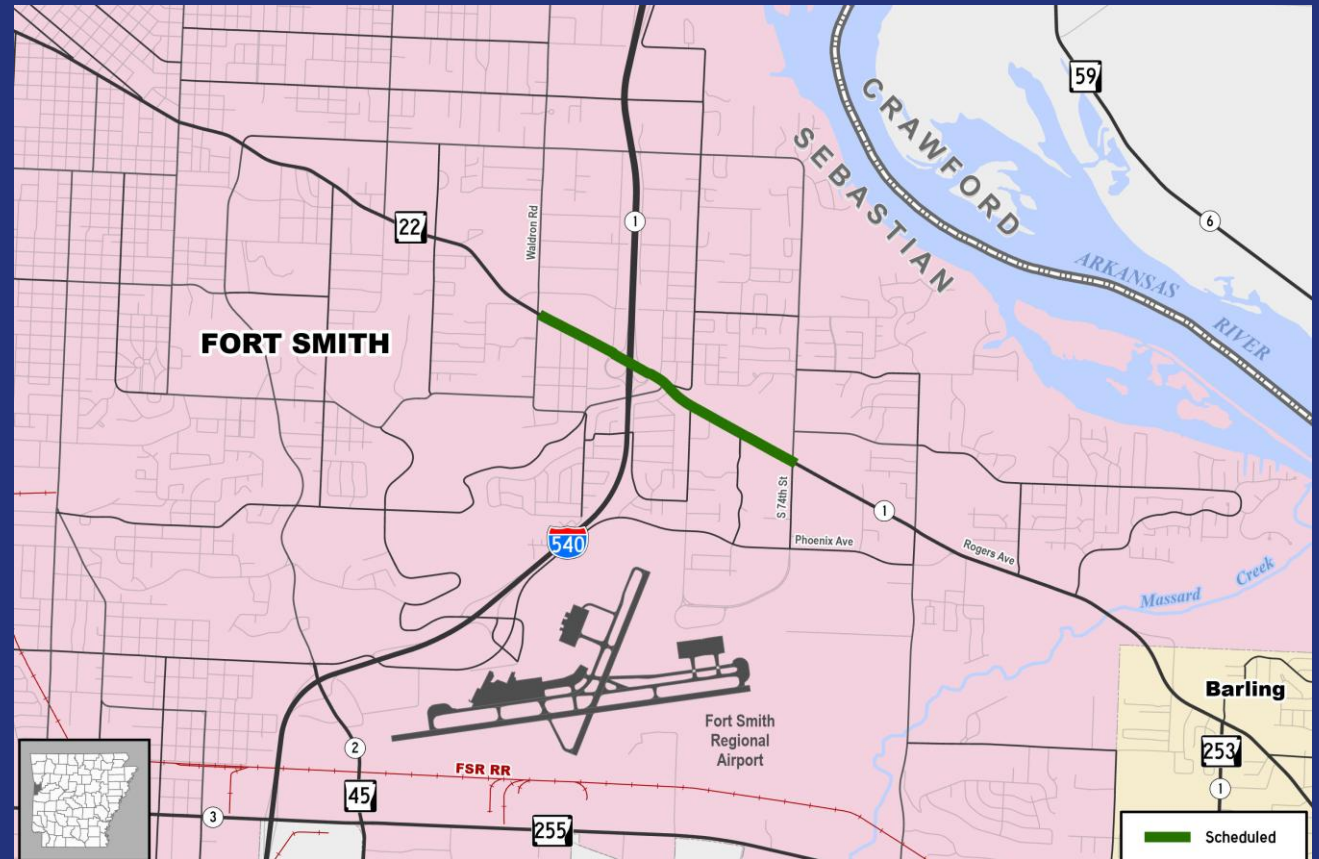


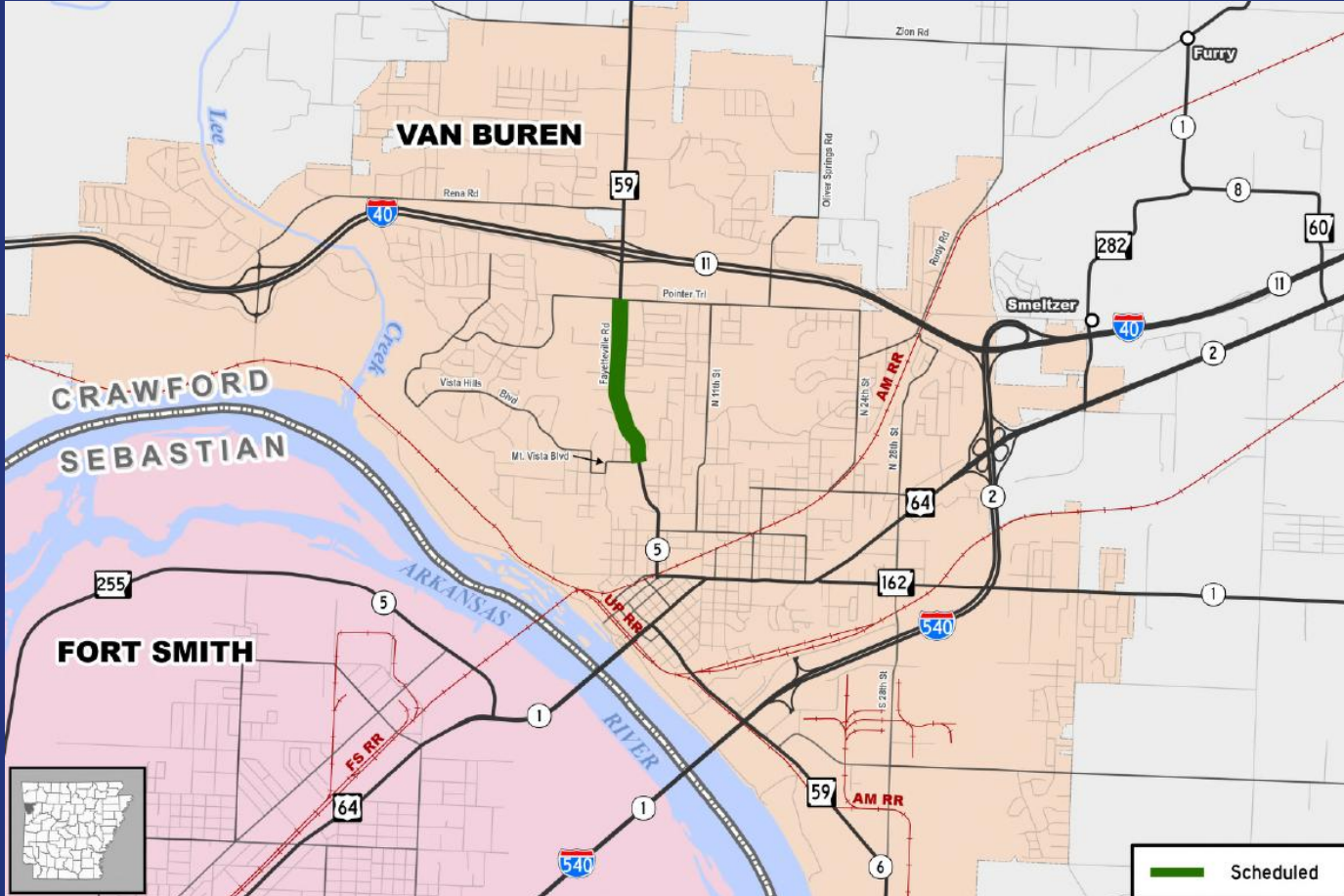
- **Objective:** Construct interchange improvements

## CRAWFORD COUNTY

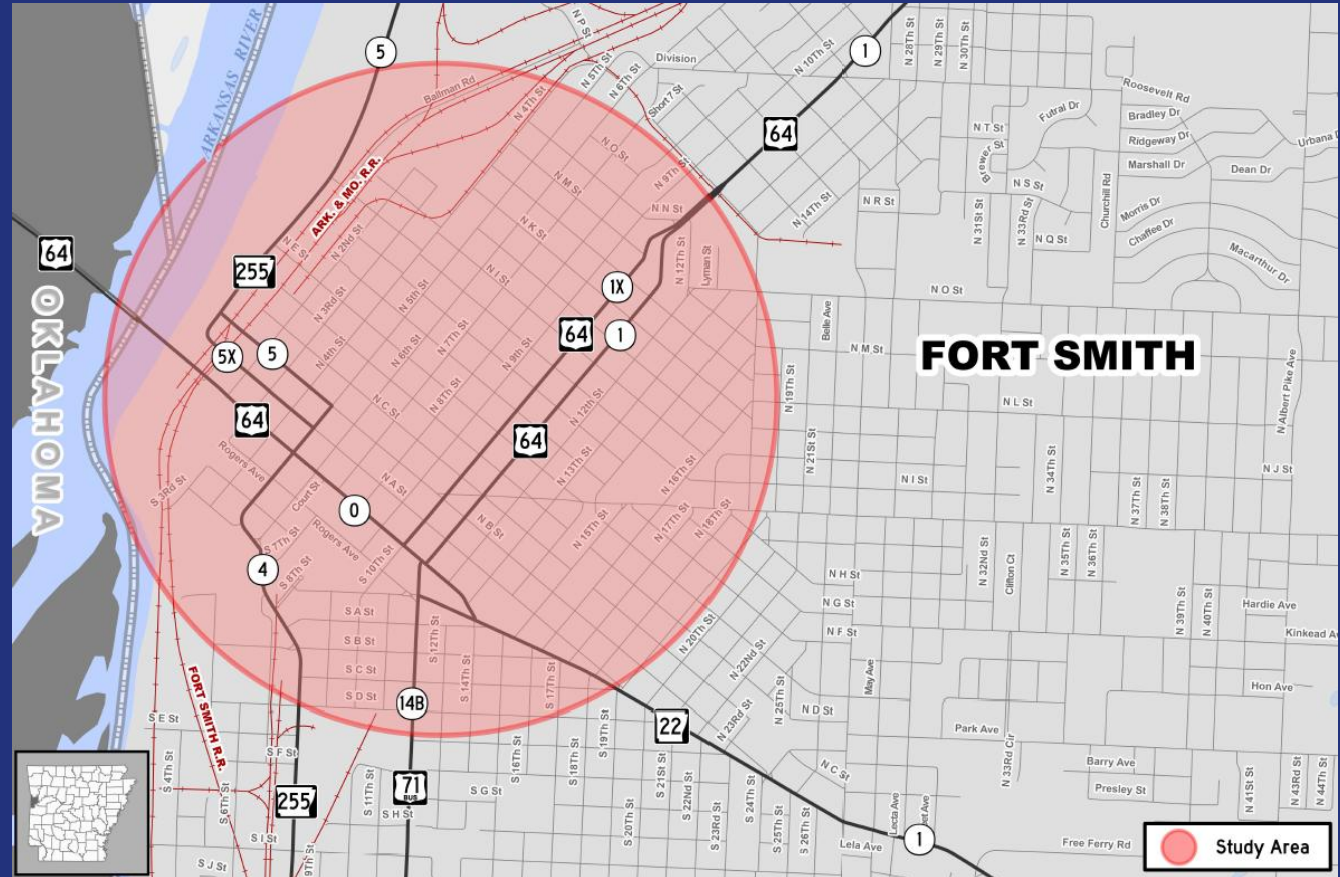
- **Objective:** Widen Highway 59 to 3 lanes with sidewalks

- **Partnering:** City of Van Buren

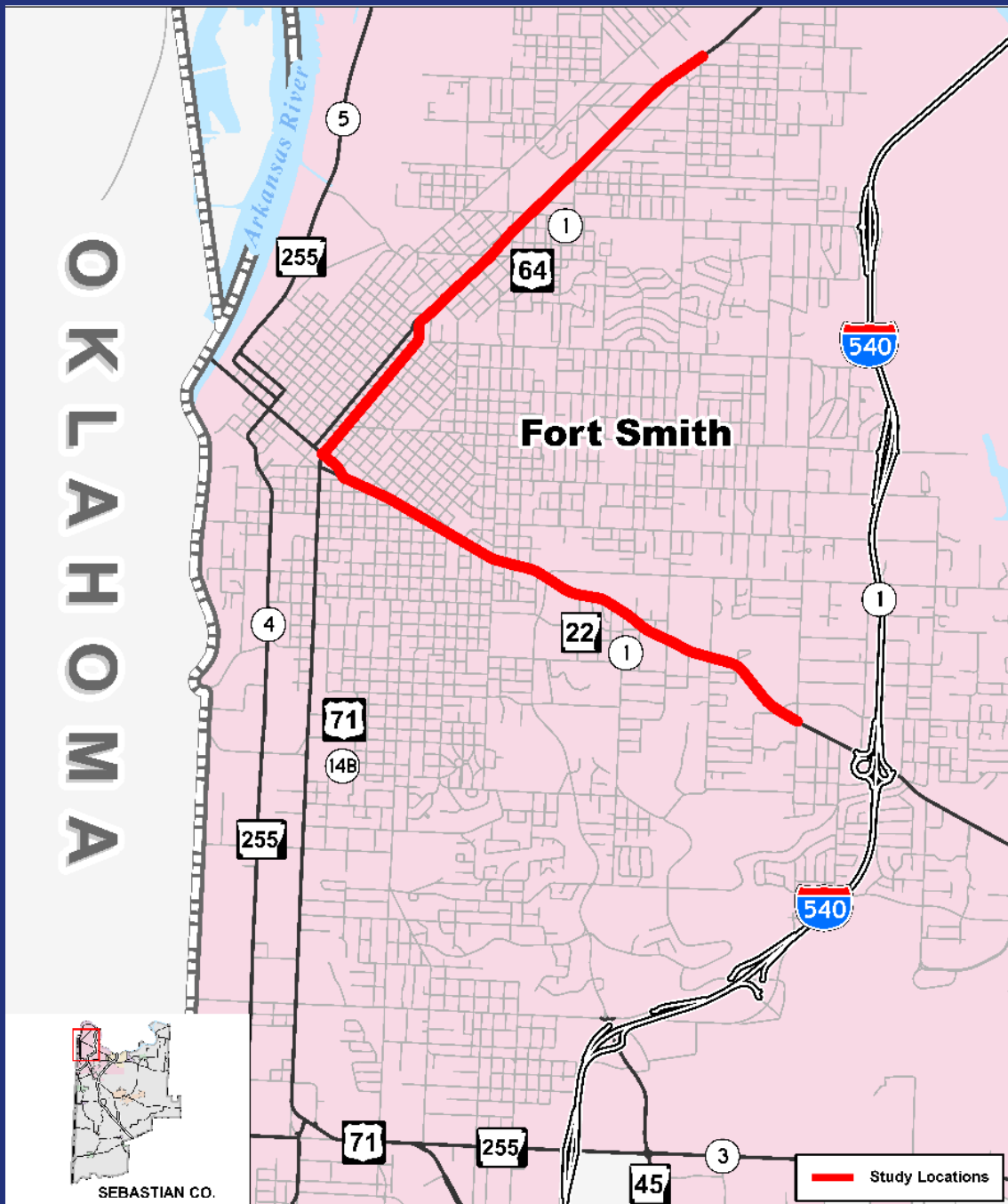


# HIGHWAY 64 PLANNING STUDY

- Public involvement meeting held in October 2024
- Concepts illustrate options for rerouting truck traffic away from Highway 64 (Garrison Ave.)
- Study slated for AHC adoption later this year
