PROCUREMENT UPDATE

In February 2026, Purchase Orders and Contracts in excess of \$10,000 amounted to \$7,686,006.84, broken down as follows:

- Division of Correction: \$7,298,463.36
- Division of Community Correction: \$356,383.24
- Shared Services: \$31,160.24

Of the total, \$6,294,372.13 was for Inmate/Resident Care and Custody-related items (food, shoes, clothing, etc.). A detailed chart is available on pages 9-10.

The cost of bulk fuel for the month of February totaled \$34,696.66. The average cost for bulk E-10 was \$2.13/gallon and the average cost for bulk diesel was \$2.32/gallon.

FIELD SERVICE PROGRAM SUMMARY

- **1,765** probationers and parolees were served in the general Substance Use Disorder Treatment programs. Another **1,405** participants were served in the Drug Court Treatment programs, bringing the total served to **3,170** for the month.

- A total of **1,137** residents have agreed to participate in Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) since the program started in July 2018. A total of **674** were discharged with follow up in the community in progress and **213** have completed the program. Total of **236** unsuccessful discharges and **3** participants dropped from the program. Total active in the MAT program in Community Supervision is **150**. Partnerships are in effect with **88** community providers to continue MAT upon release from an ACC center. Peer Recovery support continues with medical providers ARCaes, River Valley Medical Wellness, and ARISA Health.
