RESEARCH/PLANNING

March 2018 Admissions and Releases – Admissions for March 2018 totaled **711** (625-males & 86-females) while releases totaled **615** (551-males & 64 females) for a net increase in-house of **96** Inmates.

Inmate Population Growth/Projection – At the end of March 2018, the Arkansas Department of Correction Population totaled **18,089** representing an increase of **11** Inmates since the first of January 2018. Calendar Year 2018 average growth is **4** Inmates per month, down from an average growth of **45** inmates per month during Calendar Year 2017.

Average County Jail Back-up – The backup in the County Jails averaged **1,639** Inmates per day during the month of March 2018 – up from an average of **1,579** inmates per day during the month of February 2018. Of that **1,639** average, short-term revocations averaged **553** (481-males & 72-females).

Gender Responsiveness Training, which is a 4-hour class, was presented on 3/1/18 with a total of 55 staff in attendance at the McPherson Unit; again on 3/13/18 with a total of 15 staff in attendance at the Training Academy; and finally on 3/15/18 with a total of four (4) staff in attendance at Admin East.

PREA Audit File Management Training, which is an 8-hour class, was presented on 3/16/18 with a total of eight (8) staff in attendance and again on 3/23/18 with a total of four (4) staff in attendance. Both classes were held at Admin East.

INMATE INSTITUTIONAL GRIEVANCES

Inmate Formal/Informal Grievances: During March 2018, there were a total of 1,968 formal grievances filed and 2,969 informal grievances filed at various units.

Institutional Grievances Appeals: There were a total of 596 appeals of institutional grievances received in March 2018. Four hundred seventy-one (471) were acknowledged and 125 were rejected for various reasons. A total of 544 appeals were answered; 536 had no merit and eight (8) were found with merit.

INSTITUTIONS

STTG

The STTG Coordinator, along with K9 officers, conducted STTG sweeps of the Maximum Security Unit on March 1st and at the Wrightsville Unit on the 21st. The STTG Coordinator taught the BCOT Security Terroristic Threat Group class at the Training Academy on March 4th and assisted with a BCOT special assignment on the 19th. The STTG Coordinator attended Security Audits for the McPherson Unit on the 15th and the Maximum Security Unit on the 29th. The first STTG Quarterly Meeting of 2018 was held at Admin East on March 27th.

FARM

Row crop fields were fertilized this month that were not fertilized last fall. Burndown chemicals were sprayed ahead of plantings. A total of 1,261 acres of corn was planted at Cummins during the month. Planting at EARU was delayed due to weather conditions. The Tucker Farm was allowed to dry out from the earlier floods. All units were able to get some of their gardens planted in spite of the rains. Egg production was strong, which led to two loads of excess eggs being bid out during the month. The Mississippi State University veterinarian team visited the Dairy, Swine, and Poultry Divisions during the month. The team provided positive feedback as well as identified some areas that need attention. The Wrightsville beef herd continued calving with about 300 calves born during March.

Procurement/Contracts Report (required by policy)–

For March 2018, Purchase Orders and Contracts in excess of \$10,000 amounted to \$3,348,766.96. Of this amount, \$1,903,981.14 was for Inmate Care and Custody-related items (food, shoes, clothing, etc.). Bulk fuel costs for the month of March were \$43,238.03 – average cost of E-10 was \$2.07/gallon; average cost for bulk diesel was \$2.18/gallon.

HUMAN RESOURCES UPDATE

Workplace Safety – During the month of March, the modified version of the Health and Safety Plan was presented to one (1) Basic Training class with a total of 55 cadets in attendance.

Sixty-five (65) incidents were reported to the Company Nurse in March, bringing the total of reported incidents to 208 in 2018.

Benefits – A new system for Performance Evaluations using AASIS will go live on April 2nd. Employees will be given a raise each year; the percentage will be determined by the Office of Personnel Management based on their Performance Evaluation process. Human Resources personnel have attended training about the new system and have visited the units to train supervisors on how to use the new system.

There were 111 FMLA requests processed during the month; 107 were approved and four (4) denied. A total of 15 CAT leave requests were received; three (3) were approved, two (2) were denied, one (1) withdrew, and nine (9) are pending.

Physical Assessments – A total of 200 applicants and incumbent personnel were assessed during the month. Ninety-two (92) incumbent personnel successfully passed their physical assessments, and two (2) did not. The two incumbents rescheduled and passed after a physician's release. One hundred six (106) applicants successfully passed their physical assessments.

A total of 1,934 applications were received in March. Sixty (60) Non-Security applications and 120 CO I applications were processed. Forty-five (45) Correctional Officers were hired, and 21 Correctional Officers were rehired.

Vacancies, Hires, and Terminations – During the month there were a total of 703 vacancies, 63 new hires, 89 terminations, and seven (7) retirements throughout the department.

ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES DIVISION MONTHLY REPORTS INCLUDE:

The **Inmate Welfare Fund** balance on March 31, 2018 was \$6,538,079.92.

The **PAWS in Prison Fund** total on March 31, 2018 was \$187,234.15. ADC Account (7004822/Donations) \$19,159.55, ADC Account (NDC0500/Recycling) \$91,276.03, and ADC Paws in Prison Non-Profit account (Quickbooks) balance was \$76,798.57.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Parole Board Hearings – Technicians visited Parole Board hearings at each facility to review/assist with connectivity issues. Other than one connection issue that was found at the East Arkansas Regional Unit, and has since been resolved, all other facility hearings worked properly.

Marquis SQL/Pentaho Training – Several staff members attended a Marquis Software Development four-day training that was scheduled for ADC, APB, and ACC staff members that use SQL and Pentaho. Follow-up Web-X sessions will be provided.

Jail Arraignment Kiosk – Phase II installation of the Jail Arraignment Kiosks was completed. Kiosk hardware is now available at the Grimes, Pine Bluff, RLW, Ester, Wrightsville, Hawkins, Tucker, and Delta Units. Judges can call the unit kiosks for video court.

VOIP – Cutover to VOIP phone service at East Arkansas was completed. We have worked with DIS to address any issues as they are reported.

4G Wireless Failover – DIS believes that they have identified the issue with 4G Wireless failover for data circuits. Router configuration changes were pushed during low network traffic times earlier in the month. An outage simulation will be performed in April to test this process.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY, *continued***SECURUS VIDEO VISITATION (SVV) PROJECT:**

SVV Dog Kennel installations:

- **Cummins Unit** – SECURUS and Entergy Contract is pending Entergy's signature. SECURUS is soliciting contractors (3 quotes) to hang fiber.

SVV North Central Unit:

- Requested one mobile terminal for the Infirmary (pending SECURUS approval).

In March, a total of 3,890 video visits were completed, and a total of 373 were missed by inmates.

SECURUS TABLET PROJECT:

ADC State Police Barracks – Tablet use is currently limited to the visitation area. Fiber installation has been delayed pending field technician availability.

The Edovo application remains unavailable on the tablets until re-encoding of the movies is complete.

TRAINING ACADEMY - MARCH 2018**BASIC TRAINING DIVISION –**

Instructor David Farrier's **BCOT Class 2018-B** graduated on March 9th with 48 cadets. The Willis H. Sargent Award winner was Deloris Rodrigues of the Mississippi County Work Release Center. Deangelo Earl, Warden at the Grimes Unit, served as the guest speaker.

Instructor Kathy Lowery's **BCOT Class 2018-C** graduated on March 30th with 51 cadets. The Willis H. Sargent Award winner was Danny Bateman of the Grimes Unit. Toni Bradley, Warden at the McPherson Unit, served as the guest speaker.

IN-SERVICE DIVISION –

Security for Non-Security was taught March 1st–2nd.

Correctional Police Officer Annual Training was held March 5th – 6th and again on 26th – 27th. ADC has several employees who are certified to be full-time or specialized police officers. Each year, these employees must have a minimum of **sixteen (16) hours** of annual continuing training. The CPO course comprises of classroom time, firearms training, and home study. This time averages a little more than 16 hours of training, which varies due to policy changes/updates. All of this training is in addition to the standard 40 hours of mandatory training security and certain non-security staff are required to take annually.

Management Level II was held March 19th–21st.

Advanced Interpersonal Communication was taught March 20th and 22nd. This interactive class brings the topic into a correctional-specific atmosphere. Multiple video clips and class scenarios made this a useful and practical training session.

Correctional Security for Non-Security 16C was taught March 27th–28th. This 16-hour segment is designed for contract staff, such as medical staff.

The **Computer Lab** was open daily for staff wishing to complete online training through eCADEMY.

Elective Classes presented during the month included:

eCADEMY – During the month of March, 694 ADC employees completed a total of 10,388.25 hours of eCADEMY training. Approximately 15% of ADC employees completed at least one course during that timeframe, averaging 2.26 hours per staff member.

HEALTH/CORRECTIONAL PROGRAMS**CHAPLAINCY SERVICES**

Benton Work Release – A graduation ceremony for Financial Peace University was held on March 6th. Twenty-two (22) inmates completed the nine-week course and graduated. Gideon's International distributed 200 Bibles in the barracks on March 24th. On the evening of March 24th, 54 inmates attended Christian Activity & Movie Night. Fifty-one (51) inmates attended movie showings in the chapel area on March 31st.

Cummins Unit – "Timothy's Gift," a ministry team of musicians from Nashville, performed a concert on March 30th. One-hundred-sixty-nine (169) inmates attended the concert.

East Arkansas Regional Unit – Thirty-six (36) Islamic inmates participated in Savior's Day observances on March 17th. "Timothy's Gift" performed on March 25th, with 245 inmates in attendance. A ministry team called "Seven Last Words" led an event on March 29th, which was attended by 133 inmates.

Grimes Unit – On March 16th, the Storybook Project assisted 31 inmates with being recorded reading books for their children.

Maximum Security Unit – The chapel hosted the closeout of the 2018 Maximum Security Unit ACA Audit on March 15th. On March 31st, volunteers from Gideon's International distributed 150 Bibles to inmates.

CHAPLAINCY SERVICES, *continued*

McPherson Unit – Twenty (20) inmates participated in a House of Yahweh gathering on March 14th. On March 28th, 90 inmates were recorded reading children's books for their kids, through the sponsorship of the Storybook Project.

North Central Unit – Two special events took place to recognize inmates participating in the basic literacy program and to celebrate the graduation of three (3) inmates. The events took place on March 1st and March 29th. Calvary Bible School Choir sang for eighty-one (81) inmates. A volunteer from Church of God facilitated a Passover Service on March 29th with one (1) inmate participating. Three (3) Jehovah's Witness volunteers offered a Passover service on March 31st, with nine (9) inmates attending.

Ouachita River Correctional Unit – Twenty-five (25) Kairos Prison Ministry volunteers conducted Kairos Walk 22 from March 15th through March 18th. Twenty (20) inmates completed the event.

Pine Bluff and Randall L. Williams Units – The Christian Motorcyclists Association (CMA) conducted an event in the Pine Bluff and Randall L. Williams Units on March 16th and 17th. They visited barracks, chow hall, recreation yard, and displayed their motorcycles on the yard. They met the majority of the inmates in the facility.

Tucker Unit – On March 23rd, the Jacksonville First Baptist Church Choir presented an Easter Cantata, with fifty-two (52) inmates attending. "Timothy's Gift" performed on March 27th. There were twelve (12) volunteers in their group. Seventy-three (73) inmates attended.

Varner Unit – One-hundred-forty-eight (148) inmates took part in Islamic Savior's Day observances on March 15th. CRA DeWayne Hicks led Courage to Change Ministries Revivals on March 23rd and 24th with one-hundred-sixty-four (164) inmates in attendance.

Wrightsville Complex – "Timothy's Gift" performed concerts at the Wrightsville and Hawkins Units on March 26th. One-hundred-forty-four (144) inmates attended at Wrightsville and thirty-four (34) inmates attended at Hawkins.

CONSTRUCTION/MAINTENANCE

PROJECT UPDATES

Cummins Unit:

DBA has approved the plans for the new emergency generator and a bids package is being prepared. Staff is continuing work on extending handrails in 13-15 Barracks. The handrail extension project has been completed in Barracks 13 and is underway in Barracks 15. Plans were approved by DBA to replace existing doors in 13-15 Barracks with solid doors and staff has started ordering materials. An architect has been selected for the design of the planned precast recreation yards.

Cummins Poultry:

Generators are continuing to be tested weekly. A meeting was held with the architect to discuss making changes to the loading ramp for coolers at the chicken houses. Construction trailers were moved off site.

Cummins School:

Plans for the new school were submitted by the architect to DBA for review. Building demolition was started, and the mobilization of offices and equipment for the project is underway.

Delta Unit:

The roofing manufacturer's inspector visited the site and made recommendations. A large crew has been on site to complete the project. Entegrity began working on water controls and lighting upgrades.

East Arkansas Regional Unit:

The proposed plans from the on-call architect for emergency generators for perimeter lighting were sent to DBA for review, and they have been approved and a bid package is being prepared. Entegrity has been working on water controls and lighting improvements. DBA approved the phase 2 plans for the solar, mechanical, composting and wastewater improvements.

Grimes Unit:

Repair work on the dog kennel barn has continued with completion anticipated within the next two weeks. All gym painting, lighting and office repairs are complete. Work in preparation for the ACA unit accreditation audit took place at Grimes and McPherson throughout the month.

Maximum Security Unit:

Boiler repairs have continued with replacement tubes for the hot water exchange tank being installed. Installation of the new high service pump and the valve were completed. Number 2 boiler is now operational, while work on Number 1 boiler continues. Additional valves and equipment are being ordered. Leaking tank is being repaired. Plans approved by DBA for construction of Barracks 2 utility chase. Security metal ceiling material has been ordered. Riot gates in Isolation areas have been relocated. Plans submitted to DBA for emergency generator have been approved. An architect has been selected for the design of and a contract is being finalized for the planned precast recreation yards.

Ouachita River Correctional Unit:

Gravel operations continue. The rock crusher is operational. The replacement of storm-damaged skylights has been completed. **Chapel:** A 3-ton HVAC unit has been ordered and will be installed as soon as it arrives. Repairs are being done to the unit roof.

Pine Bluff Unit:

Materials are being ordered for the Pine Bluff Unit Barracks 9 renovation and construction is underway.

Tucker Unit:

Continuing to monitor waste water plant and make repairs and adjustments to keep it in compliance. Staff is working on changing out the water filter media. Four exchanges have been completed and successfully tested and work continues on the fifth filter. Engineers are working on plans to add water filters and aeration for the water plant. Arkansas Department of Health comments have been addressed.

Wrightsville Unit:

DBA has approved the plans for new emergency generators. Bid packages are being prepared. The new Isolation recreation yards are complete and being used.

Wrightsville Hawkins Unit:

DBA has approved the plans for an additional generator for the kitchen and lighting. A bid package is being prepared.
