From the Director

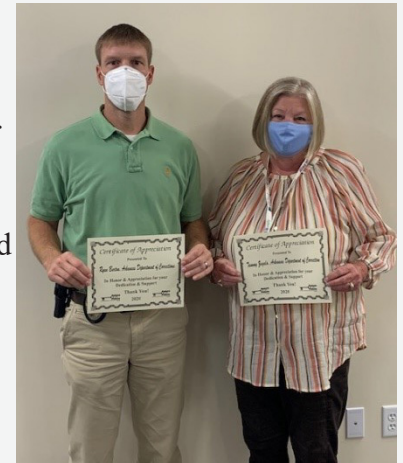
Fort Smith Career Planning and Placement Specialist Pauletta Martin moved into action after seeing a local River Valley television station story about a Fort Smith cemetery that had fallen into disrepair. Martin knew that her community service workers could make a difference at the Oak Cemetery, a 37-acre plot under perpetual care of the Fort Smith's Department of Parks and Recreation. Recent circumstances stemming from the COVID 19 epidemic had not allowed the city of Fort Smith to hire the seasonal workers that do the lawn maintenance for the city's cemeteries and parks. Martin offered the community service work crew that she supervises to assist the city in the clean up and maintenance of the city properties. Work crews that are doing court ordered community service have since logged over 160 hours weed eating the Oak Cemetery.

Not only have these workers provided a community service, but they also embarked on a history lesson found in the cemetery. The Oak Cemetery is recognized as a National Historic Landmark. During a search of the grave markers the work crew learned that the oldest grave dated from 1842 and is the final resting place for Captain Gookin. Oak Cemetery is also the final resting place for over 28 outlaws convicted, sentenced to hanging by Judge Isaac Parker. Also resting at Oak Cemetery are over 100 Federal Marshals, Deputy Federal Marshals and 122 Confederate soldiers, veterans of the American Civil war. After the successful venture at the Oak Cemetery, the Probation and Parole community service work crew is looking forward to assisting the parks and recreation department in other projects aimed at improving the community.



In mid-September 2020 Future For Felons held their 2nd Annual STILL I RISE ceremony and three past

Drug Court graduates were recognized. Also, **Area 4** Area Manager Ryan Burton and Career Placement Specialist Tammy Zagala (shown at right) were recognized with awards for their support of Future For Felons. The Jonesboro group works to help felons get a fair, second chance at life outside of prison walls, ultimately breaking the cycle of re-offending.



Andrew Ruh has taken over the reins at the **Omega Supervision Sanction Center** as Center Supervisor. Ruh graduated from the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff with a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice in 2014. He started his career in 2011 as a Corporal with the Division of Correction at the Maximum Security Unit in Tucker. His career progressed with ADC to the rank of Captain at the Wrightsville Unit in 2015. Later in 2015, Warden Ruh was hired as a Parole/Probation Officer with the Division of Community Correction where he promoted to Parole/Probation Officer II in 2016. In 2017, he was hired as the Lieutenant over the Central Transportation Program with the Division of Community Correction. Ruh was then hired as the Correctional Major (Chief of Security) at the **Omega Supervision Sanction Program** in 2019. ACC Director Jerry Bradshaw noted that "Andrew is a hard worker and is extremely dependable. I know he will do an outstanding job in his new position as Warden."

Area 2 Agents Josh Morehead and Steve Simers and Officer Hunter Boles assisted several law enforcement entities in a search for a mentally and physically impaired Louisiana woman who was found several days later in Mississippi. The woman, who had recently moved to Fulton County, was apparently trying to make her way back to Louisiana.

Area 6 Agent Lisa Wells and Officers Caitlan Avant and Kenn Tate found heroin, methamphetamines, fentanyl, unknown pills, paraphernalia, methamphetamine pipes, marijuana pipes, small baggies, a gun cleaning

kit, and approximately 10 guns when they conducted a home visit on a parolee. They were assisted by several local law enforcement agencies.

Officers making a home visit encountered other offenders with unusual stories - one offender, carrying cash, said he was there because he was planning on purchasing and picking up a 4-wheeler. Another was there to purchase a go-cart and a third said he was there to pick up a payment on a truck sale. Three offenders, three different stories when **Area 2** Officer Hunter Boles and Agent Josh Morehead along with officers from the IZARD County Sheriff's Department and Arkansas Department of Corrections K9 Tracking Team assisted the 16th Judicial District Drug Task Force in executing a search warrant on the residence of a parolee. Along with the offenders, officers located a loaded Ruger 9mm handgun, a Hi-Point Carbine and approximately 562 grams of methamphetamine in the parolee's home. The parolee was taken into custody.

A parolee, in abscond status, was found to be in possession of a handgun, numerous pills and cocaine when stopped by Little Rock police. Intensive Supervision agents from **Area 8** assisted in a search of the offender's home and found cocaine, marijuana and an AR-15 with a 100-round drum. Other items seized included a 5.56 magazine, 158 5.56 rounds, a Glock 27 .40 caliber handgun, two .40 caliber magazines, 54 .40 caliber rounds, 11.91 grams of Cocaine, 71 grams of Marijuana, two Oxycontin pills, 89 muscle relaxer pills and a digital scale. The parolee was taken into custody.

A parolee was arrested on an outstanding warrant in **Area 8** by Intensive Supervision agents and a search of the offender's home revealed a large number of pills, a trash bag containing a large amount of suspected marijuana and a Glock handgun.

Following a tip that an offender was involved in narcotics sales, the **Area 8** Intensive Supervision Team made a home visit along with Little Rock police. As they approached the home, the offender was seen walking down the road and when police tried to take him into custody, he fled. He was soon found and

detained and ACC agents and police found marijuana, weapons and ammunition in the home.

Methamphetamine, MDMA, cocaine, Fentanyl and drug paraphernalia were discovered in a home when **Area 8** (Pulaski County) officers assisted State Police during a home visit. State police were looking into a child abuse complaint. The offender was not found and is in abscond status.

Two **Area 4** Drug Court offenders recently recognized milestones - one was able to obtain his HVAC license after three years of having no license because of extensive drug abuse and another was a 32-year-old offender who earned his first driver's license.

Area 5 has recognized outstanding work by employees who are able to step up and accept additional duties. Each of the award recipients went above and beyond their assigned duties and always volunteer to help out when needed. They are an important part to the day to day operations of not only the Fort Smith Office but to **Area 5**. Employees recognized were Admin Asst: JoAnn Montgomery (Support Staff of the Quarter), SAPL Tanya Smith (Area Managers Award of the Quarter), and Agent Paul Etzkorn (Officer of the Quarter)

Treatment Program Summary:

During September, 720 probationers and parolees were served in the general Substance Use Disorder Treatment Programs. Additionally 1,227 participants were served in the Drug Court Treatment Programs, bringing the total served to 1,947.

A total of 463 residents have agreed to participate in Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) since the program started in July 2018; 186 are discharged and 36 have completed the program. Partnership is in effect with 56 Community Providers to continue MAT upon release from ACC Centers.

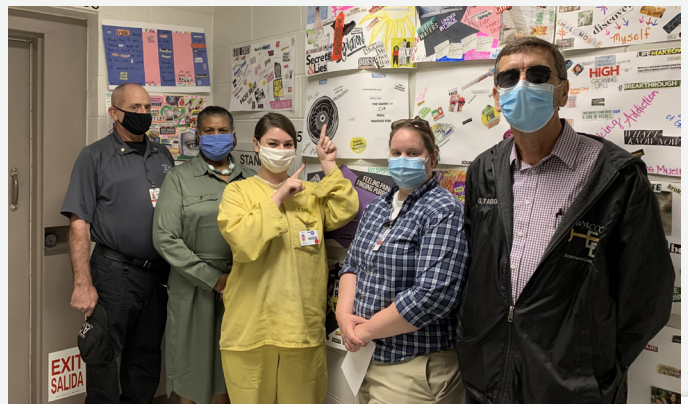
The **Southwest Center** in Texarkana held a Big Brother workshop.

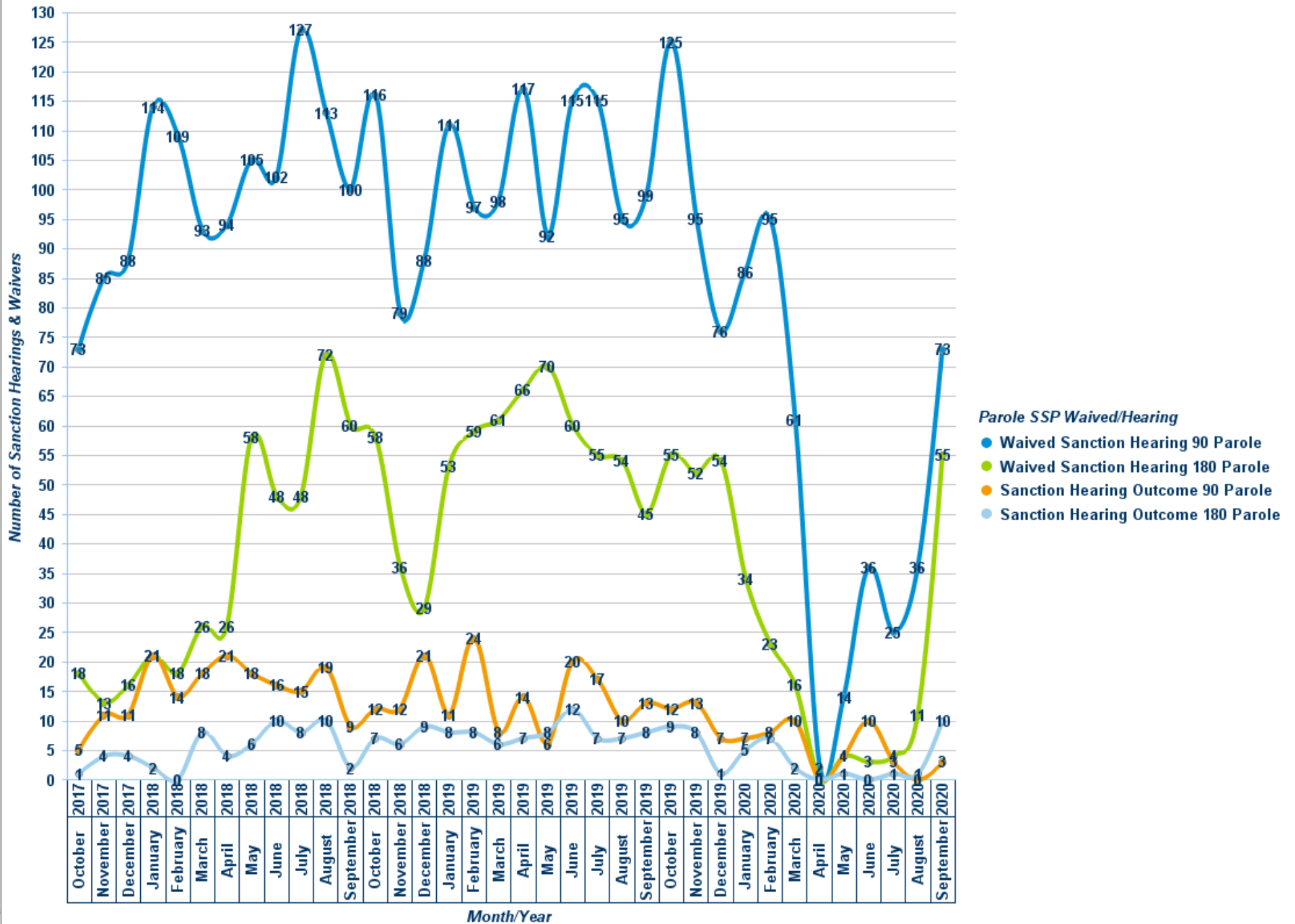
