MISSION

The Arkansas Division of Emergency Management (ADEM) provides efficient state level leadership, resources, and coordination for a comprehensive all-hazards approach to emergencies and disasters impacting Arkansas.

VISION

ADEM will be a recognized partner in Arkansas' emergency management system for providing quality protection, prevention, mitigation, response, and recovery to individuals and communities across the State.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this plan is to document the state's emergency management program through training, exercise, planning, and preparedness program priorities for 2026-2028. These priorities are linked to corresponding core capabilities, and, if applicable, a rationale based on existing strategic guidance, threat assessments, corrective actions from previous exercises, or other factors. This IPP identifies the training and exercises that will help organizations build and sustain the core capabilities needed to respond to future disasters, while aligning to national programs and guidance.

The IPP lays out ADEMs program priorities along with a combination of associated planning, training, exercise, and other preparedness efforts. It outlines the priorities established in the Integrated Preparedness Planning Workshop (IPPW). These priorities correspond with the regional and state Threat and Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (THIRA). A progressive, multiyear exercise program enables ADEM and its emergency management partners to participate in exercises, with each successive exercise building upon the previous one until proficiency is achieved. Further, by including training requirements in the planning process, organizations can address known gaps and priority areas prior to exercising capabilities.

ADEM is committed to the ongoing improvement of the all-hazards emergency response, recovery, mitigation, preparedness, and protection posture of the State of Arkansas. The implementation of the components in this plan is a reflection of our dedication to the safety and wellbeing of the citizens in the State of Arkansas.

Arkansas' IPP describes the training and exercise strategy that enables the State to achieve the goals listed in Homeland Security Presidential Directives (HSPD) -8, the National Response Framework (NRF), and the National Exercise Program (NEP).

The 2026-2028 IPP coordinated input from the seven ADEM areas, Emergency Support Functions (ESFs), and other stakeholders.

To prevent, protect, respond to, mitigate, and recover from incidents affecting the State of Arkansas, whether technical or natural, ADEM and its partner agencies embrace the capability-based approach to training and exercising. The State has identified a need to coordinate planning, training, and exercising to strengthen the State's overall preparedness. Training and exercises play a crucial role in this strategy and provide a means of attaining, practicing, validating, and improving existing and new capabilities.

ADEM, in coordination with its state partners and local response agencies, administers the State's training and exercise programs. Many of these agencies receive grant funding through federal programs, binding them to specific mandates.

Over the years, the state has made great strides in increasing the safety of its communities, citizens, key infrastructure, and its economy. Past events have shown the need to focus efforts on an all-hazards approach to emergency preparedness and response.

The State's critical infrastructure, its geographic location, national, social, and economic assets continue to make it a vulnerable target.

The ADEM Training and Exercise Programs are a system of trainings and exercises dedicated to a whole community all-hazards approach. The goal of the programs is to strengthen the resiliency and response capabilities of the State of Arkansas. The programs are targeted to the first responders, emergency management personnel, supporting agencies, as well as critical groups who have a role in the preparedness of the community before, during, and after a disaster or emergency.

This IPP identifies trainings and exercises that will help the state build and sustain the identified priority areas, which are linked to core capabilities and aligned with the NRF. Included in this IPP is a schedule for training, exercise, planning, and preparedness activities which illustrate the proposed activities for 2026-2028. Only when planning, training, and exercise work together is the state able to build capabilities and ensure a successful disaster response.

PROGRAM PRIORITIES

The National Preparedness Goal (NPG) identifies five mission areas: Prevention, Protection, Mitigation, Response, and Recovery. It also incorporates 32 Core Capabilities, which are needed to address our greatest risks. ADEM uses core capabilities to guide preparedness activities. They are a fundamental part of ADEM's Integrated Preparedness Cycle of planning, organizing, equipping, training, exercising, and evaluating/improving. ADEM's Integrated Preparedness Cycle provides a continuous process that ensures the regular examination of ever-changing threats, hazards, and risks.

EMPG funding supports and enhances Arkansas preparedness for any emergency through a comprehensive planning, training, and exercise program. Priorities are aligned on an annual basis with Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) priorities and goals.

ADEM, through [A.C.A. § 12-75-101](#), is charged with carrying out a comprehensive, all-hazards emergency management program for the state and for assisting cities, counties and state agencies in planning and implementing their emergency management programs. ADEM ensures the appropriate development, updating and distribution of the Arkansas Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (ARCEMP).

The preparedness initiatives of ARCEMP and ADEM support the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's National Preparedness Goal: *"A secure and resilient nation with the capabilities required across the whole community to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from the threats and hazards that pose the greatest risk."*

The State's programs and plans are guided by and comply with the following:

- Homeland Security Presidential Directive 5 (HSPD-5), Management of Domestic

Incidents;

- Presidential Policy Directive 8 (PPD-8), National Preparedness;
- National Response Framework (NRF);
- Adoption of the National Incident Management System (NIMS) as the declared state standard for incident management;
- Threat and Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (THIRA) and Stakeholder Preparedness Review (SPR), Comprehensive Preparedness Guide 201, Third Edition:

THREAT AND HAZARD IDENTIFICATION AND RISK ASSESSMENT (THIRA) & STAKEHOLDER PREPAREDNESS REVIEW (SPR)

The Threat and Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (THIRA) is a three-step risk assessment process that is completed every three years. It helps communities understand their risks and determine the level of capability they need to address those risks. The outputs from this process lay the foundation for determining a community's capability gaps during the Stakeholder Preparedness Review (SPR).

1. **Identify Threats and Hazards.** Based on a combination of experience, forecasting, subject matter expertise, and other available resources, develop a list of threats and hazards that could affect the community. When deciding what threats or hazards to include in the THIRA, communities consider only those that challenge the community's ability to deliver at least one core capability more than any other incident; the THIRA is not intended to include less-challenging threats and hazards.
2. **Give Threats and Hazards Context.** Describe the threats and hazards identified in Step 1, showing how they may affect the community and create challenges in performing the core capabilities. Identify the impacts a threat or hazard may have on a community.
3. **Establish Capability Targets.** Using the impacts described in Step 2, determine the level of capability that the community plans to achieve over time to manage the threats and hazards it faces. Using standardized language, create capability targets for each of the core capabilities based on this desired level of capability by identifying impacts, objectives, and timeframe metrics. A core capability is comprised of several functional areas in which a community may have a gap. Each required standardized target addresses one or more functional areas.

The Stakeholder Preparedness Review (SPR) is an annual three-step self-assessment of a community's capability levels based on the capability targets identified in the THIRA.

1. **Assess Capabilities.** Based on the language from the capability targets set in THIRA Step 3, identify the community's current capability and how that capability changed over the last year, including capabilities lost, sustained, and built. Then, provide additional context to explain the reported data and its sources.
2. **Identify Capability Gaps and Intended Approaches to Address Them.** Determine the causes of the capability gap between the capability target and the current capability identified

in SPR Step 1. Then, describe the actions and investments needed to close the capability gap or sustain the capability.

3. **Describe the Impacts of Funding Sources.** Identify how relevant funding sources, including but not limited to grant programs and the community's own resources, helped to build or sustain the capabilities assessed by the capability targets and describe how those capabilities were used in a real-world incident(s) over the past year.

Stakeholders reviewed the following to help in identifying areas to focus future trainings and exercise:

- After Action Reports (AAR) and Improvement Plans (IP) from previous exercises, as well as their responses to real world events
- Risk assessments
- Current grant and exercise requirements
- New or revised plans and procedures
- Previously identified core capabilities listed in plans that need to be further trained, exercised and/or updated

ADEM 2026 – 2028 STRATEGIC PLAN GOALS AND PREPAREDNESS PRIORITIES

1. Coordinate with the State Emergency Response Commission (SERC) to increase the number of active Local Emergency Planning Commission (LEPCs) to 100 percent complete.
2. Coordinate with the State Emergency Response Commission (SERC) to expand the outreach and coordination with LEPCs regarding Emergency Release Notifications, Hazardous Chemical Inventory Reporting and Toxic Release Inventory.
3. Maintain the State mitigation plan, assist locals with mitigation planning activities, and oversee the development and completion of mitigation projects throughout Arkansas.
4. Provide planning, training, and exercises to Emergency Management stakeholders to enhance multi-jurisdictional capabilities, resource gap analysis, resiliency, situational awareness and operational coordination of all-hazards events.
5. Continuing our partnership with the Central United State Earthquake Consortium (CUSEC) promoting public awareness, education, resiliency, and planning as it relates to the New Madrid Seismic Zone (NMSZ) and increase Arkansas' participation in the Great Shakeout Earthquake Drills.
6. Complete the Emergency Management Accreditation Program (EMAP) process for an additional five years of accreditation.

7. Review and update the Arkansas Earthquake Catastrophic Operations Plan by identifying resource shortfalls and gaps, drafting pre-scripted resource requests for federal and EMAC resources, and work with FEMA Region 6 states and other states to identify potential resource providers.
8. Conduct exercise and evaluation activities, which test emergency communications capabilities, resiliency and continuity of communications (Cybersecurity, Backup communication testing, Virtual JIC).
9. Provide training to enhance Logistics and Supply Chain Management, such as Point of Distribution (POD) training and donations management.
10. Write or coordinate with other agency staff to document agency grant processes with a goal of compiling a complete agency grants management manual by September 30, 2028.

11. Create procurement documentation and tracking procedures for the State Emergency Operations Center Plan. **(Completed)**
12. Enhance logistic support by establishing and maintaining a supply of immediate needed items, to include, but not limited to tarps, water, cots, sand bagging machine, sandbags, etc.

PLANNING 2026 – 2028

The goal of disaster preparedness is to lessen the impact of disasters on vulnerable populations, to ready an organization for an influx of activity, and to design a coordinated plan that reduces the waste of resources, time, and efforts. Emergency management involves planning for what to do before, during, and after a disaster or emergency occurs. These events are often unexpected by nature, leaving little time, if any, to prepare. When disaster strikes, the situation has the potential to create chaos and confusion. Effective disaster preparedness helps alleviate some of the chaos associated with the unexpected crisis. It is critical to have a written plan in place, and for all staff to understand their role within the plan. Disaster plans should be revisited regularly to ensure complete understanding within the organization. The correct use of disaster plans provides a roadmap to follow when serving populations affected by disaster. It is only through understanding of the risks and hazards, and the response to them, that we can better prepare for disasters.

EXERCISE PLAN 2026 - 2028

Exercises play a vital role in Arkansas' preparedness activities. They provide a low-risk environment to familiarize personnel with roles and responsibilities; foster meaningful

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interaction and communication across jurisdictions/organizations; assess and validate plans, policies, procedures, and capabilities; and identify strengths and areas for improvement. Exercises bring together and strengthen the whole community to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from all hazards. Overall, exercises help the whole community address the priorities established by a jurisdictions and/or organizations leader; and evaluate progress towards meeting preparedness goals. The State of Arkansas has adopted the Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP) as a foundation for exercises in the State. This provides a consistent approach to exercises and allows for measuring progress toward building, sustaining, and delivering capabilities.
