PROCUREMENT UPDATE

In March 2026, Purchase Orders and Contracts in excess of \$10,000 amounted to \$5,208,429.31, broken down as follows:

- Division of Correction: \$4,975,067.73
- Division of Community Correction: \$216,772.82
- Shared Services: \$16,588.76

Of the total, \$2,542,920.40 was for Inmate/Resident Care and Custody-related items (food, shoes, clothing, etc.). A detailed chart is available on pages 9-10.

The cost of bulk fuel for the month of March totaled \$118,329.49. The average cost for bulk E-10 was \$2.86/gallon and the average cost for bulk diesel was \$3.24/gallon.

FIELD SERVICE PROGRAM SUMMARY

- **1,756** probationers and parolees were served in the general Substance Use Disorder Treatment programs. Another **1,377** participants were served in the Drug Court Treatment programs, bringing the total served to **3,133** for the month.

- A total of **1,155** residents have agreed to participate in Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) since the program started in July 2018. A total of **681** were discharged with follow up in the community in progress and **215** have completed the program. Total of **242** unsuccessful discharges and **6** participants dropped from the program. Total active in the MAT program in Community Supervision is **157**. Partnerships are in effect with **88** community providers to continue MAT upon release from an ACC center. Peer Recovery support continues with medical providers ARCaes, River Valley Medical Wellness, and ARISA Health.
