**PROCUREMENT UPDATE**

In December 2025, Purchase Orders and Contracts in excess of \$10,000 amounted to \$6,170,492.17, broken down as follows:

- Division of Correction: \$5,653,021.94
- Division of Community Correction: \$268,911.72
- Shared Services: \$248,558.51

Of the total, \$4,955,245.03 was for Inmate/Resident Care and Custody-related items (food, shoes, clothing, etc.). A detailed chart is available on pages 9-10.

The cost of bulk fuel for the month of December totaled \$79,945.66. The average cost for bulk E-10 was \$2.02/gallon and the average cost for bulk diesel was \$2.43/gallon.

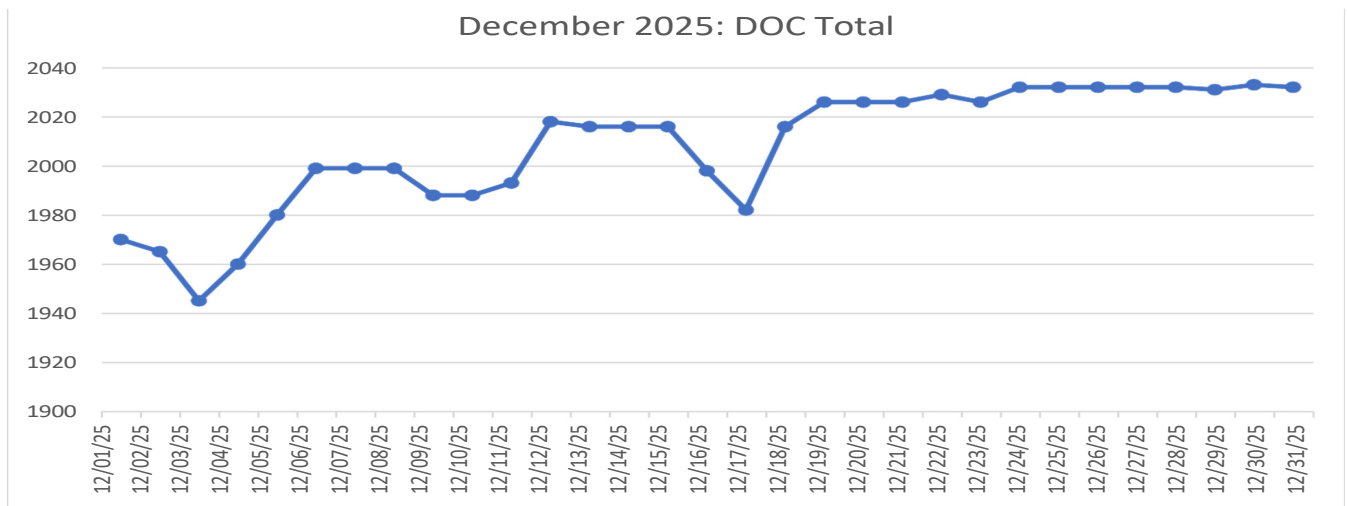

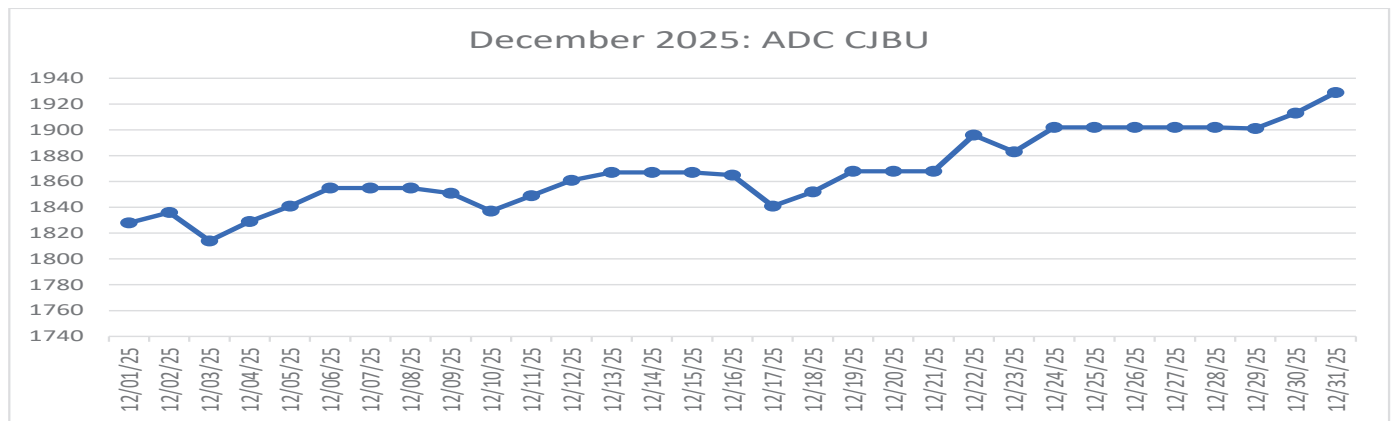

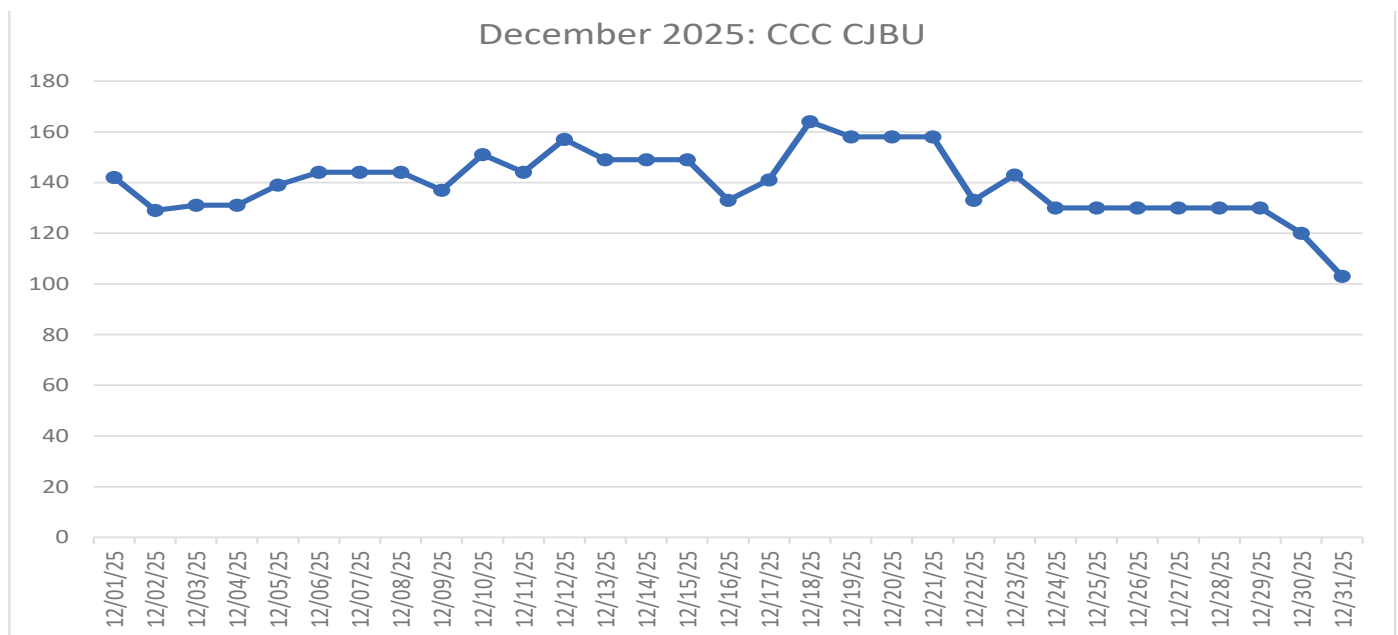
### COUNTY JAIL BACKUP - DECEMBER 2025

- A total of **1098** residents have agreed to participate in Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) since the program started in July 2018. A total of **657** were discharged with follow up in the community in progress and **211** have completed the program. Total of **233** unsuccessful discharges and **11** participants dropped from the program. Total active in the MAT program in Community Supervision is **133**.
