COMMUNITY SUPERVISION AREA HIGHLIGHTS:

AREA 1

On May 6, 2026, DEA Task Force Officer of the Arkansas Department of Corrections – Division of Community Correction, Community Supervision Services, Area 1 (Benton County), participated in an operational briefing with personnel from the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), and the Benton County Special Operations Unit (BCSOU) regarding a planned narcotics enforcement operation targeting Active probationer. The DEA developed actionable intelligence indicating offender was in possession of Firearms and Methamphetamine at his registered address. On the same date, offender was contacted by his supervising Officer and directed to report to the Rogers Community Supervision Office. Upon his arrival, offender was detained and a warrant less search of his cellphone was conducted pursuant to his warrant less search waiver. Multiple text message conversations/photos were located involving the sale of firearms in offender's cellphone. When confronting offender about the messages, he stated he had guns hidden in his house and a meth pipe. Offender was transported to his listed address pursuant the warrant less search of his residence. Prior to our arrival, Offender disclosed that he had multiple firearms in a safe on his property. Offender also disclosed the code to the officer. He also disclosed he had a meth pipe in his bedroom and that his key chain in his possession had both the keys to the house. Upon our arrival, Offender agreed to show us where the firearms and meth pipe was located. A glass smoking device with residue was located in his bedroom underneath his pillow. He told us the safe was in a hidden location, he disclosed the location and the code was entered and the safe was successfully opened. A total of five firearms were located with ammunition. Special Agents with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF) were advised of the incident, and they will be conducting a separate investigation involving possible federal firearm charges on Offender.

AREA 2

On April 28, Community Supervision Officers Charles Slater and Bobby Hicks conducted a home visit in Baxter County on a sex offender for whom a dead battery notification had been received from his assigned electronic monitoring device. The offender was present at the reported residence and became nervous when he answered the door. Officers entered the residence to perform a compliance search which yielded the discovery of multiple items of violation; including, multiple small, clear baggies containing a white crystalline substance believed to be methamphetamine, a loaded syringe, scales commonly used for weighing controlled substances prior to distribution, and several glass smoking devices commonly used for ingesting methamphetamine. These items were found within an entertainment center. Further search yielded the discovery of additional small, plastic baggies containing a

white crystalline substance believed to be methamphetamine and a box of Hornady 9mm ammunition. These items were found within a pack-out toolbox near the entertainment center. A second subject, also a convicted felon, came from a separate part of the residence. Baxter County Sheriff's investigators arrived on the scene to collect and process evidence. A search of an outbuilding on the property yielded the discovery of a 9mm Taurus handgun within a toolbox. Both subjects were taken into custody by Baxter County deputies and transported to the detention center with pending charges.

AREA 3

On May 5, 2026, Community Supervision Agent Evangella Tatum and Community Supervision Officer Jarvis Owens took part in the Beebe High School Career Fair. Officers answered questions and explained to students the roles and responsibilities of a Community Supervision Officer.

AREA 4

On May 7th, 2026, the Area 4 Drug court team was invited by Jonesboro Mayor Harold Copenhagen to attend a meeting at his office where he recognized our staff for their service and dedication to treatment. A Proclamation was signed by the Mayor and a copy was presented to us. The Hon. Judge Melissa Richardson, members of her staff, and several local dignitaries were also in attendance. Refreshments were enjoyed. Those in attendance from our office were CSO III Ashley Self, CSO III Michael Hopkins, Program Specialist Kady Greer, and Administrative Specialist Angela Hopewell.

AREA 5

Helping folks get their driver's license back or get it for the first time has become a rewarding part of this job! Mr. Haynes has not had a legal driver's license in 20 years. He's now employed full-time with a really good job and was excited to show me the engagement ring for his soon to be fiancé!

AREA 6

Career Placement Specialist, Kristen Hardcastle took a small group of offenders to Soul Food Café Mission to assist with providing the community with food. The Soul Food Café Mission

is a faith-based ministry run on biblical principles of reaching out to the hurting world with love, compassion and hope. Every Tuesday from 9am to 3pm, Hot meals, food boxes, laundry mat, beauty salon, toiletries, clothing, small furniture and appliances, homeless supplies, and space for showers are provided to the community.

AREA 7/8

On 5/5/26, ISP agents along with DEA conducted an operation on offender Cordell Smith. Smith was observed dealing illegal narcotics on multiple occasions by DEA. Smith was observed leaving his apartment at 3000 North Hills #15167 and going to his parole address of 1415 Maple Street in North Little Rock. Smith was observed going to the side of the house and getting a bag from an SUV backed in against the fence. Smith was traffic stopped by State Police after leaving 1415 Maple Street and had marijuana in his possession. A search warrant for a vehicle located at the residence at 1415 Maple was requested and granted. Inside the vehicle was multiple black garbage bags with marijuana inside. Approximately 600 pounds of marijuana was recovered, and a firearm was located at offender Smiths apartment at 3000 North Hills BLVD #15167.

AREA 9

On May 21, 2026, Area 9 Texarkana office has partnered with TRIO and their representative, Tenequa Martin, comes to the office to help offender sign up for coming education and/or GED services. She gave offenders information for the Career Workshop that was held on June 2, 2026 at the Texarkana College Library. She reminded offenders of the Community Career Fair that will be held on July 16, 2026 from 2pm, to 5pm at Texarkana College.

AREA 10

05/11/2026: Deputy Blake Hughes with HSCSO came to the office this date and asked if we could do a home visit due to a tip that Spivey had drugs in his home. Agent Childers and Agent Starkey went to Spivey's listed address. Agent Childers went to the back of the residence as Agent Starky went to the front door. Agent Childers could hear banging around in the back of the house, as well as a dog barking. Agents made entry into the residence and made contact with a male and female. The female stated she was Spivey's daughter. Spivey's door to his bedroom was shut. Agents instructed him to come to the door. He eventually came to the door. He stated his dog was in the bathroom. He was instructed to get the dog out of the bathroom in order for us to search it. He took the dog outside. Agent Childers and Deputy Blake Hughes began searching the bedroom and the bathroom/laundry room. Agent Childers opened the dryer door and located absconder, Brandi Ray ADC#757493 hiding inside. She was taken into custody on her active warrant and given a court date for her Malvern warrant. She was instructed to report to her officer once she was released. Agent Childers located two black safes in the closet in Spivey's bedroom. Agent Childers asked Deputy Austin Hughes to get Agent Starkey to have Spivey open the safe. Spivey came into the room and put the code into the safe and pulled out a baggie with suspected meth. He handed the baggie to Deputy Blake Hughes and stated that they were his drugs and that was all that was in the house. Agent Childers continued to search the safe and located a package of small baggies inside the safe where Spivey had retrieved the baggie of suspected meth. There were also two meth pipes located in the bedroom. Spivey was taken into

custody and transported to the Hot Spring County Jail. Approximately 12.1 grams of suspected methamphetamine was seized.

AREA 11

On 5/13/26 at approximately 2:10 P.M. Agent Parker conducted a home visit at offender Keith Ludwicks listed residence of 209 Talbot Street Pine Bluff Arkansas due to offender Ludwick missing his office visit. As Agent Parker was walking up onto the porch, he observed Mark Reynolds ADC 663723 who recognized as a parole on active supervision sleeping on a couch on the front porch. Agent Parker tried multiple times to attempt to wake him, and he would not wake up Agent Parker was about to go retrieve a Narcan Kit from the vehicle believing he may be overdosing and attempted to wake him one last time. Offender Reynolds slowly started coming around and Agent Parker advised him to stand up so he could be pat searched. When he stood up Agent Parker observed he had been sleeping on top of a glass methamphetamine pipe. Agent Parker conducted a pat search of offender Reynolds and located a cigarette pack in his right front pocket which contained a clear yellow plastic baggie with a crystal-like substance suspected of being methamphetamine. Offender Reynolds stated at that time "I forgot that was in there if I had remembered it was in there I would have smoked it too and you wouldn't have found anything" Agent Parker placed offender Reynolds in hand restraints and called Mecca who dispatched officers Burchette and Jones to the scene. At that time Offender Ludwick's mother came out of the house. Agent Parker asked her where offender Ludwick was and she stated he was at work. Reporting instructions were left for her to give to offender Ludwick for him to report 5/14/26@9:00A.M. Officers Jones and Burchette arrived on scene and they were advised of the situation and contacted Vice and Narcotics. Detectives Summerville and Johnson from vice and narcotics arrived on scene. The crystal-like substance field tested positive for methamphetamine and the evidence was collected so a case file could be completed and sent to the prosecutors office for charges to be filed for felony possession of methamphetamine.

REENTRY PROGRAM:

REENTRY FACILITIES:

As of May 31, ACC had five licensed Reentry Facilities with 218 total residents in Phases I-IV of the Reentry program. Since the program began, there have been 3,477 individuals who have successfully completed and graduated from the program.

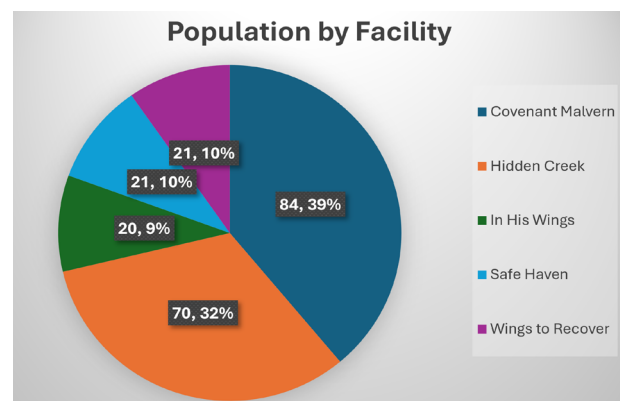
During the month, 11 residents completed CRC and 2 residents were enrolled in GED. 3 residents enrolled in Wage with 3 completing. A total of 20 Reentry Facility residents received their driver's license, 18 received an ID card, 23 received their Social Security Cards, 20 received birth certificates.

REENTRY PROGRAM CONTINUED:

REENTRY OFFICERS:

In May, 153 Reentry residents was reported to be employed and 27 residents were reported to be ineligible for employment at this time. Reentry Officers reported 2 education referrals, which resulted in enrollments.

Reentry Officers conducted 194 reentry facility office visits, 153 Phase IV office visits, 28 Phase IV home visits and 33 pre-parole plan verifications. Reentry Officers made 42 community contacts within their assigned area during the month and conducted 70 office visits in their area. There was 2 Good Grid class conducted across the state with 6 in attendance, 2 job fairs were held with 56 in attendance and 2 Department workforce class was held with 15 in attendance



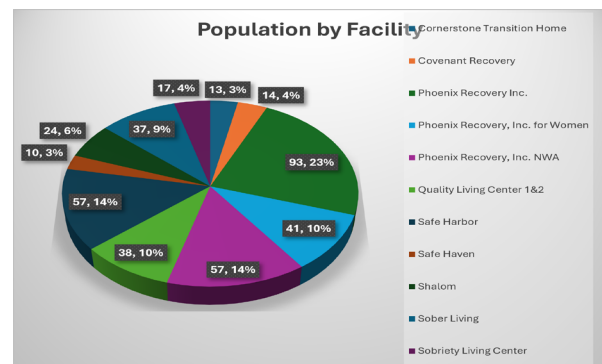
TRANSITIONAL HOUSING:

There are 13 licensed vendor facilities with 493 beds (401 DOC funded) in the facilities. Within the transitional facilities, there are 220 residents who have obtained full-time employment.

In May, 283 residents who previously received their GED or high school diploma. During the month, there were 39 registered sex offenders living in transitional facilities.

A total of 18 residents received their driver's license, 89 received an ID card, 89 received their Social Security card and 6 received birth certificates.

A total of 58 residents graduated from the Transitional Housing program, 24 absconded and 14 were dismissed.

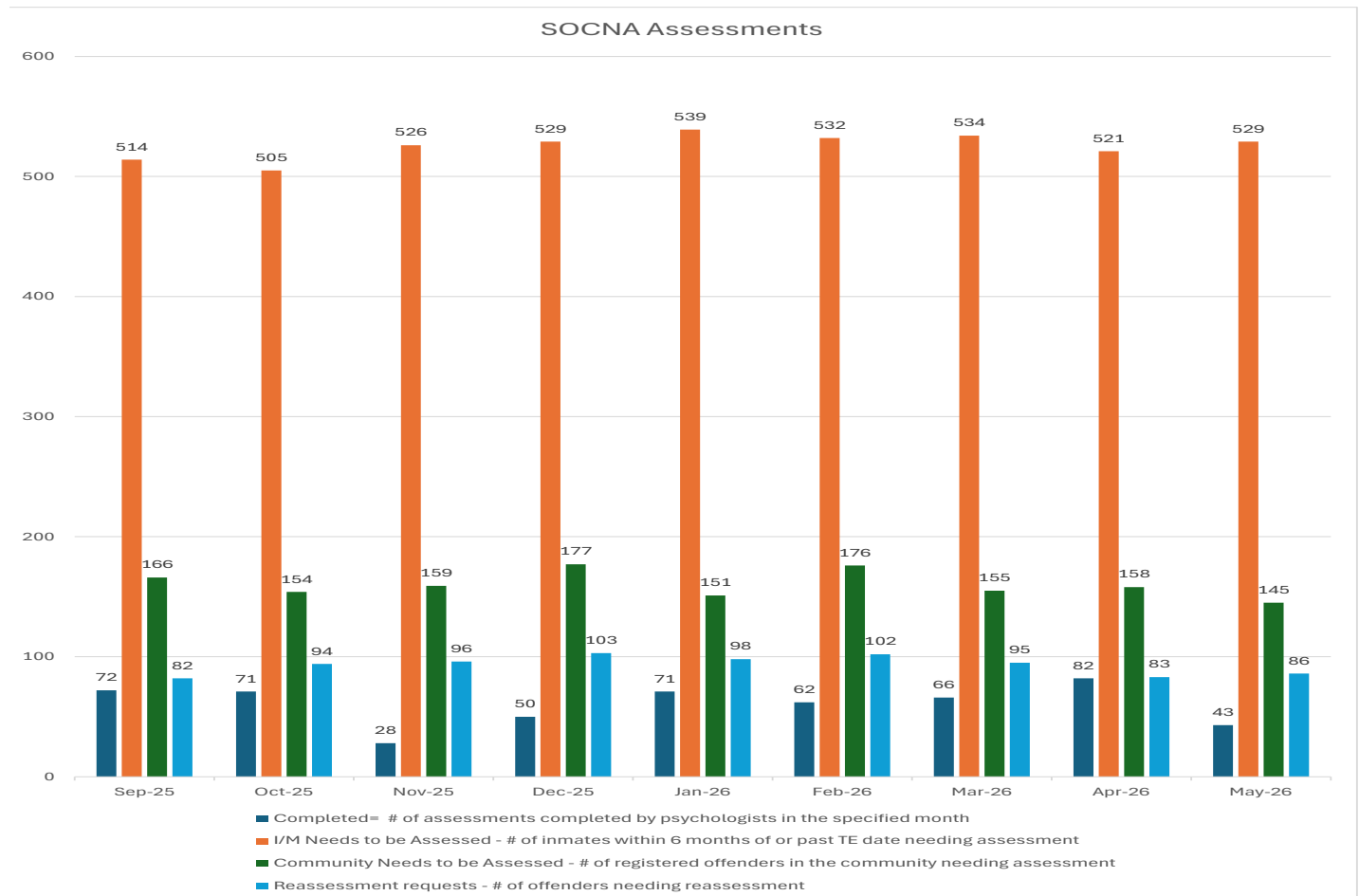

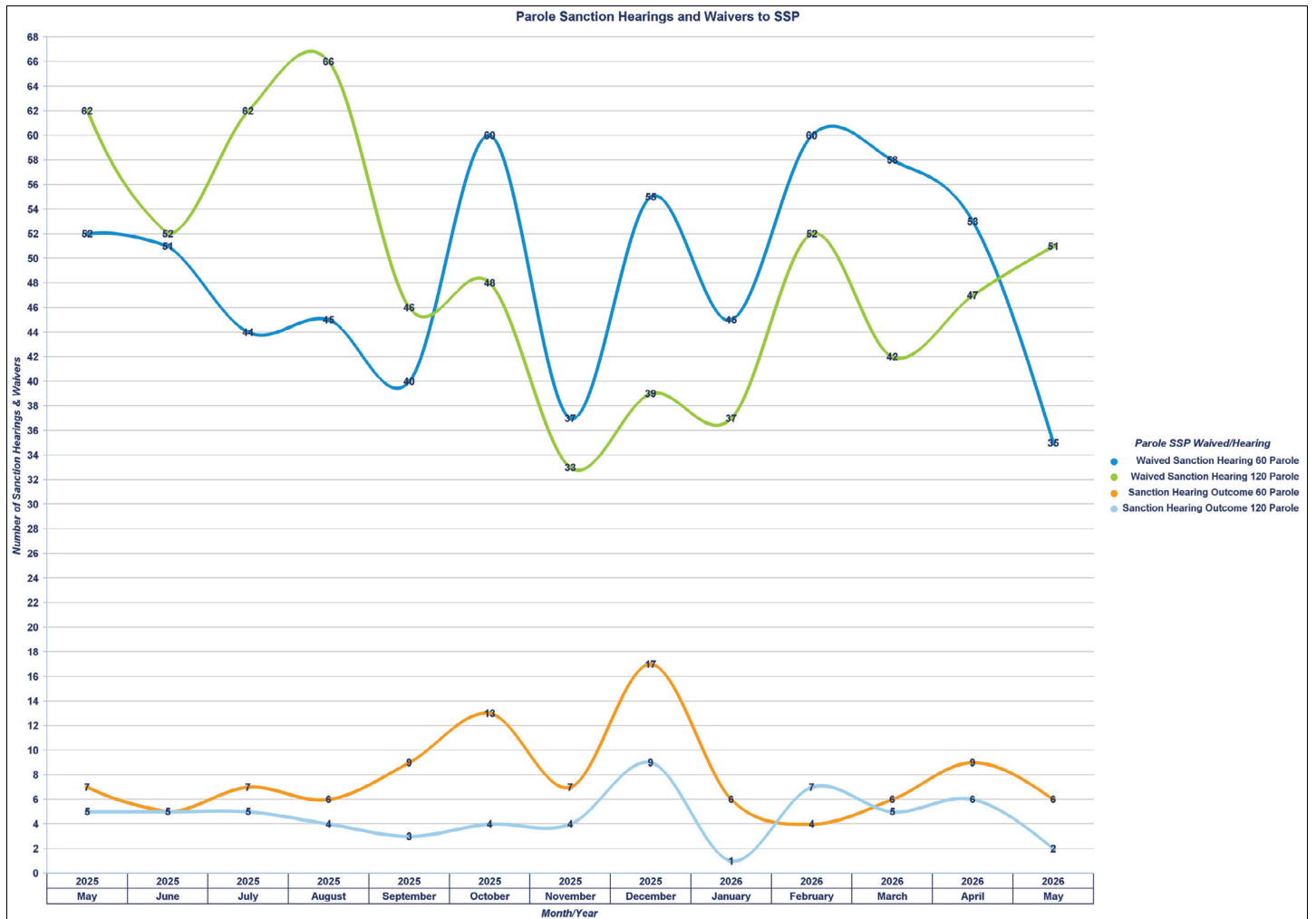
