

## Renewing Hazmat

You need to purchase a CDL-1 packet from the Arkansas Department of Finance and Administration (DFA) Revenue Office. The cost is \$10. You will need your Arkansas driver's license and a birth certificate or a U.S. Passport. If your last name is different on the driver's license, you will need a marriage license or a divorce decree to buy the CDL-1 packet.

If you are taking Hazmat for the first time, you will need to take Hazmat Theory from an approved Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) Entry Level Driver Training (ELDT) site: <https://tpr.fmcsa.dot.gov/>

If you have had an H endorsement on a CDL, you may be exempt from ELDT requirements.

Once you have passed Hazmat Theory, you will be able to take your Hazmat Knowledge (written) Test at the nearest Arkansas State Police testing center. You will need your Arkansas driver's license and a birth certificate or a U.S. Passport. If your last name is different on the driver's license, you will need a marriage license or a divorce decree to take the Hazmat written test. You will need to return to the Arkansas DFA Revenue Office to have Hazmat added to your CDL.

A background check and fingerprinting are required to complete your Hazmat Renewal. Call one of the following for an appointment:

- Transportation Security Administration (TSA) – **(855) 347-8371**
- Arkansas LiveScan – **(888) 292 4211**

The written Hazmat test can be taken before or after the background check and fingerprinting are done. For first time Hazmat applicants, the ELDT Hazmat Theory course must be passed before the written Hazmat test can be administered.
