COMMUNITY SUPERVISION AREA HIGHLIGHTS:

AREA 1

Between February 10, 2026, and February 12, 2026, the Drug Enforcement Administration Field Residence Office (DEA FRO) participated in the United States Marshal Service (USMS) lead "Operation Springdale Safe". Participating Agencies included in the operation were DEA FRO, USMS, ATF, ICE, Springdale Police Department, Arkansas Community Corrections, the Benton County Sheriff's Office, Arkansas State Police, the Washington County Sheriff's Office. The city of Springdale, AR was seeing a recent spike in violent crime and drug offenses. According to CDC data Arkansas was ranked 4th in the nation for opioid addiction rates, with 1,218 diagnoses per 100,000 residents, which is over twice the national average. Arkansas has enacted harsher punishments for fentanyl dealers as part of a legislative push in 2023 to combat the opioid crisis. Due to the crack down on fentanyl, drug dealers have moved to mitigate risk to themselves and have gone back to selling methamphetamine and cocaine to avoid hefty penalties and risks of overdoses from selling fentanyl. Springdale, Arkansas is two hours from Tulsa, Oklahoma a major consumer and distributor of narcotics and gang activity. With being so closely located to Tulsa, Oklahoma, couriers from Mexican Sources of Supply as well as couriers related to gang activity can move back and forth from Tulsa to Springdale, AR with ease. DEA sources developed from the Fayetteville Resident Office (FRO) have come in contact with sources of supply offering prices as low as \$2,500 - \$3,000 for a pound of methamphetamine. This allows for a large profit margin and increases the desire for more people to try to make money in the drug trade. With the increased usage of encrypted messenger apps (WhatsApp, Signal, Telegram, ect) and money transfer apps (Venmo, CashApp ect), criminals are able to conduct and conceal drug trafficking and money launder activities without the detection of law enforcement. With an increase in drug usage Arkansas, cities like Springdale, have seen spikes in crime such as burglary, shoplifting, theft, and violent crime to include assault, domestic violence, and homicide. This directly affects the community on a day to day basis. Within Arkansas, more than 89% of the communities have a lower crime rate than Springdale, Arkansas. As a result of the above information Agents began "Operation Springdale Safe" in order to reduce violent crime and arrest narcotics traffickers, target street level gang activity, identify targets, collect actionable criminal intelligence in an effort to reduce overall criminal activity in the city of Springdale, Arkansas. Between February 10, 2026, and February 12, 2026, 340 arrests were made over the three day operation ranging from Possession of Child Sexual Abuse Materials, Felon in Possession of Firearms, and Possession With Intent to Deliver.

AREA 2

On February 12, Community Supervision Officers Bobby Hicks and Charley Slater conducted a home visit on an individual on supervised parole. After being granted entry to the residence, a compliance search was conducted. While searching an outbuilding on the property, officers discovered multiple items of drug paraphernalia; including, glass smoking pipes, used syringes, and metal spoons containing a cotton substance. Gassville Police Department was contacted and assisted with the visit. All items of drug paraphernalia were collected by Gassville police.

AREA 3

On February 5, 2026, the Lawrence County Drug Program held a graduation. The Honorable Judge Rob Ratton presented Certificates of Completion to three graduates of the program, Angela Allred, Bradley Tolson and Monica Thielemier.

AREA 4

COPE (Cost of Poverty Experience)

On Monday, 2/23/2026, CSO III Jody Barker at our Paragould Office attended a meeting held at the First United Methodist Church, sponsored by the Arkansas Family Alliance, partnered with 100 Families. Matt Whitson of the Arkansas Family Alliance describes the Cost of Poverty Experience (COPE) as an interactive simulation that helps participants understand the daily realities and systemic barriers faced by families living in poverty. Through guided activities, real-life scenarios, and structured reflection, participants step into the roles of individuals navigating limited resources, unstable employment, housing challenges, transportation issues, and complex systems. COPE is designed to build empathy, challenge assumptions, and spark meaningful conversations about how communities, churches, agencies, and leaders can respond in

ways that restore dignity and create real pathways out of poverty.

Lauren Brown of 100 Families describes 100 Families as a collective impact initiative focused on reducing poverty by bringing together community organizations to coordinate services around families' needs. They use data to identify gaps and focus our collective efforts where they can make the biggest difference.

CARE Portal is a tool that connects churches and agencies to meet the tangible needs of families in crisis, often those involved with the foster care system. It helps streamline requests so resources go where they are needed most quickly. Lauren Brown invited all of us at probation/parole to be involved with 100 Families and CARE Portal and personally came to the office to give us hands on instructions on how to use it. With it we can better network with other agencies and treatment providers who are also involved with our offenders to better assess their needs, and work together to meet those needs.

AREA 5

Steven Free and Aaron Brandon from the area five Mena Office, are delivering donations to the FreshStart pregnancy resource Center in Mena. Items were collected from our employees and local churches

AREA 6

On February 12, 2026, Arkansas Division of Community Correction 13th Annual Gold Key Employee Awards Ceremony was held. Agent Carla Griswold was nominated for Community Supervision Officer of the Year. On February 17, 2026, CPPS Kristen Hardcastle took offenders to the "Step into your future" on the job training event at the Conway Housing Authority Residence Center. The class provided real world tips and skills for the workplace. On February 19, 2026, Agent Chelsea De La Riva and CSM Cornelia Lasker attended the Victimology class discussion panel at the University of Central Arkansas. Students asked questions about law enforcement and community resources that victims have available.

AREA 7/8

On Friday February 13, 2026 at approximately 1015 hours officers while at 1589 Robin Rd, Jacksonville, AR 72076, conducting another arrest, witnessed the neighbors, located at 1649 Robin Rd, shooting multiple rounds of shotgun shells in their yard. Neighbors spoke to officers and advised that the individuals living at the residence, are always shooting and have multiple individuals visiting the residence at odd hours of the night. Through reverse address lookup, it was discovered that James C. Yawn (PID 421260) is a current probationer out of Lonoke County, on for the charges of Breaking and Entering and two misdemeanor offenses. Research revealed that Yawn's listed residence is 1649 Robin Road, and his photo matched the individual observed by officers shooting on February 13, 2026. On Wednesday, February 18th, 2026, Yawn was scheduled at 0845 to have an office visit. At approximately 0900, Yawn was brought back to the conference room at the Lonoke County Probation Office, where officers took him into custody to conduct a Home Compliance Check. Upon making entry of the home, a .22 LR was found located next to the offenders bed, several cases of ammunition were to include .22 LR, .357, 40, 45, and 12 gauge shotgun shells were also discovered. Further investigation of the residence revealed drug paraphernalia which was linked to the offender and his girlfriend Dana Gourley. The case, new charges, and all evidence were turned over to Lonoke County Sheriff's Deputies for prosecution

AREA 9

Area 9 participated in MAPPS, Sentence Components, new OAD screen, court commitments, how to read and enter sentencing order, training with Mrs. Kennedy from Head quarters over Teams. Officers learned how to navigate MAPPS and use MAPPS to complete home visits better and helped officers understand better ways of entering sentence components. Officers were given very good information. Officers gave back good feed back and expressed that they had learned several things from the training that would aid them in their day to day tasks.

AREA 11

On 2/4/2026 at 0930, ISP Agent Johnson was contacted by Investigator Pennington from the Jefferson County Sheriffs Office in reference to the offender Davdrin Goffin a parole supervised out of the Little Rock office. Pennington stated they were investigating the offender for a stolen gun here in Pine Bluff. Pennington stated they confronted the offender at 1300 Collins Drive Pine Bluff. Pennington stated the offender was very rude and slammed the door in their face. Johnson told Pennington if the offender was there, they could detain him and wait for Parole Agents to respond. Pennington stated they were going to get a search warrant for the residence at 1300 Conner Drive and would Parole Agents assist them in case if the offender was there. Johnson stated yes, we will assist. At 1015 ISP Agent Johnson and Agent Parker followed JCSO to 1300 Collins Drive and assisted them while they served the warrant. JCSO made forced entry due to nobody answering the door upon several commands from JCSO. Upon entry JCSO cleared the residence the residence was cleared by Agent Parker and sheriffs office personnel. In the far back bedroom on the left JCSO located a DTI 5.56MM AR style rifle that was loaded with a magazine and ammunition. Under the bed a box with a second 5.56MM magazine was located. A small amount of marijuana, digital scales, and marijuana grinder were also located. Agent Parker located several pieces of mail with the offender Goffins name and the address of 1300 Collins Drive. The weapon, magazine and ammunition were photographed and seized as evidence by the JCSO and charges of possession of firearm by certain persons will be filed.

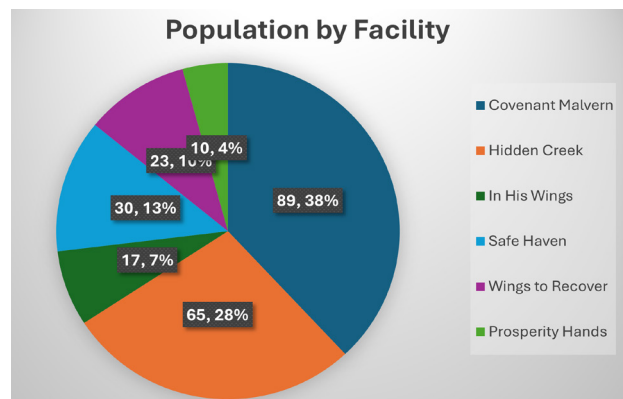

REENTRY PROGRAM CONTINUED:**REENTRY OFFICERS:**

In February, 145 Reentry residents was reported to be employed and 54 residents were reported to be ineligible for employment at this time. Reentry Officers reported 9 education referrals, which resulted in enrollments.

Reentry Officers conducted 206 reentry facility office visits, 141 Phase IV office visits, 73 Phase IV home visits and 55 pre-parole plan verifications. Reentry Officers made 52 community contacts within their assigned area during the month and conducted 45 office visits in their area. There was 3 Good Grid classes conducted across the state with 11 in attendance. 3 job fair was held with 25 in attendance. 2

Department workforce classes were held with 28 in attendance.

TRANSITIONAL HOUSING:

There are 13 licensed vendor facilities with 509 beds (362 DOC funded) in the facilities. Within the transitional facilities, there are 180 residents who have obtained full-time employment.

In February, 197 residents who previously received their GED or high school diploma with 3 residents were enrolled in GED courses. During the month, there were 37 registered sex offenders living in transitional facilities.

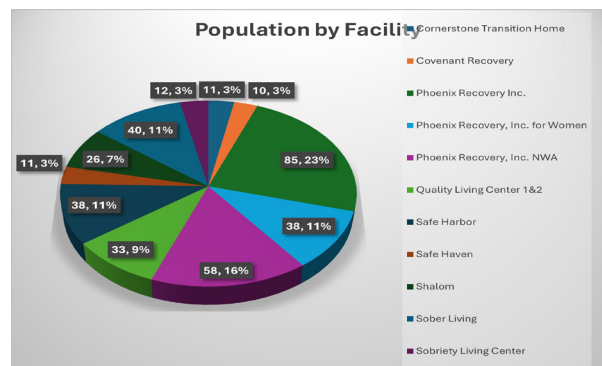
A total of 17 residents received their driver's license, 96 received an ID card, 105 received their Social Security card and 14 received birth certificates.

A total of 51 residents graduated from the Transitional Housing program, 26 absconded and 14 were dismissed.

REENTRY PROGRAM:**REENTRY FACILITIES:**

As of February 28, ACC had six licensed Reentry Facilities with 234 total residents in Phases I-IV of the Reentry program. Since the program began, there have been 3,477 individuals who have successfully completed and graduated from the program.

During the month, 21 residents were enrolled in CRC with 17 completed CRC. 4 residents enrolled and completed Wage. A total of 19 Reentry Facility residents received their driver's license, 29 received an ID card, 29 received their Social Security Cards, 9 received birth certificates.

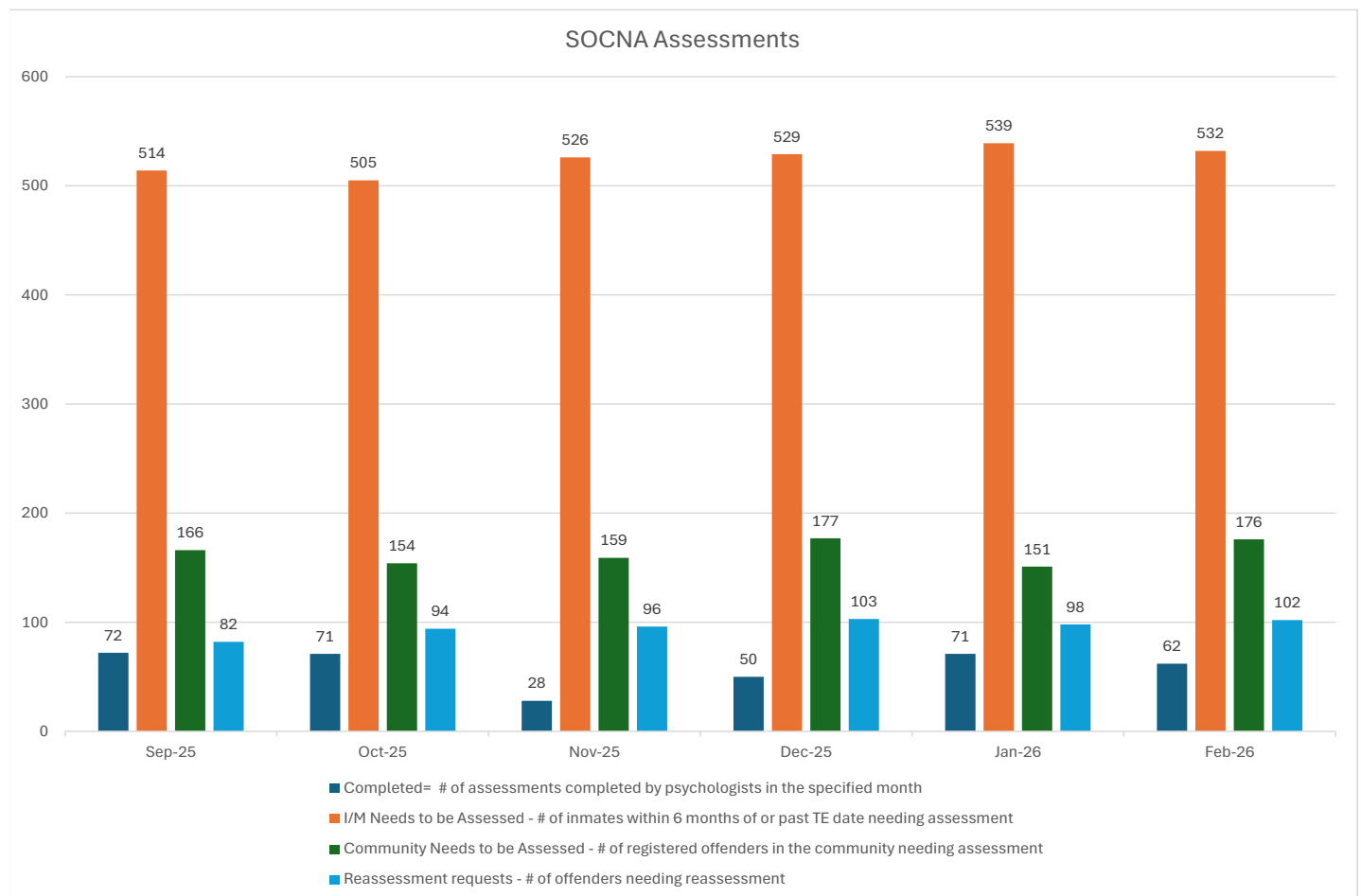

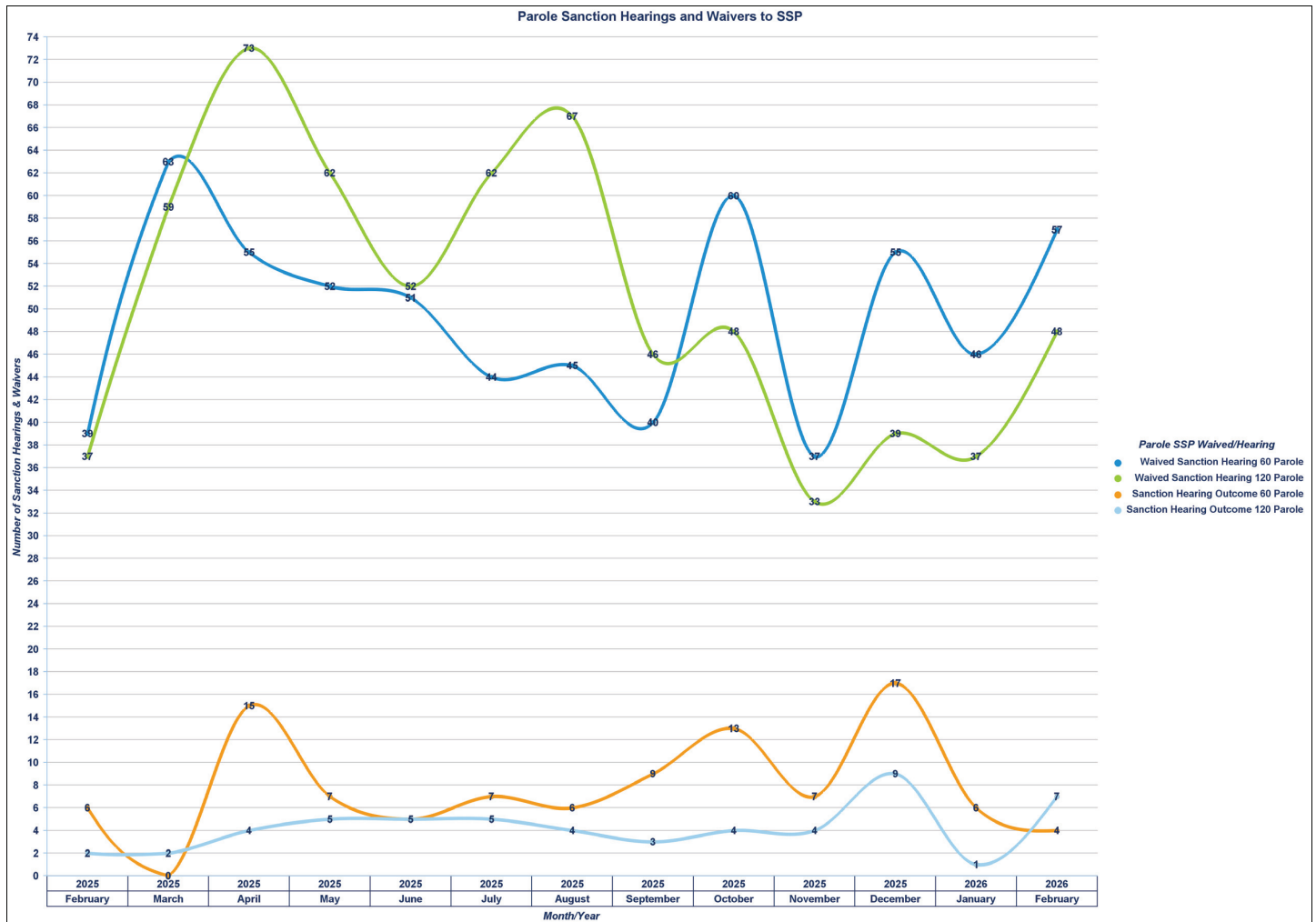
