Operations:

Karen Burgess:

- Configured 108 workstations; 35 were messenger workstations and 73 were Mobile Data Terminals
- 2158 Messenger access points and 8642 mobile access points. Totaling 10,800 access points
- 1 ATLAS ID removal and 9 Messenger workstations removals
- Retired 19 ORIs; 7 ORIs assigned
- Processed 2,229 hot files and 450 owner/lien holder requests in the last 3 months
- Completed 43 system audits, 53 CJIS IT audits, and 11 re-audits in the last 3 months
- 201 offline searches
- 476 Arkansas Missing Persons on the Never Forgotten, Arkansas Takes Action website
- 295 tokens were issued in the last 3 months but 337 tokens are on hold because of low inventory and supply issues
- Active Arkansas entries in the system as of August 28, 2024:
 - 12,769 stolen vehicles
 - 7,746 stolen license plates
 - 4,339 stolen articles
 - 343 stolen boats
 - 476 missing persons

- 54 stolen securities (stolen money)
- 60,480 stolen guns
- 169,819 wanted persons
- 1,305 violent persons
- 24,590 protection orders
- 122,281,934 transactions processed

Jennifer Locke:

- Statistics for June, July and August 2024
- Certified 2,061 users during the quarter with CJIS Online Security Training with a 98.7% pass rate.
- Certified 12,252 vendors across the nation with a 99.1% pass rate.
- Basic online training:
 - Module 1 Basic Testing 658 users tested, 86.9% pass rate
 - Module 2 Basic Testing 845 users tested, 66.6%
 - Module 3 Basic Testing 840 users tested, 67.6%
 - Module 4 Basic Testing 1025 users tested, 54.6%
- 1013 users took the Basic Refresher, with an 87.9% pass rate.
- Advanced training (New Testing Methods):
 - Day 1- 115 users tested with a 100% pass rate
 - Day 2- 116 users tested with a 99.1% pass rate
 - Day 3- 115 users tested with a 99.1% pass rate
- 262 advanced users were recertified, with a 91.6% pass rate.
- Training Emails:
 - June – 1063
 - July – 783
 - August – 874
 - **Totalling** 2,720 emails for this quarter
- VINE had 126,562 new registrations.
- Delivered 431,892 VINE Notifications
 - 57,257 by phone
 - 231,894 by text
 - 143,635 by email
- JusticeXchange had 139,500 law enforcement searches.
- Investigators placed 23,623 watches; this yielded 4,396 hits on those watches.
- 9,768 DL photos viewed
- AlertXpress utilized 14 times during this quarter
- 37,129 actual logins to JX
- Pseudoephedrine purchases 34,512
- NPLeX blocked 1,642 attempts to buy pseudoephedrine (5,260 grams).
- Placed 98 watches with 0 hits
- Metal Theft Tracking Program reported 108,074 tickets of 246,609 items scrapped.
- 6,264 of those tickets yielded a hit on reported stolen items.

- Current NIBRS program status: there are 388 agencies cleared to request & report.

- 13 agencies' vendors are testing to certify the records management system
- 2023 crime statistics are posted on our website
- Processed crime statistics for notable agencies; Arkansas Legislative Council, Arkansas State - Police Special Projects, UAMS Department of Biostatistics, University of Central Arkansas- Department of Criminology

Paula Stitz: Sex Offender Registry

- Hiring two new employees
- Roundtable at ACIC Conference for sex offender registry

Lajunda Bean: Criminal History

- June 2024 – August 2024 (Quarterly Workflow)
- Entered 26,405 records, verified 39,420 (25,682 Judgements verified, and 13,738 arrest submissions verified) 25,355 miscellaneous transactions. Totaling 91,180
- 53 governor pardons processed
- 250 mental commitment orders
- 758 orders to seal records
- The Criminal History division collaborated with Shorter College and the Center of Arkansas Legal Services to conduct a free sealing clinic, assisting 54 individuals

- NLETS Revenue Increase Proposal
 - Projected implementation beginning in 2027
 - January 1, 2026: increase transaction fee from \$0.35 to \$0.28
 - January 1, 2027: increase transaction fee to \$0.40
 - January 1, 2028: increase transaction fee to \$0.42

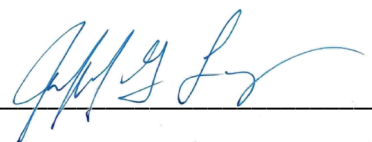
