ACSD Central Office hosted a day of PD for juvenile justice educators on October 25<sup>th</sup>. Ameer McGuire, GED Teacher at McPherson, provided the following classroom management tips:



1. Be prepared.
2. Greet students with a positive attitude.
3. Be respectful and give students a fresh start.
4. Post your rules. Be confident in your rules and consistent in your enforcement.
5. Discipline students when rules are broken.
6. Reinforce good behavior by offering appropriate rewards.
7. Help students focus.



On August 1, 2021, NCCER testing changed from paper to online testing leaving our CTE students unable to test. The installation of thin clients has made it possible for NCCER testing to resume at Varner. Thin clients will soon be installed at McP, EARU, ORCU, PB, RLW, and Cummins Farm.
