POPULATION REPORT

RESEARCH/PLANNING

April 2026 Admissions and Releases – Admissions for April 2026 totaled 387 (328-males and 59-females) while releases totaled 335 (292-males and 43-females) for a net increase of 52 inmates.

Inmate Population Growth/Projection – At the end of April 2026, the jurisdictional population for the Division of Correction totaled **19,359**, representing an increase of **300** inmates since the first of January 2026. At reporting time, calendar year 2026 has seen a increase of **86** inmates per month, which is down from an average monthly increase of 18 inmates per month during calendar year 2025.

Average County Jail Backup – The backup in the county jails averaged **2,180** inmates per day during the month of April 2026, which was up from the per-day average of **2,112** inmates during the month of January 2026. Of the **2,1180** average, short-term revocations averaged **29** during the month of January 2026.

INSTITUTIONS

INMATE INSTITUTIONAL GRIEVANCES

Inmate Formal/Informal Grievances: During April, a total of 1,135 formal grievances and 1,512 informal grievances were filed at various ADC Facilities.

Institutional Grievances Appeals: There was a total of 439 appeals of institutional grievances received in April. Of those, 298 were acknowledged and 141 were rejected for various reasons. Of the total, 331 appeals answered, 331 had no merit and 0 had merit.

Resident Formal/Informal Grievances: During April, a total of 53 formal grievances and 334 informal grievances were filed at various Residential Centers.

Institutional Grievances Appeals: There was 47 appeals of institutional grievances received in April. Of those, 19 was acknowledged and 28 were rejected for various reasons.

There are 2,272 males on the waiting list for RSVP and 33 females on the waiting list for SOFT who are within five years of their TE date. Of those, three (3) inmates are mandated by the Post Prison Transfer Board.

The average time on the waiting list from request is between one and two months for those stipulated.

*The total on the waiting list, including those not currently within the identified time frame, is 2,568 males and zero females. Of these, 1,341 is eligible and 1,227 are ineligible for the program. There is one (1) PREA inmate in the program at this time.

*Ineligibility is due to being in restrictive housing, having class IV status, or receiving a major disciplinary within the last 60 days.

Ouachita River Correctional Unit (ORCU) Residential Program Unit (RPU):

The RPU had 11 admissions and 15 discharges in April for an end-of-month count of 108.

McPherson Unit Mental Health Residential Program Unit (RPU):

There were 2 admissions and 2 discharges in April for an end-of-month count of 29.

Habilitation Program:

The Habilitation Program at the Ouachita River Correctional Unit provided treatment services to 38 inmates in April. There was 1 admissions and 1 discharges, which resulted in an end-of-month count of 38.

Suicide:

There were 171 suicidal threats in April. There were 8 attempts, none of which resulted in death.

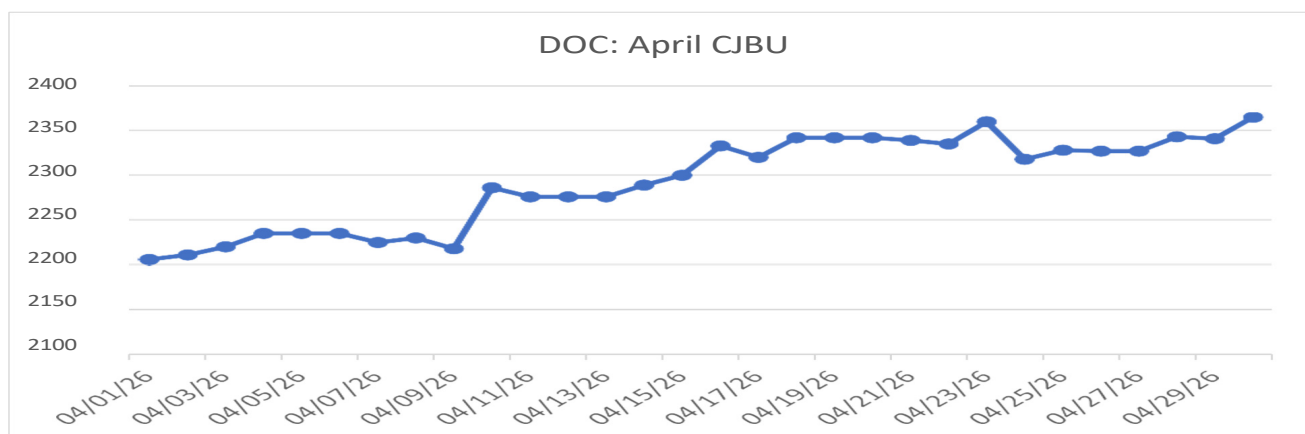
County Jail Back-up Average for April, 2026 - 2,180

County Jail Back-up Fiscal Year Average as of April 30,, 3036 - 1,880

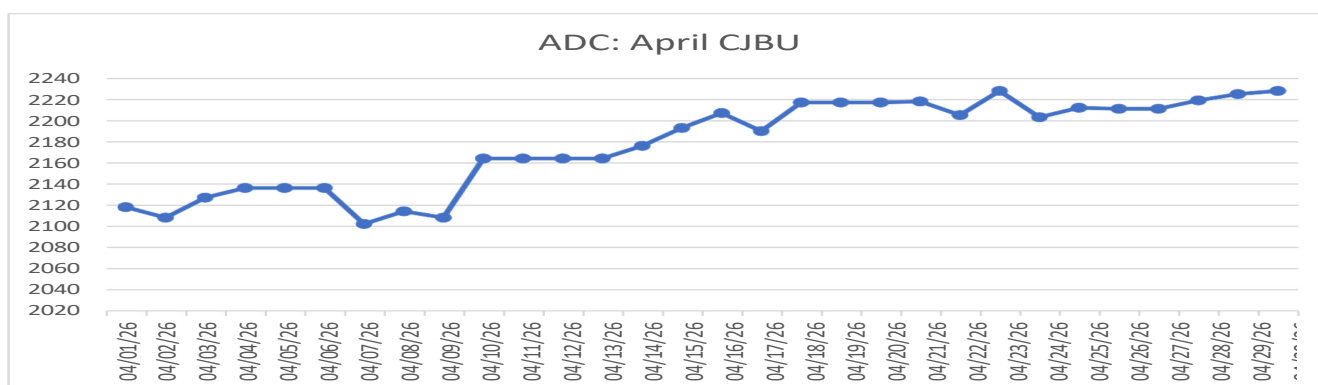
Short-Term Revocation Program Average for April, 2026 - 29

Short-Term Revocation Fiscal Year Average as of April 30, 2026 - 94

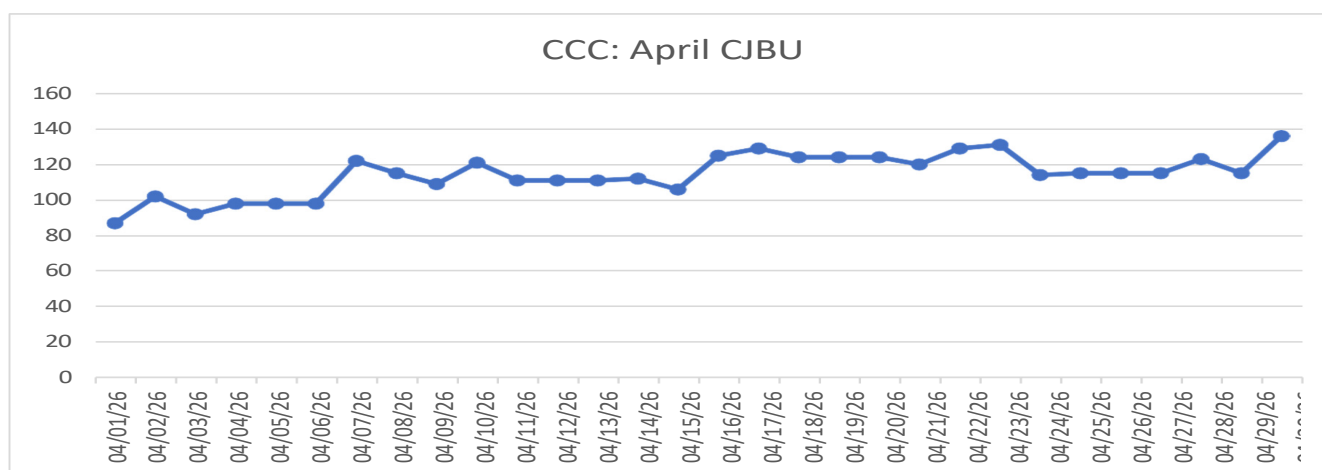
COUNTY JAIL BACKUP - JANUARY 2026

ORAS Prison Intake Tool (PIT) Assessments

Per Act 769, every incarcerated individual must be assessed by January 1, 2027. Therefore, the Quality Improvement and Program Evaluation (QI/PE) team has been organizing mass assessments throughout ADC. As of May 7, 2026, the QI/PE team and ACC- and ADC-ORAS certified staff have assessed 12,188 individuals.

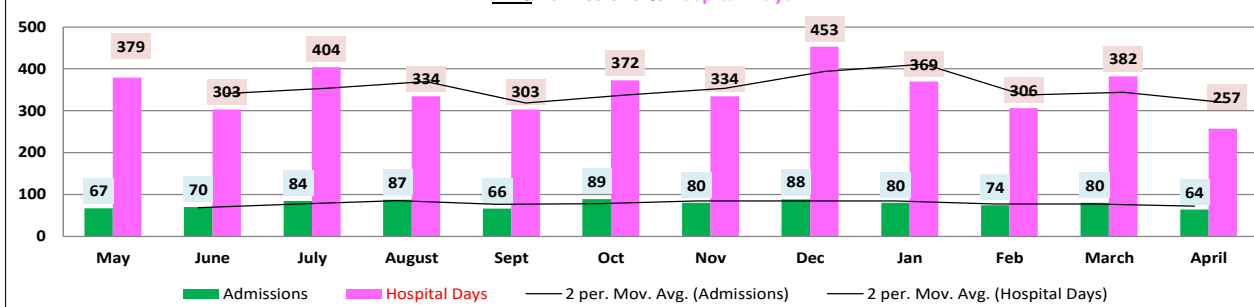

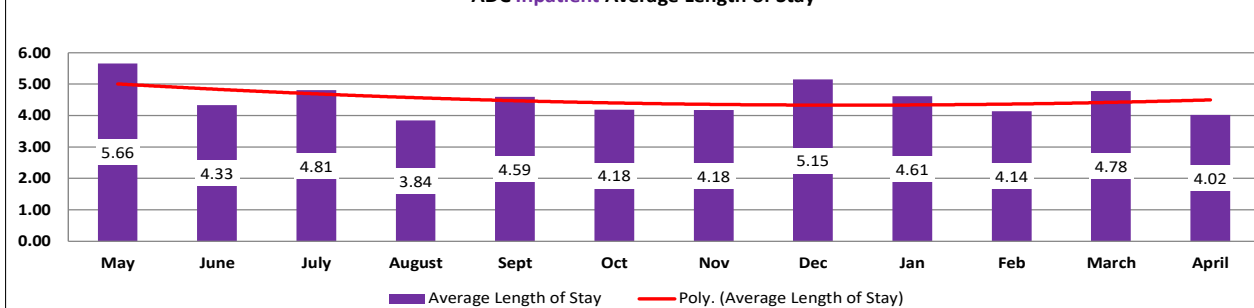

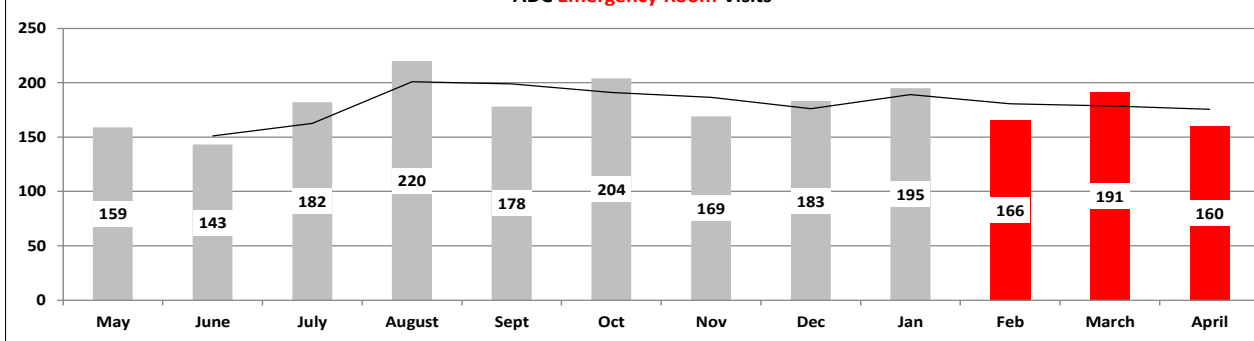
ADC Admissions & Hospital Days

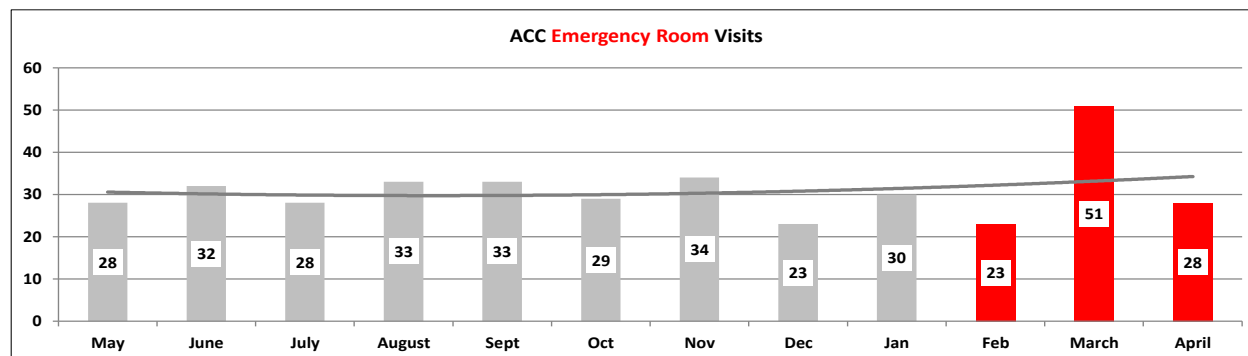
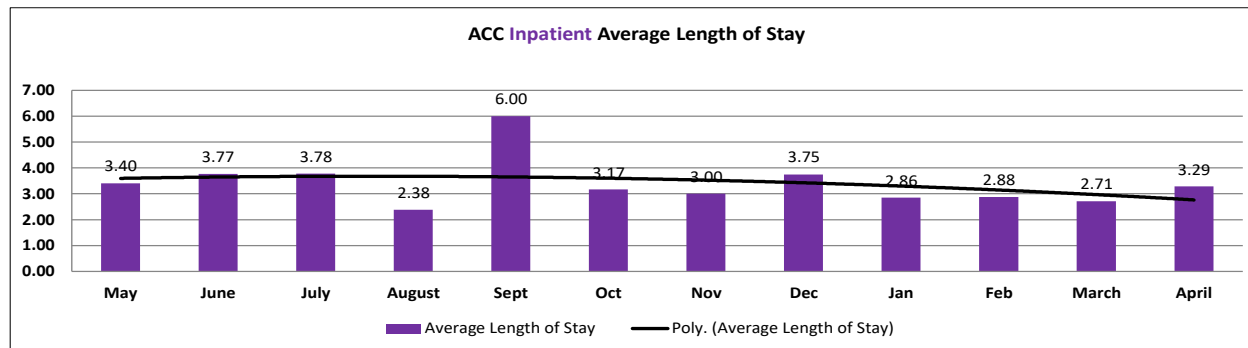
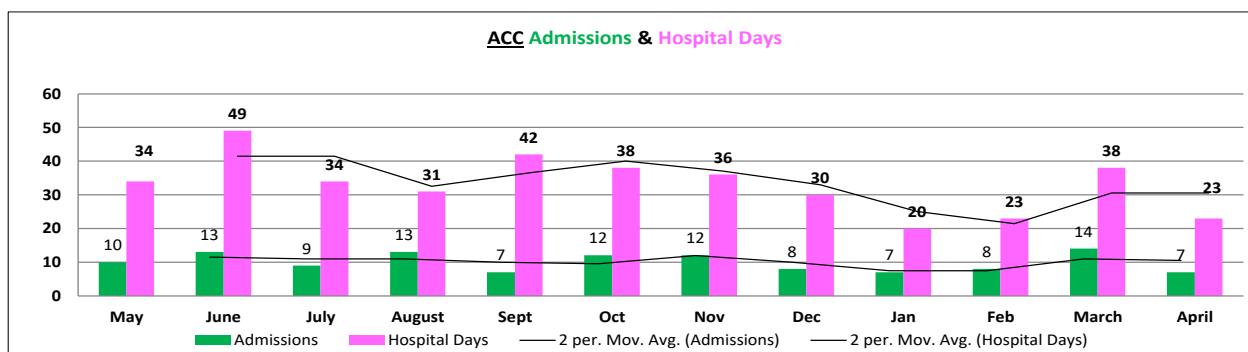
