POPULATION REPORT

RESEARCH/PLANNING

April 2020 Admissions and Releases – Admissions for April 2020 totaled 477 (403-males & 74-females) while releases totaled 648 (537-males & 111 females) for a decrease in-house of 171 inmates.

Inmate Population Growth/Projection – At the end of April 2020, the jurisdictional population for the Division of Correction totaled 17,331, representing a decrease of 428 inmates since the first of January 2020. Calendar year 2020 average has seen an average decrease of 107 inmates per month, which is up from an average monthly decrease of 3 inmates per month during calendar year 2019.

Average County Jail Back-up – The backup in the County Jails averaged 972 inmates per day during the month of April 2020. Of the 972 average, short-term revocations accounted for 649 (581-males & 68-females) during the month.

INSTITUTIONS

PRISON RAPE ELIMINATION ACT (PREA)

Training conducted during the month of April consisted of “Roles and Responsibility of the PREA Compliance Manager,” a one-hour class provided via teleconference to seven staff members at the Ouachita River Correctional Unit.

INMATE INSTITUTIONAL GRIEVANCES

Inmate Formal/Informal Grievances: During April 2020, a total of 1,912 formal grievances and 3,144 informal grievances were filed at various units.

Institutional Grievances Appeals: There was a total of 513 appeals of institutional grievances received in April 2020. Of those, 408 were acknowledged and 105 were rejected for various reasons. Of the total 445 appeals answered, 442 had no merit and three were found with merit.

FARM

Wet conditions continued during April, but field work was done whenever there was opportunity and dry ground could be found. Corn planting was started at all three farms and rice was planted at Cummins. Winter wheat and oats at Cummins should be ready for harvesting in late May or early June. Corn at Cummins, that was originally being held for feed, was sold and shipped out.

The gardens are late as a result of the wet conditions, but some plants were able to be moved from the green houses to the fields as well as the direct seeding of some vegetables.

The beef herds have benefited from the warmer weather and green grass. With calving season almost over, plans will soon be underway for working and processing calves.

Confined livestock has been doing well. Milk production has been steady and the Somatic Cell Count has remained low. Egg production has continued meeting the needs of the Department.

ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICESDIVISION OF CORRECTIONTRAINING - APRIL 2020**BASIC TRAINING DIVISION –**

Under the direction of instructor David Farrier, **BCOT Class 2020-D** graduated on April 17 with a total of 41 cadets. An awards ceremony was held at the Willis H. Sargent Training Academy on April 10. Cory Cox of the Ouachita River Correctional Unit made the Dean's list. Deputy Warden Anthony Jackson of the Maximum Security Unit served as the guest speaker.

Sixty-eight cadets participated in an awards ceremony for instructor Kathleen Lowery's **BCOT Class 2020-E** on April 24. Christopher Bennett of the East Arkansas Regional Unit received the Willis H. Sargent Award. Cadets were scheduled to officially graduate on May 8, 2020, at their individual units.

IN-SERVICE DIVISION –

During the month of April, the Training Academy held a **Defensive Driving** class attended by five participants.

Due to COVID-19, all other scheduled training opportunities were suspended for the month.

eCADEMY –

During April, 918 ADC employees completed a total of 15,644 hours of eCADEMY training. About 20% of ADC employees completed at least one course during that timeframe, averaging 3.46 hours per staff member.

HEALTH/CORRECTIONAL PROGRAMSCHAPLAINCY SERVICES

All Facilities – During the month, the Chaplaincy Division at all facilities began delivering religious services virtually, over the video systems, including Jumu'ah Prayer.

Ramadan began on April 24, with the social distancing policy in effect due to COVID-19.

Maximum Security Unit – On April 20, The Madina Institute donated 17 prayer rugs and 20 copies of the Koran for the month of Ramadan.

Randall L. Williams Unit – On April 1, a Bible Study on the Book of Romans began with one lesson per week. The program lasts fourteen weeks. An average of 35 inmates are participating in the program. Information is being distributed to inmates in their housing areas due to COVID-19 and the social distancing policy.

The average time on the waiting list from request is between one and two months for those stipulated.

The total on the waiting list, including those not currently within the identified timeframe, is 1,409 males – 1,095 of whom are low risk on the ARORA, and nine females – three of whom are low risk on the ARORA. There is one PREA inmate in the program at this time.

There are 1,784 males and 204 females on the waiting list within 18 months of their release date. Of those, 69 are mandated by the Parole Board.

The average time on the waiting list from request is 21 days.

The total on the waiting list, including those not currently within the identified timeframe or ineligible due to class or housing status, is 2,850 males and 285 females; of these, 920 are low risk on the ARORA.

Substance Use Intervention Program: The Substance Use Intervention Program had seven admissions and 13 discharges for an end-of-month count of 31 for April. This program is housed at the Varner Unit and is for inmates found guilty of a disciplinary violation for drug use or drug possession.

Ouachita River Correctional Unit (ORCU) Residential Program Unit (RPU): The RPU had zero admissions and three discharges in April for an end-of-month count of 118.

McPherson Unit Mental Health Residential Program Unit (RPU): There were five admissions and five discharges in April for an end-of-month count of 54.

Habilitation Program: The Habilitation Program at the Ouachita River Correctional Unit provided treatment services to 46 inmates during April. There were two admissions and one discharge resulting in an end-of-month count of 45.

Anger Management Treatment: The Anger Management Treatment Program at the Cummins Unit provided treatment services to 31 inmates during April. There were zero admissions and two discharges for an end-of-month count of 29.

AGENCY HIGHLIGHTS

AGENCY-WIDE:

COVID-19

The ADC continued precautionary measures to fight the spread of COVID-19 including:

- On April 4, we began publishing on social media and the ADC website the latest statistics related to the COVID-19 positive status of our inmates and employees. The graphic is updated with the latest stats and published twice a week.

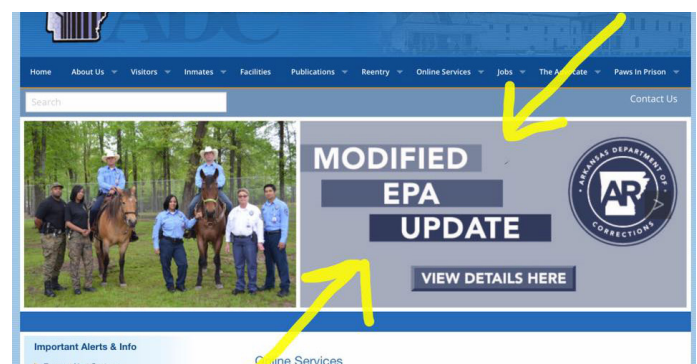
- On April 8, an announcement was made that the suspension of inmate visitation at the state's prisons and community correction centers will continue until June 1. Lower phone and video visitation rates remain in place through the duration of visitation suspension. ADC Director Payne stated, "I think we have taken great steps to help slow down the growth of COVID-19, and I feel at this time we must continue these practices to keep us on the right path."

- Thick plastic sheeting barriers were installed in correctional unit infirmaries to better protect inmates and staff from COVID-19. The barriers allow employees and inmates to see each other face-to-face without sharing germs. Several units installed the barriers in mental health and substance treatment areas as well.



Expanded Emergency Powers Act Invoked

On April 24, the Board of Corrections voted unanimously to invoke the expanded Emergency Powers Act and certify a list of 1,244 inmates as being eligible for consideration by the Parole Board. The list of inmates was larger than usual because the requirement that inmates must have spent at least six months in ADC before being considered was suspended. The suspension was authorized by Governor Asa Hutchinson's Executive Orders 20-06 and 20-16, regarding the public health emergency, and is in accordance with ACA 12-74-114.



Face Shields Produced In-House

When face shields that were ordered didn't arrive in a timely manner, ADC's Construction and Maintenance Division took matters into their own hands. Staff and inmates designed a prototype, cut out the materials and put together 250 face shields for use in ADC correctional units and community correction centers.



CUMMINS UNIT:***Protective Masks Produced by Garment Factory***

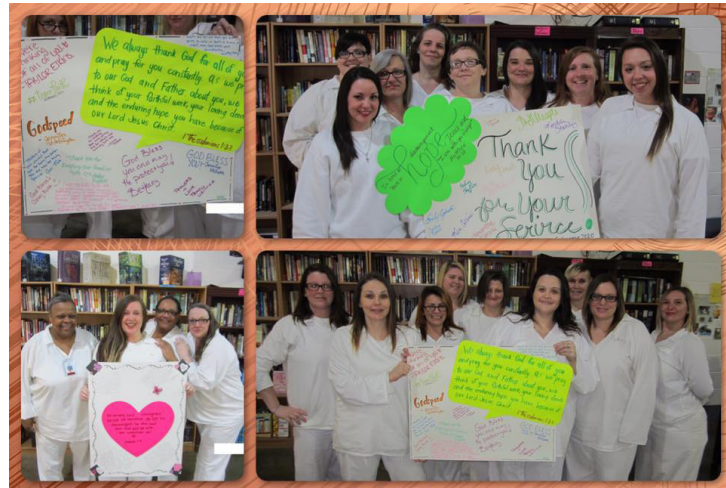
Inmates working in the garment factory at the Cummins Unit worked hard during the month of April sewing 80,000 protective masks to help fight the spread of COVID-19. White masks were made so that every inmate could have two and blue ones were made for staff and Wellpath employees. Extra masks were given to the Arkansas Division of Emergency Management for distribution to other state agencies.

Damage was done to the Maximum Security Unit at Tucker on the evening of April 12 when severe storms blew through. The roof was torn off the North Tower and a good deal of tin damage occurred along with shredding of plastic on the greenhouses. Fortunately, no staff or inmates were injured.

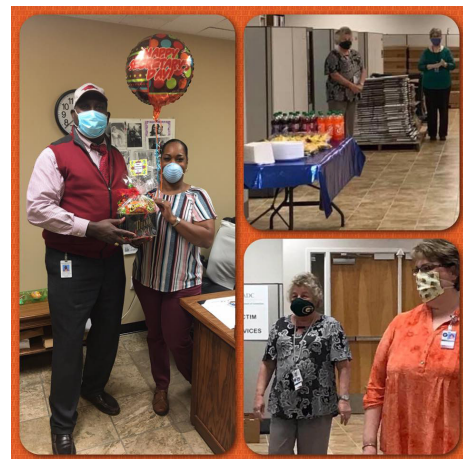
**McPHERSON UNIT:*****PAL Participants Create Thank You Posters***
