COMMUNITY SUPERVISION AREA HIGHLIGHTS:

AREA 1

On April 16, 2026, DEA Task Force Officer/Agent of the Arkansas Department of Corrections – Division of Community Correction, Community Supervision Services, Area 1 (Benton County), participated in an operational briefing with personnel from the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), and the Benton County Special Operations Unit (BCSOU) regarding a planned narcotics enforcement operation targeting active and inactive offenders. Offenders were suspected of involvement in the sale and distribution of methamphetamine within the Northwest Arkansas region. The DEA developed actionable intelligence indicating Offenders were in possession of Methamphetamines and firearms. It should also be noted that information was also received that Offenders had made threats against law enforcement and that they wouldn't be taken alive if police tried to take into custody. On the same date, a warrantless search of the residence was executed pursuant to Offenders search waivers. Upon our arrival to the residence, contact was made with both subjects in the front yard. They were both detained without incident. During the search of the offender's residence, the following was located; a clear plastic baggie containing approximately 6.12 grams of suspected methamphetamines, multiple items of drug paraphernalia with residue used to ingest methamphetamines, a silver .25 ACP handgun with white grips, a box of .25 ACP ammunition, plastic bag with a white crystal substance, several plastic bags with white crystal residue, Ziploc box with new bags, and a white digital scale. During the search of a vehicle, a fully functioning dash mounted blue emergency lighting system was also located. Offenders were taken into custody and transported to the Benton County Detention Center without further incident.

AREA 2

On April 2, Community Supervision Officer Jeremy Wilson conducted a home visit, with the assistance of Deputy Tanner Anderson of Baxter County Sheriff's Department, at the Executive Inn in Mountain Home. Officers observed the offender's girlfriend hiding an item behind the bedframe. Deputy Anderson retrieved the item and discovered a small bag containing a white powdery substance believed to be methamphetamine. The Criminal Investigative Division was contacted to assist. A further search of the offender's living area yielded the discovery of multiple items of drug paraphernalia; including pipes and straws containing a white substance. In addition, more than five cellular phones and an Xbox were found that had not been registered with the city or county, which would not have been a problem for most, but the offender is a registered sex offender. A more thorough search into the electronic devices yielded the discovery of social media accounts that had not been registered. The offender was taken into custody and is currently serving a 90-day parole revocation.

AREA 3

In April, Intensive Supervision Officer Chad Hale completed a 40 hour Sniper Tactical Employment Course. Upon successful completion of the course, Officer Hale received the title "Sniper Operations Officer". This is an elite and unique title. It signifies an officer who is trained to operate beyond the traditional role of a Police Sniper. It represents the diverse capabilities possessed by the officer. This course covered the basics of rifle marksmanship and technical courses of fire. The primary focus of the course is the tactical employment and operations of the law enforcement sniper and reconnaissance officer.

AREA 4

On 4-22-26, Agents Hook, Busby and Jackson of the Jonesboro Office attended a ribbon cutting ceremony and proclamation from the Mayor of Jonesboro at the newly opened Sexual Assault Support Service operated by the Family Crisis Center. This facility conducts sexual assault exams and provides other services for victims/families (mental health, continued care, ect). This event was attended by many members of the community; notably Mayor Harold Copenhaver, Sheriff Elect Jason Allen, Deputy Prosecutor Andrew Nadzam, The Jonesboro Regional Chamber of Commerce, Hope Found, St. Bernards Hospital, as well as several other civic organizations and law enforcement agency representatives. Agent Hook has a special interest in this organization as his wife is a Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner for the center. The mayor read a proclamation and congratulated the staff for the many accomplishments as well as the recognition of the special people they are to provide the servicesfor. The Jonesboro Community Supervision Office is proud to support this organization in continuing to provide a dire need to sexual assault victims. See attached photos taken at the event.

AREA 5

On 04/16/26, Area 5 CPS- Becky Hutchison attended the ribbon cutting ceremony at the Johnson County Public Library in Clarksville. The library celebrated a beautiful new conference room that is open to the community and enhanced building facade. In addition to the new headquarters of the Arkansas

River Valley Reginal Library System. For several years, ACC and the Johnson County Library have joined forces to better assist justice involved individuals. Librarian James Ritchie and CPS Hutchison have worked together putting on job skills classes at the Johnson County Detention Center and ACC sponsored job fairs.

AREA 6

On April 22, 2026, the Pope County Community Supervision Office teamed up with the Russellville Police Department to conduct a sex offender compliance check. These checks are vital to keeping our community safe. Officers verified that each offender's address, place of employment, vehicles they have access to, online accounts or social media profiles, and other required information were current and accurate. During the check, approximately 30 offenders were found to be out of compliance and were arrested and/or sanctioned according to policy.

AREA 7/8

On Friday, April 17, 2026, at approximately 0930 hours, LR-ISP Officers were advised that Carter, William ADC 169981, had checked in to the lobby per the instructions he was given by his Parole Officer, D. Bowie. Bowie was informed by a credible source that Carter was making threats via text which were provided via screen shot and was in possession of a firearm at his residence. Bowie relayed this information to LR-ISP, and upon further investigation and surveillance it was deemed to be credible information. On the morning of April 17, 2026, Carter was taken into custody by LR-ISP for questioning. Carter admitted to being in possession of a firearm and drugs at his residence. Carter was transported to his residence located at 3606 Orange St. NLR, AR, which is his reported address, and to which he had a key in his possession.

Upon arriving at the residence, LR-ISP along with Officer Whitaker from NLRPD made entry into the residence and cleared the home for officer safety. A Probation and Parole compliance check was conducted of the residence. During the search of the residence, officers discovered green veggie like matter consistent with Marijuana (amount unknown at the time of this writing), on the coffee table in the living room, furthermore a black 9mm Smith & Wesson semi-automatic pistol was discovered, which had a fully loaded magazine and a round in the chamber, located underneath a rocking chair in the living room. All evidence discovered and seized were turned over the NLRPD for prosecution, along with the offender. Carter was transported to Pulaski County Jail for booking.

AREA 9

On 03/24/2026, Area 9 Transport Team CSO Charles Maxwell and CSO Melvin Pitts transported Offender Josh Huston from Durrant Oklahoma to Sevier County Detention Center in De Queen for Area 9 Ashdown Office.

AREA 10

04/01/2026: CSA Tiffani Childers and CSA Jennifer Starkey conducted a home visit on Justen Ford PID 0369569. When officers pulled up to the house, Ford and his dad were sitting in the garage and his mother was raking leaves. Ford walked up to the vehicle and was very nervous and fidgeting. Agent Starkey asked him if they had been smoking meth due to a past conversation that she had with Ford where he told her

that he had been using with his dad. Ford was very nervous but stated yes they had been smoking in the garage. Agents got out of the vehicle and had Ford sit on the porch. Agent Starkey went into the garage and conducted a search of the area the two had been sitting. She located a glass pipe in the basket on the motorized scooter. The pipe was in a gray, eyeglass holder along with a torch lighter. Ford's dad had been sitting on the scooter and Ford was sitting next to him when we pulled up. HSCSO was called at this time. Agents conducted a search of the house after he stated that there was more meth inside. He told officers that the meth was in the top drawer in his parents bedroom. Agents conducted a search of the bedroom and located a clear container that contained suspected methamphetamine and a glass pipe in the top drawer of the bedside dresser, Ford's mom confirmed that it was the dad's side of the bed. Marijuana was also located in the bedroom. Deputy Looney took the evidence and Ford's father was taken into custody. Ford was not arrested at this time. Officers located 10.3 grams of methamphetamine and .9 grams of marijuana.

AREA 11

On 4-23-26 Agent Parker received a phone call stating that offender Manes was running around with Absconder William Evans ADC 156937 and had stolen guns and were using methamphetamines and were staying in a camper somewhere off of Cross Roads Road in Kingsland but did not know the address. When offender Manes arrived for office visit she was placed in restraints and advised she was going to be transported to her residence for a verification of her residence. While being transported by Agents Parker and Jordan Agent Parker asked her about the camper she was actually living in she stated it was given to her by Jimmy Don her boyfriend but did not remember how to get there or the address. Agent Parker told her he knew where it was and she needed to cooperate and stop lying. She stated she did not remember the address or how to get there but it is on Charles Evans property that used to also belong to Steve Nowlin. Agent Parker having supervised both Charles Evans and Steve Nowlin knew the address to be 2560 Pump Station Road Kingsland, Arkansas 71652. Agent Parker then asked whose camper it was and she again confirmed it was hers and was given to her by Jimmy Don. Agent Parker called the Cleveland County Sheriffs department and requested deputies assist in case absconder William Evans was there with guns. Two deputies from the Cleveland County Sherffis Deputy Jacob and Deputy Creaux met Agents and went to the residence. Upon arrival there was a long driveway blocked by a gate. When Agent Parker got out to open the gate he observed William Evans in front of the camper when Evans spotted the Agents and Deputies he went around to the back of the camper out of sight. Agent Parker opened the gate and Agents and Deputies drove to the camper. Agent Parker advised Deputies and Agent Jordan to provide cover while he went to see if he was in the camper. Agent Parker went to the camper saw the door open and visually confirmed Evans was not inside and had ran into the woods. Agent Parker called the Deputies up and he and Jordan began to search the camper. Inside a cabinet Agent Jordan located a glass methamphetamine pipe. Inside an eye glass container a Glass methamphetamine pipe and empty baggies were located. Inside a small safe inside the oven two broken methamphetamines pipes were located. Inside an x-box case a small baggie of marijuana was located. Deputies declined to file charges based on the paraphernalia and marijuana. It was disposed of and Manes was instructed to report to the office 4-27-27.

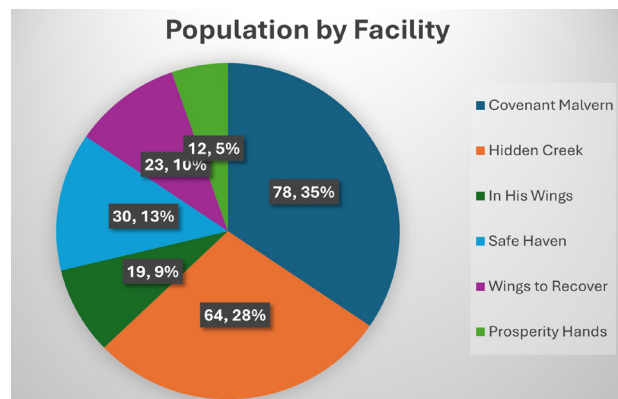

REENTRY PROGRAM CONTINUED:

REENTRY OFFICERS:

In April, 161 Reentry residents was reported to be employed and 17 residents were reported to be ineligible for employment at this time. Reentry Officers reported 8 education referrals, which resulted in enrollments.

Reentry Officers conducted 196 reentry facility office visits, 142 Phase IV office visits, 78 Phase IV home visits and 62 pre-parole plan verifications. Reentry Officers made 70 community contacts within their assigned area during the month and conducted 70 office visits in their area. There was 1 Good Grid class conducted across the state with 34 in attendance, 13 job fairs were held with 139 in attendance and 10 Department workforce class was held with 25 in attendance



TRANSITIONAL HOUSING:

There are 13 licensed vendor facilities with 493 beds (413 DOC funded) in the facilities. Within the transitional facilities, there are 229 residents who have obtained full-time employment.

In April, 266 residents who previously received their GED or high school diploma. During the month, there were 35 registered sex offenders living in transitional facilities.

A total of 22 residents received their driver's license, 77 received an ID card, 96 received their Social Security card and 8 received birth certificates.

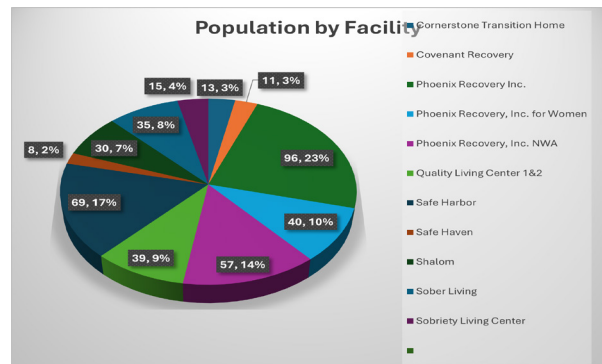
A total of 60 residents graduated from the Transitional Housing program, 28 absconded and 19 were dismissed.

REENTRY PROGRAM:

REENTRY FACILITIES:

As of April 3, ACC had six licensed Reentry Facilities with 226 total residents in Phases I-IV of the Reentry program. Since the program began, there have been 3,477 individuals who have successfully completed and graduated from the program.

During the month, 3 residents completed CRC and 2 residents were enrolled in GED. 6 residents enrolled in Wage with 6 completing. A total of 26 Reentry Facility residents received their driver's license, 16 received an ID card, 28 received their Social Security Cards, 16 received birth certificates.

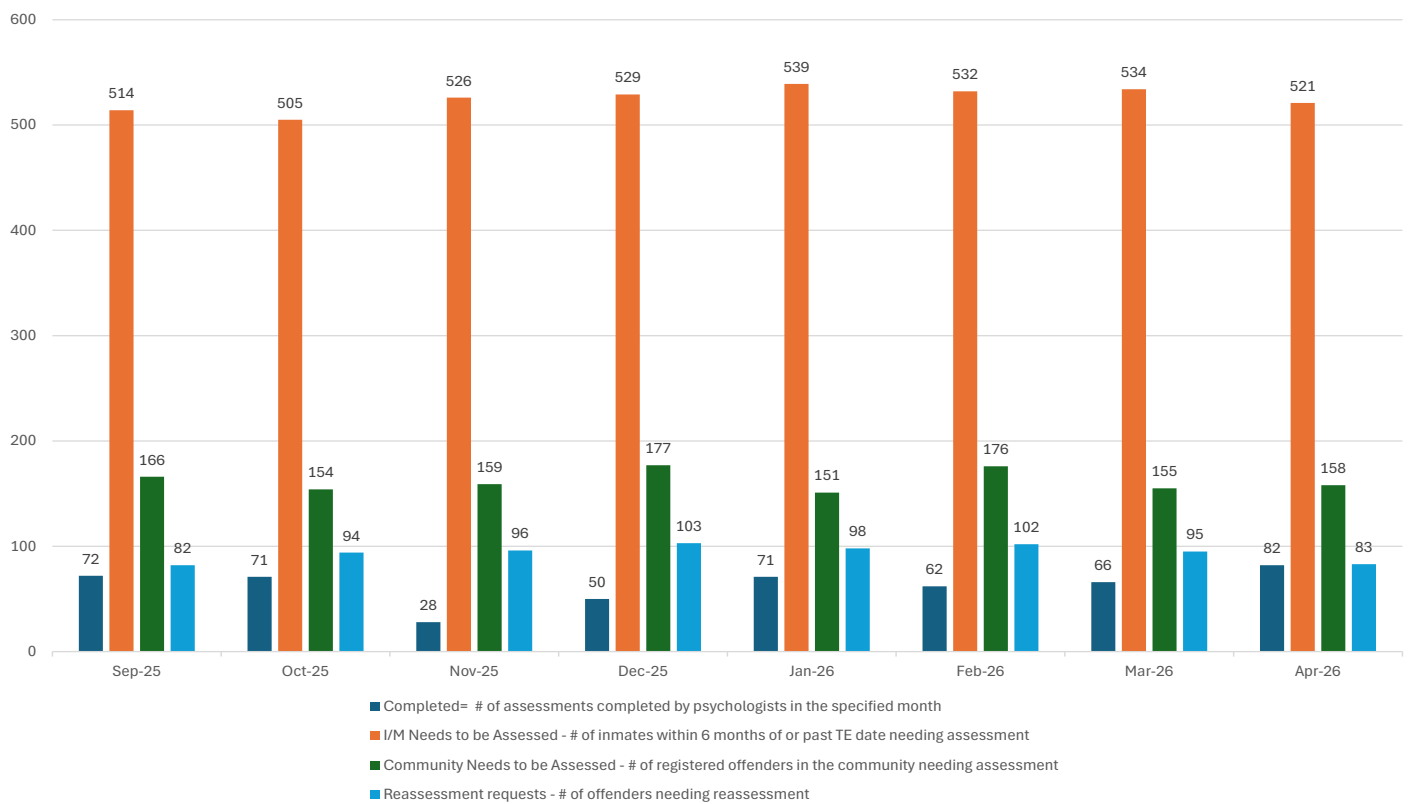

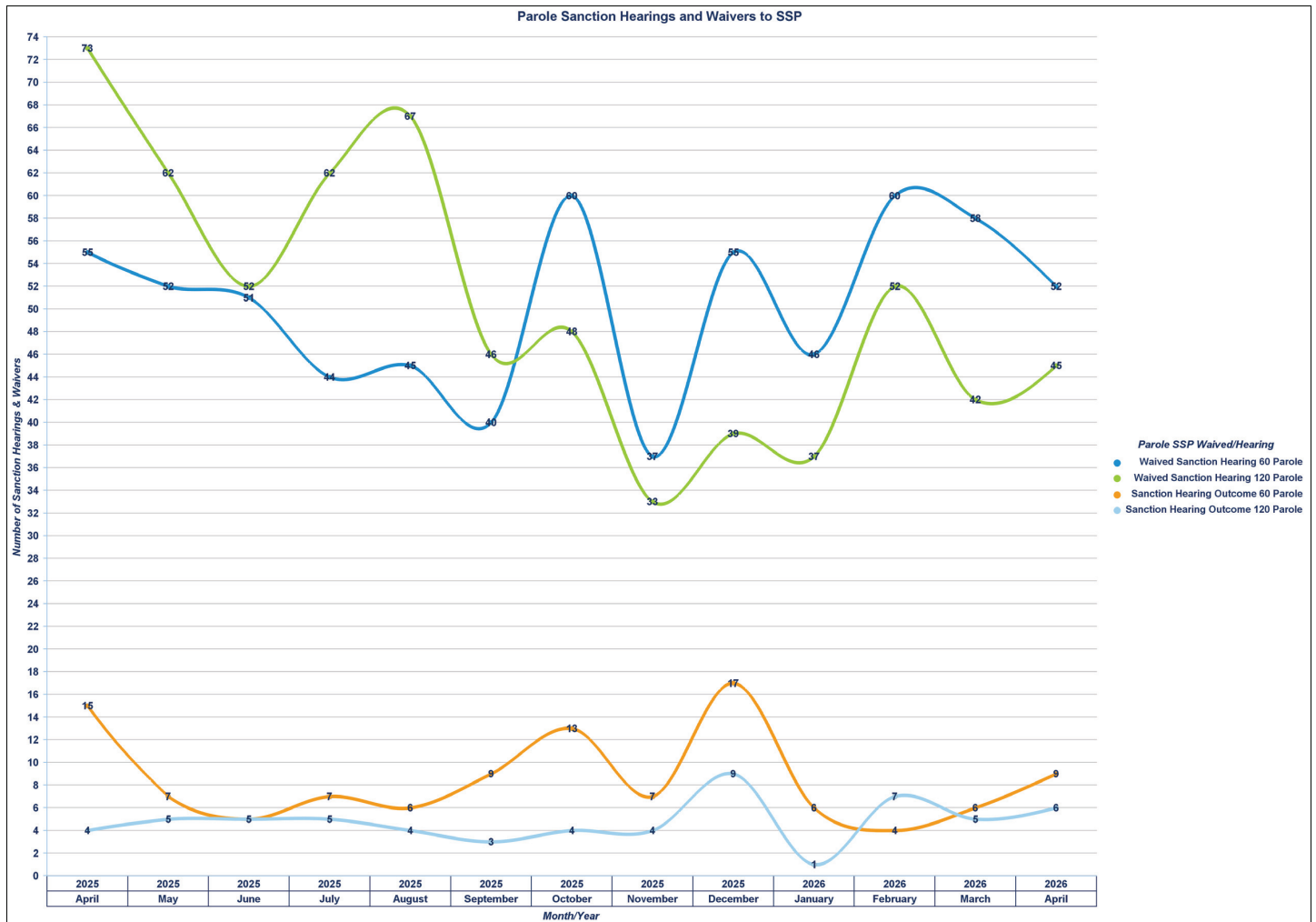
