POPULATION REPORT

RESEARCH/PLANNING

May 2026 Admissions and Releases – Admissions for May 2026 totaled 287 (245-males and 42-females) while releases totaled 310 (264-males and 46-females) for a net decrease of 23 inmates.

Inmate Population Growth/Projection – At the end of May 2026, the jurisdictional population for the Division of Correction totaled 19,454, representing an increase of 395 inmates since the first of January 2026. At reporting time, calendar year 2026 has seen a increase of 79 inmates per month, which is down from an average monthly increase of 18 inmates per month during calendar year 2025.

Average County Jail Backup – The backup in the county jails averaged 2,308 inmates per day during the month of May 2026, which was up from the per-day average of 2,180 inmates during the month of April 2026. Of the 2,308 average, short-term revocations averaged 63 during the month of May 2026.

INSTITUTIONS

INMATE INSTITUTIONAL GRIEVANCES

Inmate Formal/Informal Grievances: During May, a total of 1,061 formal grievances and 1,441 informal grievances were filed at various ADC Facilities.

Institutional Grievances Appeals: There was a total of 419 appeals of institutional grievances received in May. Of those, 277 were acknowledged and 142 were rejected for various reasons. Of the total, 319 appeals answered, 314 had no merit and 5 had merit.

Resident Formal/Informal Grievances: During May, a total of 59 formal grievances and 288 informal grievances were filed at various Residential Centers.

Institutional Grievances Appeals: There was 56 appeals of institutional grievances received in May. Of those, 33 was acknowledged and 23 were rejected for various reasons.

FARM DIVISION

Row Crop/Garden Division - Corn, soybeans and rice have been planted at all locations. All units are harvesting vegetables.

Beef-herd/hay Division- Started breeding heifers and cutting/baling hay.

Dairy Division- Milk production is staying steady.

Poultry Division- Egg production has increased.

There are 2,272 males on the waiting list for RSVP and 33 females on the waiting list for SOFT who are within five years of their TE date. Of those, three (3) inmates are mandated by the Post Prison Transfer Board.

The average time on the waiting list from request is between one and two months for those stipulated.

*The total on the waiting list, including those not currently within the identified time frame, is 2,568 males and zero females. Of these, 1,341 is eligible and 1,227 are ineligible for the program. There is one (1) PREA inmate in the program at this time.

*Ineligibility is due to being in restrictive housing, having class IV status, or receiving a major disciplinary within the last 60 days.

Ouachita River Correctional Unit (ORCU) Residential Program Unit (RPU):

The RPU had 2 admissions and 8 discharges in May for an end-of-month count of 102.

McPherson Unit Mental Health Residential Program Unit (RPU):

There were 3 admissions and 1 discharges in May for an end-of-month count of 31.

Habilitation Program:

The Habilitation Program at the Ouachita River Correctional Unit provided treatment services to 38 inmates in May. There was no admissions or discharges, which resulted in an end-of-month count of 38.

Suicide:

There were 128 suicidal threats in May. There were 6 attempts, 1 of which resulted in death.

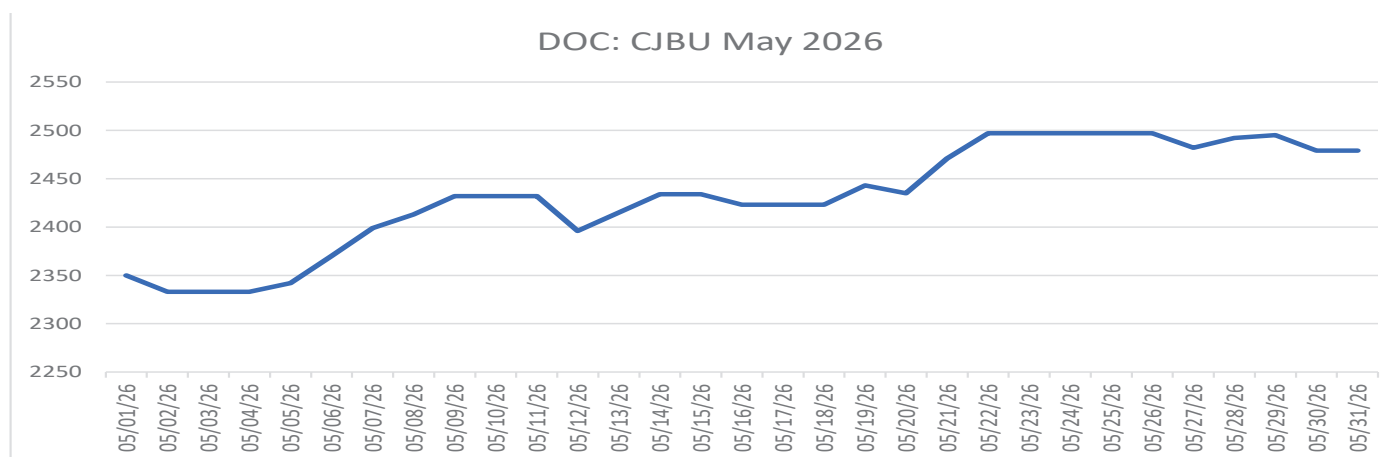
County Jail Back-up Average for May, 2026 - 2,308

County Jail Back-up Fiscal Year Average as of May 31, 2026

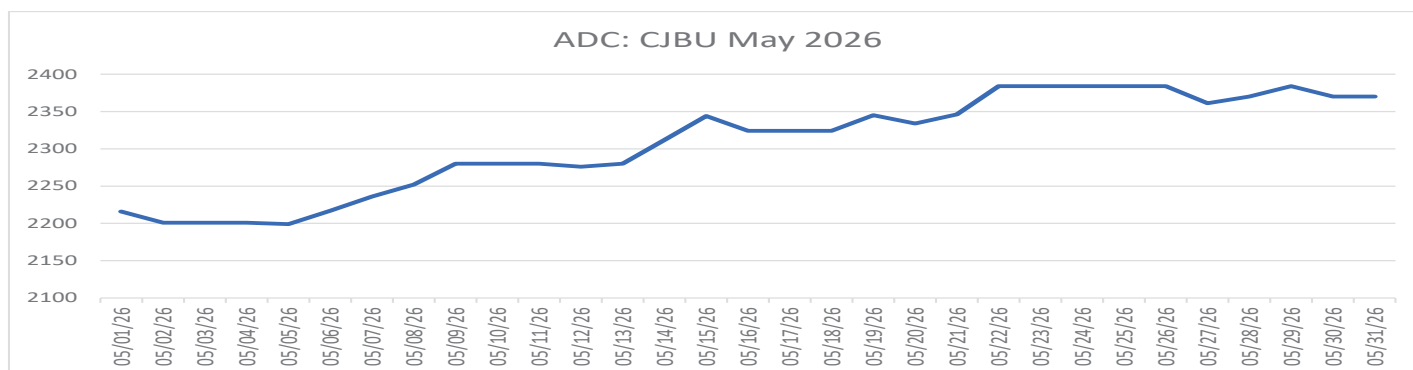
Short-Term Revocation Program Average for May, 2026 - 63

Short-Term Revocation Fiscal Year Average as of May 31, 2026 - 91

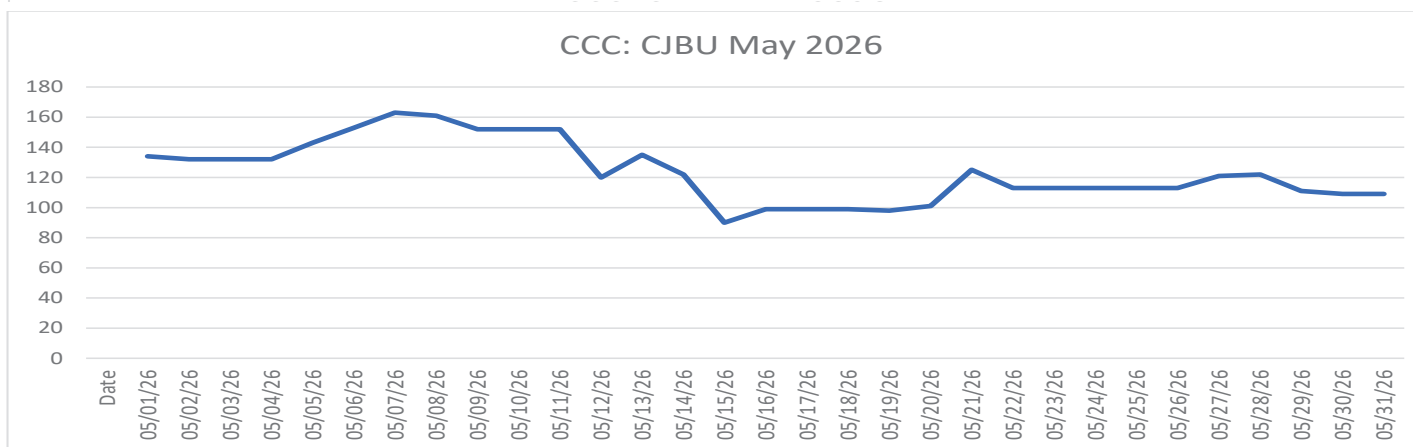
COUNTY JAIL BACKUP - MAY 2026

ORAS Prison Intake Tool (PIT) Assessments

Per Act 769, every incarcerated individual must be assessed by January 1, 2027. Therefore, the Quality Improvement and Program Evaluation (QI/PE) team has been organizing mass assessments throughout ADC. As of June 2, 2026, the QI/PE team and ACC- and ADC-ORAS certified staff have assessed 13,426 individuals.

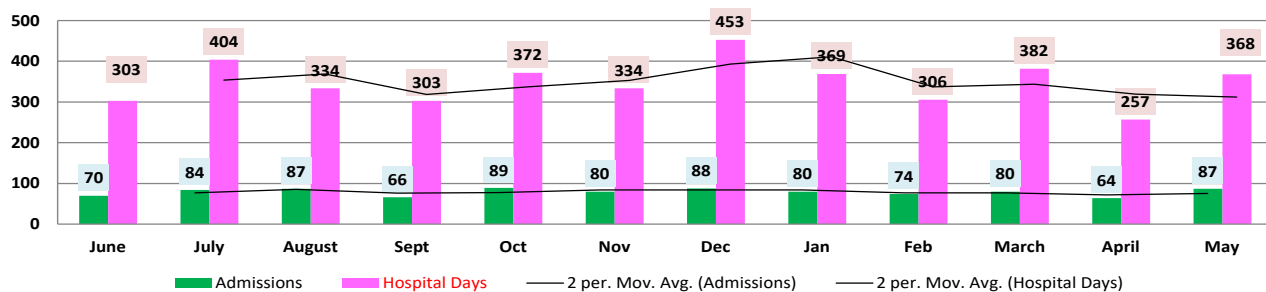

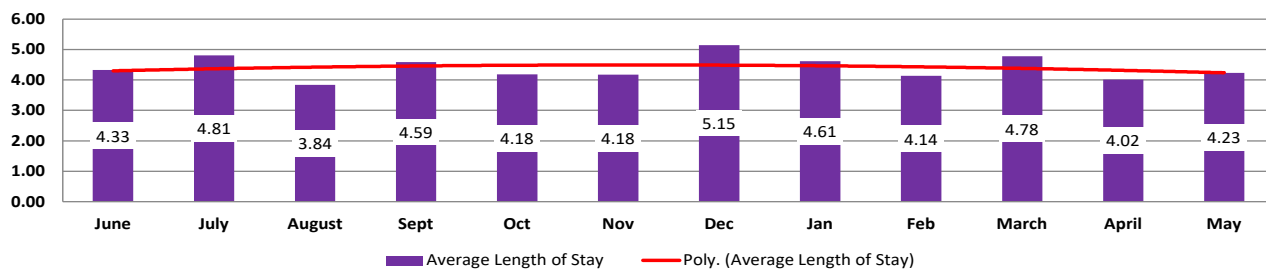

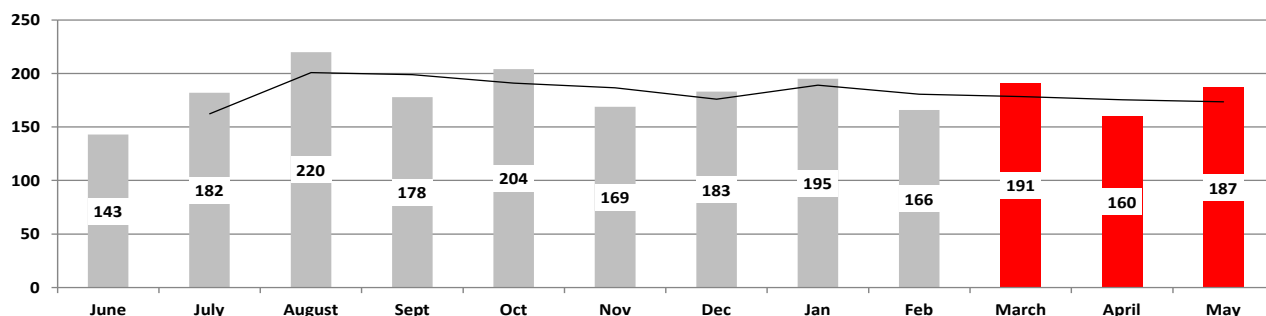
ADC Admissions & Hospital Days

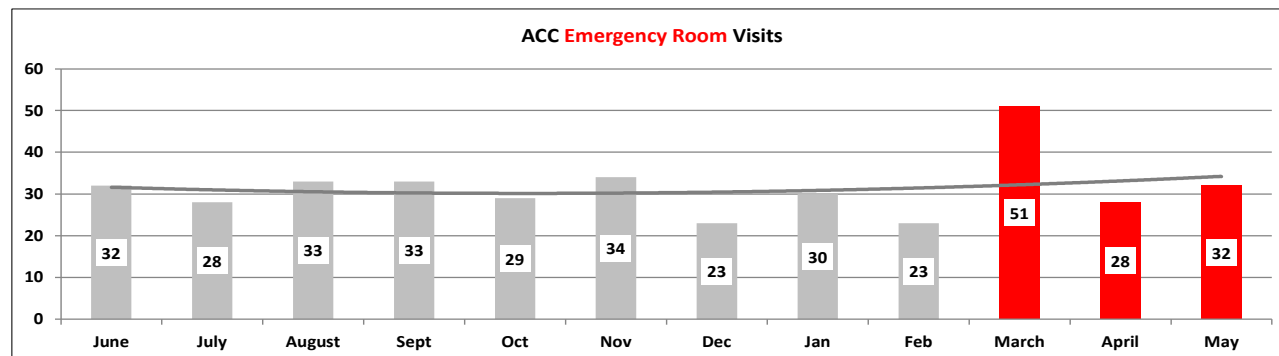
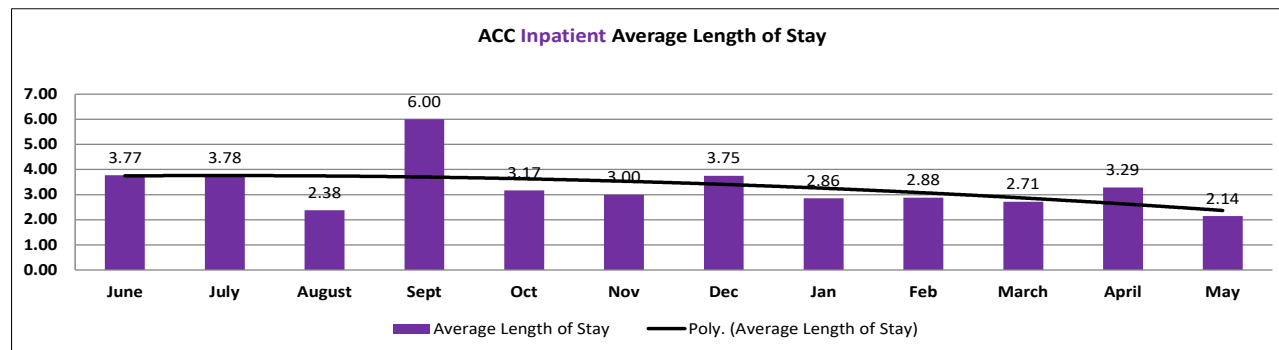
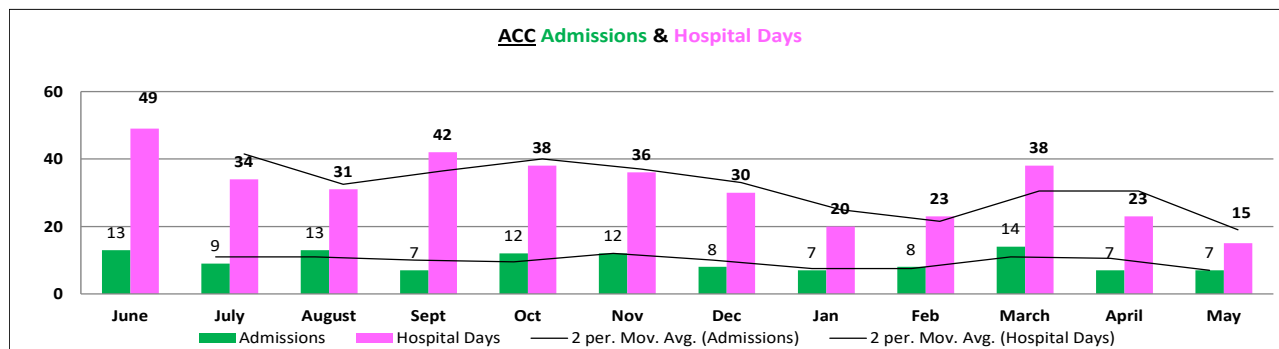
